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PREFACE

The Australian Standard Offence Classification (ASOC) has been developed for use in the compilation and analysis of crime and justice statistics in Australia to improve the comparability of crime and justice statistics between Australian jurisdictions.

The second edition of the ASOC replaces the first edition, released in 1997. The second edition of ASOC reflects the outcomes of a substantial review of the Classification, which included extensive consultation; predominantly with government agencies responsible for policy formation and administration, and non-government analysts of crime and justice issues.

The purpose of the review was to ensure that the Classification remains current and relevant, reflecting changes that have occurred in criminal legislation since the previous version, as well as satisfying emerging user requirements for offence data.

We gratefully acknowledge the assistance provided by many individuals and organisations within Australia in the review of the ASOC.

INTRODUCTION

INTRODUCTION

OVERVIEW

The second edition of the Australian Standard Offence Classification (ASOC) has been developed for use within Australia for the production and analysis of crime and justice statistics. It supercedes the first edition of ASOC, which was released in 1997.

The objective of the ASOC is to provide a uniform national statistical framework for classifying criminal behaviour in the production and analysis of crime and justice statistics. The ASOC is used in Australian Bureau of Statistics statistical collections, and Australian police, criminal courts and corrective services agencies.

There are two main purposes of the Classification:

- to provide a standardised statistical framework for organising key behavioural characteristics of criminal offences; and
- to overcome differences in legal offence definitions across states and territories.

HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT

The ASOC was created to provide a framework capable of being applied at various levels for classifying offences for statistical purposes. In addition to the ABS, the main users of the Classification are Australian police, criminal courts and corrective services agencies.

In reviewing the ASOC, external consultations were undertaken with a range of users in the crime and justice field to identify aspects of the ASOC requiring attention. The ABS sought information on all aspects of the classification including information on developments in legislation, new and emerging areas of crime, useful groupings of offences and general comment and opinion about the structure of the Classification. The aim of the review is to improve the Classification in the following ways:

- improved coverage to cater for offences of emerging importance;
- increased relevance and useability; and
- maintenance of comparability and continuity between ASOC 1997 and the second edition.

ASOC STRUCTURE

The ASOC is a classification with three levels: Divisions (the broadest level), Subdivisions (the intermediate level) and Groups (the finest level). At the divisional level, the main purpose is to provide a limited number of categories that provide a broad overall picture of offence types, that are suitable for the publication of summary tables in official statistics. The subdivision and group levels provide increasingly detailed dissections of these categories for the compilation of more specific and detailed statistics.

The structure of the ASOC is illustrated below.

CONCEPTUAL BASIS OF THE CLASSIFICATION

SCOPE OF THE CLASSIFICATION

The primary purpose of the ASOC is to provide a systematic ordering of criminal offences defined in the criminal laws of the Australian state and territory jurisdictions. For the purposes of ASOC, an offence is defined as: any criminal act or omission by a person, persons, organisation or organisations for which a penalty could be imposed by the Australian legal system.

The definitions of categories have been specifically chosen to minimise any confusion as to the boundaries of each category. As a result the content of each category is uniform across jurisdictions, despite differences in legislation.

CLASSIFICATION CRITERIA

At the broadest level, the Classification makes distinctions based on the most fundamental elements of legal and behavioural criteria. These include:

- whether the offence involved the use of violence;
- whether the offence compromised the safety or well-being of persons or was solely directed at the acquisition or damage of property;
- whether the offence involved an intentional act or resulted from recklessness or negligence; and
- whether the offence had a specific victim, or constituted a breach of public order or other social codes.

Six criteria were used in the development of the Classification. These are listed below:

Violence: Whether violence is involved. If violence is involved the nature and level of the violence is considered including whether a weapon was used, whether abduction or deprivation of liberty was involved, whether the violence was sexual in nature and the outcome of the violence (e.g. whether life was taken, threatened or endangered).

Acquisition: Whether the intent of the offence is acquisitive (e.g. to obtain property). If so, the method of acquisition including theft, the use of extortion or blackmail or the use of deception, is considered.

