What is the Census all about?

On Tuesday 8th August it's Census Night. The purpose of the Census is to collect information that will help us build an understanding of the Australian population. So, it's vital that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are counted.

What do I have to do?

On Census Night, you will need to fill in your Census form. Everyone staying in your house on Census Night needs to be included on the form. That means members of your family, and any visitors who are staying for the night. Even babies, children and elders need to be included.

If you think there may be more than six people staying with you on Census Night, just tell your Census Collector and they'll give you extra forms. Or you can call the Census Inquiry Service on 1300 362 883.

Is my information kept private?

The information you provide in your Census form is kept confidential. That means organisations like Centrelink, Community Services and the Tax Office won't have access to your answers. Your private information will stay private.

What is my information used for?

Census information is used to make decisions about things like education, housing and healthcare. By filling in your Census form, you will be helping to make sure your community's needs are met.

The Census gives us a chance to create a better future for all Australians. So on Tuesday 8th August, be sure to fill in your Census form.
