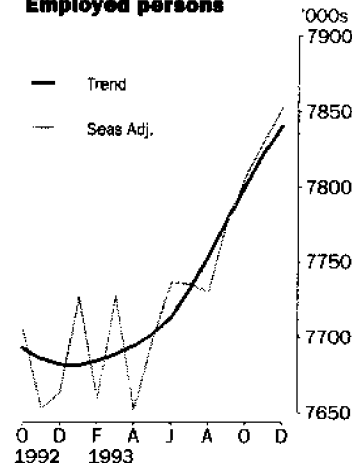

THIS MONTH'S KEY POINTS**TREND ESTIMATES****EMPLOYMENT**

- has been increasing for both males and females since February 1993
- full-time employment (5,982,500) is at the highest level since May 1991

UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

- was 10.9% in December 1993 after standing at 11.0% in the previous four months

PARTICIPATION RATE

- stands at 63.1%, and has been increasing generally since June 1993
- unchanged at 73.9% for males; increased to 52.6% for females

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES**EMPLOYMENT**

- increased by 23,200 to 7,852,600. Male full-time employment was steady at 4,066,400; for females, full-time employment increased by 20,000 to 1,934,100

UNEMPLOYMENT

- fell by 41,000 to 937,400 with falls of 12,700 and 28,300 respectively in male and female unemployment

UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

- fell by 0.4 percentage points to 10.7%
- male rate fell by 0.2 percentage points to 11.0%; female rate fell by 0.7 percentage points to 10.2%
- NSW 10.6% (10.8% last month); Vic 11.8% (12.3%); Qld 10.0% (11.1%); SA 10.9% (11.4%); WA 9.3% (9.3%); and Tas 11.5% (12.8%)

PARTICIPATION RATE

- fell by 0.2 percentage point

ROUNDING

Estimates of monthly change shown on page 1 have been calculated using unrounded estimates, and may be different from, but are more accurate than, movements obtained from the rounded estimates. The graphs on page 1 also depict movements calculated from unrounded estimates.

SAMPLING ERRORS

The estimates in this publication are based on a sample survey. Because the entire population is not enumerated, the published estimates and the movements derived from them are subject to sampling variability. Standard errors give a measure of this variability and appear on pages 30 and 31.

The 95% confidence intervals below provide another way of looking at the variability inherent in estimates from sample surveys. The interval bounded by the two limits is the 95% confidence interval. A 95% confidence interval indicates that we are 95% confident that the upper and lower limits enclose the true value of the estimate.

WHAT IF...? REVISIONS TO TREND ESTIMATES

EFFECT OF NEW SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES ON TREND ESTIMATES

Each time new seasonally adjusted estimates become available, trend estimates are revised (see paragraphs 12 and 13 of Explanatory Notes).

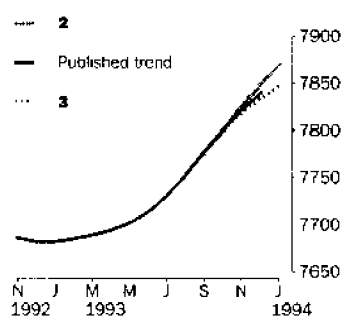
TREND REVISIONS

The examples in the tables below show four illustrative scenarios and the consequent revisions to previous trend estimates of employment and unemployment rate.

- 1** The January seasonally adjusted estimate is the same as the December estimate.
- 2** The January seasonally adjusted estimate is higher than the December estimate by:
 - * +0.33% for employment
 - * +2.3% for the unemployment rate
- 3** The January seasonally adjusted estimate is lower than the December estimate by:
 - * -0.33% for employment
 - * -2.3% for the unemployment rate
- 4** The January seasonally adjusted estimate results in a revised December trend estimate which is identical to the new January trend estimate.