Nature of Victim: The nature and vulnerability of the victim or object offended against. Types of victims include persons, property and the community.

Ancillary Offences: Whether the offence only exists as an extension of, or in relation to, another offence. Such offences include attempts, threats and conspiracies to commit another offence, or offences involving the intent that another offence shall take place.

Seriousness: Seriousness can be reflected through the involvement or otherwise of a personal victim, or it can be measured as a function of factors of aggravation, such as whether the victim was vulnerable; whether the offence was committed in company; or whether a weapon was used. It is important to note however that the divisions of the Classification are not ranked by seriousness. The National Offence Index (NOI) is a separate statistical tool that enables selected ASOC groups to be ranked in order of seriousness.

Intent: Whether the offence occurs as a result of a negligent or reckless act, or as a result of an intent to commit an offence. This criterion distinguishes, for example, manslaughter from murder.

DESIGN CONSIDERATIONS

Certain design considerations were deemed to be of particular importance in determining the structure of the Classification. They included that:

- The categories encompass, as far as possible, the various legal definitions and criminal codes in use across Australian jurisdictions.
- The offences categorised in the Classification be representative of information available and typically reported on when collecting data.
- The Classification allow the provision of information to address important areas of social concern.
- The Classification exhibit statistical balance. That is, offences should be distributed relatively evenly within divisions across the Classification.

APPLICATION OF THE CRITERIA

In applying the Classification criteria the following approach has been adopted. At the broad level, each division has been made relatively homogenous in terms of the violence and acquisition criteria described above. This means that in general, a division does not include both offences where violence is involved, and offences where violence is not involved. There are exceptions to this general rule, notably Division 13, which includes riot and affray together with non-violent offences such as censorship crimes; and Division 06, which includes armed robbery together with demands made via a letter. This latter offence could be considered non-violent in nature. In both of these situations it was considered that the overall intent of the divisions overrode strict application of the criteria.

Similarly, divisions generally avoid mixing offences where the intent is acquisitive, with offences where the primary intent is not acquisitive. The exception to this rule is Division 06, in which blackmail/extortion is grouped together with robbery. The former offence may be intended to cause the victim loss of something other than property, or alternatively, to act in ways not necessarily resulting in an acquisitive gain on the part of the offender. Again, it was considered that the overall intent of the divisions overrode strict application of the criteria.

Attempts, threats, intentions, and conspiracies are generally classified in the same subdivision as the actual offence. For example, conspiracy to steal is classified alongside actual stealing offences in Division 08.

Divisions 01 to 06 of the Classification involve offences committed against a person. That is:

- They all relate to culpable (i.e. intentional, negligent or reckless) acts that result in harm (i.e. physical injury/violation, or non-physical harm). These acts are not necessarily completed; they include attempts and conspiracies.
- These acts must affect a specific person as opposed to the general public. That is, the victim(s) can only ever be a distinct person or persons. Thus, the acts cannot be committed against organisations, the state or the community.

The primary basis for distinguishing between Divisions 01 to 06 is the nature and degree of harm. The secondary basis of classification is whether the act was intentional or negligent.

For some offences in Divisions 03 and 04, the vulnerability of the victim is also a factor, but only in cases of non-assaultive sexual offences against children and neglect of persons under care.

INTRODUCTION *continued*

APPLICATION OF THE CRITERIA *continued*

Divisions 06 to 09 inclusive and Division 12 include offences that generally relate to property and which, with the exception of Division 06, do not involve any offence against the person. Divisions 06 to 09 in particular have a secondary common feature in that they involve the obtaining of a benefit. These divisions are distinguished from one another by whether or not violence was involved, and by the method of acquisition. Thus, robbery is distinguished from theft, and theft distinguished from deception offences. Division 12, which contains property damage as opposed to its acquisition, also includes environmental pollution.

Divisions 10 and 11, and 13 to 16 inclusive, are offences against organisations, government (local, state or federal) and the community in general, rather than against particular individual persons.

The structure of some divisions, such as Divisions 10, 11 and 14, has been specified in a manner intended to reflect user requirements relating to policy and/or research issues concerning offences involving drugs, firearms and vehicles.

