### **OVERVIEW**

2011 LABOUR STATISTICS IN BRIEF Labour statistics are of interest from both economic and social perspectives. This pamphlet provides a brief overview of data available from the ABS relating to the Australian labour market.

Comparisons of data over a 20-year period are given for labour force participation, employment and unemployment, underemployment, hours worked, industrial disputes, wages and prices and job vacancies.

Also included are recent data on labour force underutilisation, earnings, education and work, people not in the labour force, methods of setting pay and an international comparison of population and unemployment rates.

The quarterly publication Australian Labour Market Statistics (cat. no. 6105.0) provides a summary of key labour market measures and highlights new developments and releases of ABS labour statistics. 