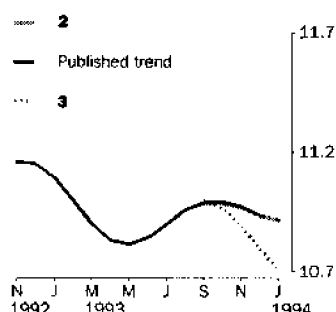
The percentage changes of 0.33% and 2.3% were chosen because they represent the average monthly percentage changes in employment and the unemployment rate respectively.

UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (%)

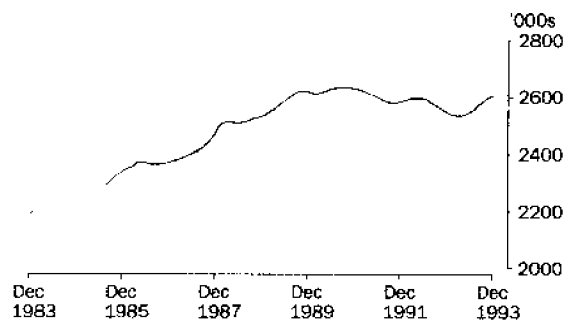

EMPLOYED PERSONS BY STATE: Trend estimates

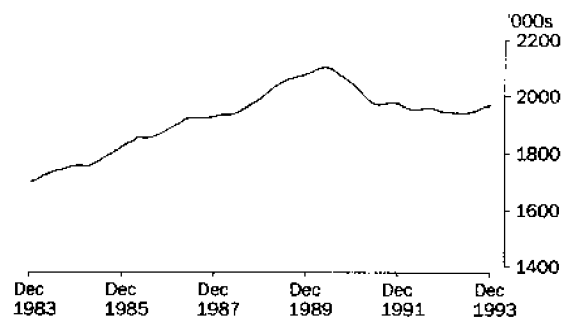
NEW SOUTH WALES

The trend estimate of employment for New South Wales has been increasing since April 1993, after falling between June 1992 and March 1993. In December 1993, the trend stood at 2,605,600, compared with the previous peak level of 2,631,500 in October 1990.



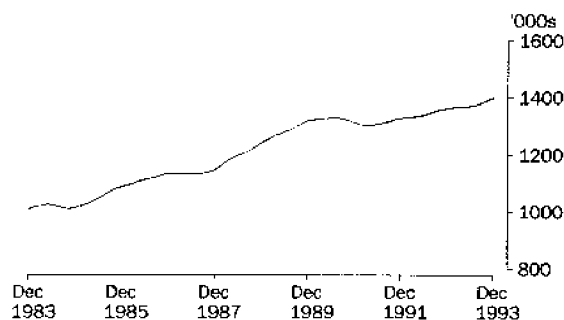
VICTORIA

The trend estimate of employed persons has risen in each of the last seven months and now stands at 1,967,900. Previously, Victorian employment experienced a sharp fall from the peak of 2,102,800 in May 1990 to 1,970,300 in July 1991 followed by a very gradual decline to 1,941,800 in May 1993.



QUEENSLAND

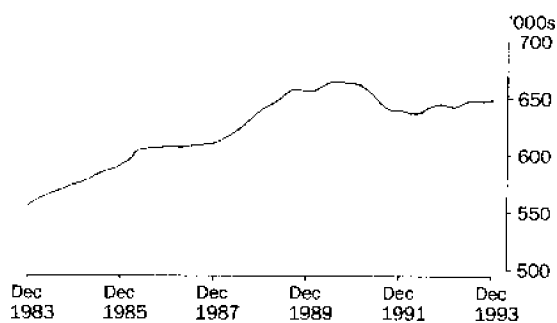
The trend estimate of employed persons for Queensland in December 1993 was 1,396,500. Apart from falls in late 1984, early 1987 and between August 1990 and April 1991, the trend has been rising over the last ten years.



