Western Australia at a Glance 2011




Western Australia had an estimated population of 2,296,411 in June 2010, accounting for 10.3% of Australia's population.

Western Australia has the largest land area (2,532,400 sq km) of any Australian State or Territory. Its coastline of 12,500km amounts to 34% of Australia's total coastline.

The State's capital, Perth, was founded on 12 August 1829 and the Perth metropolitan area contains almost three quarters (73%) of Western Australia's total population.