EMPLOYED PERSONS BY STATE: Trend estimates

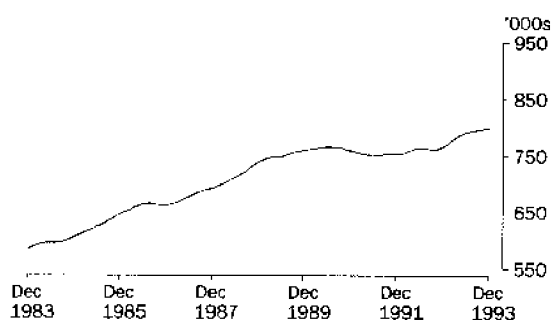
SOUTH AUSTRALIA

The trend estimate of employment for South Australia rose slightly to 648,600 in December 1993 after remaining relatively unchanged in the previous six months. The December estimate was 2.3 per cent lower than the August 1990 peak.



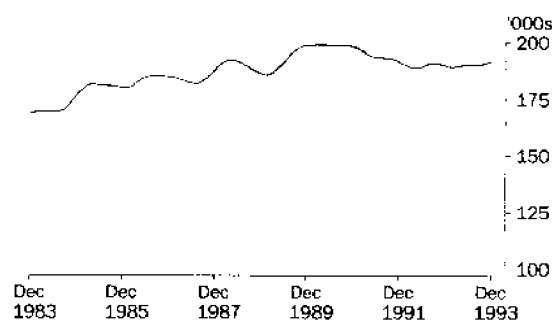
WESTERN AUSTRALIA

For Western Australia, the trend in employment has been increasing since November 1992. Throughout 1993, the trend was at a higher level than the previous peak in July 1990 and in December 1993 stood at 797,800.



TASMANIA

The trend estimate of employment for Tasmania rose slightly for the third successive month and stood at 191,800 in December 1993. The underlying trend was relatively flat during 1992 and 1993, after falling throughout 1991.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

INTRODUCTION

1 This publication contains preliminary estimates of the civilian labour force derived from the labour force survey component of the monthly population survey. Estimates for the current month are preliminary and subject to revision. Revised estimates for the current month and more detailed estimates will be published in *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0).

MONTHLY POPULATION SURVEY

2 The population survey is based on a multi-stage area sample of private dwellings (currently about 29,000 houses, flats, etc.) and a list sample of non-private dwellings (hotels, motels, etc.), and covers about 0.5% of the population of Australia. The information is obtained from the occupants of selected dwellings by specially trained interviewers. The interviews are generally conducted during the two weeks beginning on the Monday between the 6th and 12th of each month. The information obtained relates to the week before the interview (i.e. the reference week).

SCOPE OF SURVEY

3 The Labour Force Survey includes all persons aged 15 and over except members of the permanent defence forces, certain diplomatic personnel of overseas governments customarily excluded from census and estimated populations, overseas residents in Australia, and members of non-Australian defence forces (and their dependants) stationed in Australia.

COVERAGE

4 In the Labour Force Survey, coverage rules are applied which aim to ensure that each person is associated with only one dwelling, and hence has only one chance of selection. The coverage rules are necessarily a balance between theoretical and operational considerations. Nevertheless, the chance of a person being enumerated at two separate dwellings in the survey is considered to be negligible.

POPULATION BENCHMARKS

5 Labour Force Survey estimates are calculated in such a way as to add up to independent estimates of the civilian population aged 15 and over (population benchmarks). New benchmarks based on the results of the 1986 Census of Population and Housing were introduced in the February 1989 issue of this publication. Labour force estimates were revised for the period January 1984 to January 1989. All estimates produced after January 1989 are based on the new benchmarks.

REVISION OF SERIES

6 From April 1986, the definition of employed persons was changed to include persons who worked without pay between 1 and 14 hours per week in a family business or on a farm (i.e. unpaid family helpers). For further information, see paragraphs 36 and 37 of the Explanatory Notes to the February 1987 issue of *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0).

SURVEY SAMPLE REDESIGN

7 The Labour Force Survey sample has been redesigned and reselected using information collected in the 1991 Census of Population and Housing. The new sample was phased in over the period September to December 1992. For details, see *Information Paper: Labour Force Survey Sample Design* (6269.0).

8 For the most part, one quarter of the new sample was introduced each month so that, by December 1992, the entire new sample was in place. Replacement generally occurred at the rotation group level with two groups being substituted each month. Such a pattern of implementation meant that any changes to labour force estimates due to differences between the two samples, or any other influences, were spread over the four months rather than being concentrated in one inter-month period.

9 This phase-in scheme applied to the private dwelling sample in urban areas. The new sample for non-private dwellings and private dwellings in rural areas was introduced in a single stage in November 1992.

10 Two types of error are possible in an estimate based on a sample survey: sampling error and non-sampling error.

Sampling error occurs because a sample, rather than the entire population, is surveyed. One measure of the likely difference resulting from not including all dwellings in the survey is given by the standard error. There are about two chances in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one standard error from the figure that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included in the survey, and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two standard errors. Standard errors of estimates for the latest month and of estimates of movements since the previous month are shown on pages 30 and 31. Standard errors of other estimates and other movements may be determined by using information in the Technical Note in *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0).

Non sampling error arises from inaccuracies in collecting, recording and processing the data. Every effort is made to minimise reporting error by the careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers, and efficient data processing procedures.

11 Seasonally adjusted series are published in Tables 2, 5 and 12 to 17. Seasonal adjustment is a means of removing the estimated effects of normal seasonal variation from the series so that the effects of other influences on the series can be more clearly recognised. Seasonal adjustment does not aim to remove the irregular or non-seasonal influences which may be present in any particular month. This means that month-to-month movements of the seasonally adjusted estimates may not be reliable indicators of trend behaviour. For example, irregular factors unrelated to the trend account for more than half the seasonally adjusted movement with the following frequency:

- Employment: 5 in 10 monthly movements
- Unemployment: 7 in 10 monthly movements
- Unemployment rate: 7 in 10 monthly movements
- Participation rate: 9 in 10 monthly movements

12 Smoothing seasonally adjusted series produces a measure of trend by reducing the impact of the irregular component of the series. The trend estimates have been derived by applying a 13-term Henderson-weighted moving average to the series. Trend series are used to analyse the underlying behaviour of the series over time. These are published in Tables 3, 6 and 12 to 19.

13 While this smoothing technique enables estimates to be produced for the latest month, it does result in revisions to the most recent months as additional observations become available. Generally, subsequent revisions become smaller, and after three months have a negligible impact on the series. There will also be revisions as a result of the annual review of seasonal factors.

14 Trend estimates are published for the Northern Territory in Table 18 and for the Australian Capital Territory in Table 19. Unadjusted series for the two Territories have shown, historically, a high degree of variability, which can lead to considerable revisions to the seasonally adjusted estimates after each annual seasonal factor re-analysis. Seasonally adjusted estimates are not currently published for the two Territories. The most recent six months trend estimates are subject to revision. For the three most recent months, the revision may be relatively large. Inferences about trends drawn from smoothed seasonally adjusted (trend) estimates for months earlier than the latest three months are unlikely to be affected by month to month revisions. They may be affected by revision resulting from the annual re-analysis of seasonal factors.

SEASONAL ADJUSTMENT AND
TREND ESTIMATION (continued)

19 Estimates have been rounded and discrepancies may occur between sums of the component items and totals.

20 Estimates of movement shown in this publication are obtained by taking the difference of unrounded estimates. The movement estimate is then rounded to one decimal place. Therefore where a discrepancy occurs between the reported movement and the difference of the rounded estimates, the reported movement will be more accurate.

Actively looking for work	Includes writing, telephoning or applying in person to an employer for work; answering a newspaper advertisement for a job; checking factory or Commonwealth Employment Service noticeboards; being registered with the Commonwealth Employment Service; checking or registering with any other employment agency; advertising or tendering for work; and contacting friends or relatives.
Attending school	Persons aged 15 to 19 enrolled full time at secondary or high schools in the reference week.
Attending tertiary educational institution full time	Persons aged 15 to 24 enrolled full time at a TAFE college, university, or other educational institution in the reference week.
Employed	Persons aged 15 and over who, during the reference week: ■ worked for one hour or more for pay, profit, commission or payment in kind in a job or business, or on a farm (comprising employees, employers and self-employed persons); or ■ worked for one hour or more without pay in a family business or on a farm (i.e. unpaid family helpers); or ■ were employees who had a job but were not at work and were: ⌘ on paid leave, on leave without pay for less than four weeks up to the end of the reference week, ⌘ stood down without pay because of bad weather or plant breakdown at their place of employment for less than four weeks up to the end of the reference week, ⌘ on strike or locked out, ⌘ on workers' compensation and expected to be returning to their job, or ⌘ receiving wages or salary while undertaking full-time study; or ■ were employers, self-employed persons or unpaid family helpers who had a job, business or farm, but were not at work.

Labour force status	A classification of the civilian population aged 15 and over into employed, unemployed or not in the labour force, as defined. The definitions conform closely to the international standard definitions adopted by the International Conferences of Labour Statisticians.
Not in the labour force	Persons who were not in the categories employed or unemployed as defined.
Participation rate	For any group, the labour force expressed as a percentage of the civilian population aged 15 and over in the same group.
Part-time workers	Employed persons who usually worked less than 35 hours a week and who did so during the reference week.
Seasonally adjusted series	A time series of estimates with the estimated effects of normal seasonal variation removed. See Explanatory Note 11 for more detail.
Trend series	A smoothed seasonally adjusted series of estimates. See Explanatory Notes 12 to 14 for more detail.

Unemployed	Persons aged 15 and over who were not employed during the reference week, and: ■ had actively looked for full-time or part-time work at any time in the four weeks up to the end of the reference week and: ⌘ were available for work in the reference week, or would have been available except for temporary illness (i.e. lasting for less than four weeks to the end of the reference week), or ⌘ were waiting to start a new job within four weeks from the end of the reference week and would have started in the reference week if the job had been available then; or ■ were waiting to be called back to a full-time or part-time job from which they had been stood down without pay for less than four weeks up to the end of the reference week (including the whole of the reference week) for reasons other than bad weather or plant breakdown.
Unemployed looking for first full-time job	Unemployed persons looking for full-time work (as defined above) who had never worked full time for two weeks or more
Unemployed looking for full-time work	Unemployed persons who actively looked for full-time work, or were to resume a full-time job from which they had been stood down.
Unemployed looking for part-time work	Unemployed persons who had actively looked for part-time work only, or were to resume a part-time job from which they had been stood down.
Unemployment rate	For any group, the number of unemployed persons expressed as a percentage of the labour force in the same group.

STANDARD ERRORS

The estimates in this publication are based on information gained from the occupants of a sample survey of dwellings. Because the entire population is not surveyed, the published estimates are subject to sampling error. The most common way of quantifying such sampling error is to calculate the standard error for the published estimate or statistic.

LEVEL ESTIMATES

To illustrate, let us say the published level estimate for employed persons aged 15 to 19 is 500,000. The calculated standard error in this case is 9,000. The standard error is then used to interpret the level estimate of 500,000. For instance, the standard error of 9,000 indicates that:

- ✱ There are approximately two chances in three that the true value falls within the range 491,000 to 509,000 (500,000 + or - 9,000)
- ✱ There are approximately nineteen chances in twenty that the true value falls within the range 482,000 to 518,000 (500,000 + or - 18,000)

The true value in this case is the result we would obtain if we could enumerate the total population.

MOVEMENT ESTIMATES

The following example illustrates how to use the standard error to interpret a movement estimate. Let us say that one month the published level estimate for females employed part time in Australia is 1,387,000; the next month the published level estimate is 1,400,000. The calculated standard error for the level estimates is 9,800. The standard error is then used to interpret the published movement estimate of 13,000. For instance, the standard error of 9,800 indicates that:

- There are approximately two chances in three that the true movement over the two month period falls within the range 3,200 to 22,800 (13,000 + or - 9,800)
- There are approximately nineteen chances in twenty that the true movement falls within the range -6,400 to 32,600 (13,000 + or - 19,600).