SUPPLEMENTARY CODES

When using the ASOC to code data, there may be instances in which there is insufficient information to code to a four-digit group level. In such situations a Supplementary code may be applied. Supplementary codes may be generated by taking a three-digit subdivision code and adding a single zero to create a four-digit code.

In any instances where a subdivision cannot be selected, the most suitable division is selected and two zeros are appended to its code to make a four-digit code.

Supplementary codes are structured as follows:

There are two further Supplementary codes that may be used if the situation explicitly warrants it. If the data provided cannot be assigned to any ASOC division, and no further detail may be obtained from the source, then the four-digit code of 9999 can be used. If no data are provided at all, and again there is no provision for contacting the data provider, then the four-digit code of 9998 can be used.

A full listing of these Supplementary codes and their titles are provided on page 19 of this publication.

CONTEXTUAL OFFENCES

While the ASOC organises offences by behavioural attributes, often users of crime statistics have requirements for grouping data by other attributes. For example, by the relationship of the victim and perpetrator or location of offence (with family and domestic violence offences), or the mode of the offence (with electronic crime offences). This requires offence groupings by a specific contextual relationship. It is recognised that there is a strong user need for the inclusion of contextual offences, such as Terrorism, Family and domestic violence and E-crime, in ASOC. This is beyond the current capabilities of the ASOC publication. Each of these concepts is discussed in greater detail below.

INTRODUCTION *continued*

TERRORISM

Terrorism, rather than representing one offence or behaviour, is a constellation of criminal behaviours. The vast majority of these, whilst they can be termed terrorist acts under certain circumstances, can also exist as non-terrorism related offences (such as assault, homicide, property offences, or weapons offences). 'Sedition' and 'Acts that are harmful to or threaten national security' are included in the ASOC under Group 1559, Offences against government security, nec, and new terrorism offences ('Be a member/provide support to a terrorist organisation'; 'Incite terrorism'; and 'Conspire, prepare or plan a terrorist act') have been added to the list of inclusions within this group.

FAMILY AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Family and domestic violence is an important criminal incident type that is a government policy priority in most, if not all, jurisdictions and is an issue that needs to be represented statistically. However, family and domestic violence is a complicated construct to represent statistically using the ASOC, as a wide range of offending behaviours may be related to family or domestic violence, such as property damage, cruelty to animals, assault and/or sexual assault.

E-CRIME

Electronic crime rarely represents a specific offence, and often includes a wide range of non-technology linked offences, which can also be committed using electronic means. The behaviour is not necessarily different - this is generally a distinction made based on mode. Where a computer can be used to commit an offence, but has historically been committed without a computer, these offences are coded based on the behaviour of that offence. For example, although child pornography offences can be facilitated by the use of a computer and the internet, the behaviour associated with the offence remains unchanged based on the mode of production, and the offences should be coded accordingly.

SUPPORTING PRODUCTS

NATIONAL OFFENCE INDEX

The National Offence Index (NOI) assists in the output of nationally comparable offence information with the purpose of enabling the representation of a defendant/person in custody by a single offence. For example, where a defendant in a criminal court has two or more offences against them which fall into different output offence categories, the NOI ensures that the most serious offence is chosen to represent that defendant.

The current NOI is based on the Offence Seriousness Index developed by the Crime Research Centre (CRC) in Western Australia. The CRC Index was developed based on research conducted into public perceptions of offence seriousness, and also considered legislated sentences of offences. It uses the ASOC 4-digit group codes to rank offences. While the NOI provides a hierarchical ranking of offences based on seriousness, the ASOC provides a categorisation of divisions for the purposes of statistical output. As a result, the NOI and the ASOC are complementary tools with different functions.

An updated edition of the NOI, which will incorporate the changes of the revised ASOC will be released in due course.

CONCORDANCES

The ASOC concordances show the relationship between the respective categories of the first and second editions of the Classification. These concordances are provided in Appendices 4 and 5 of this classification.

KEYWORD INDEX OF CRIMINAL OFFENCES OR ACTIVITIES

The index of offences included in this publication covers only those offences, or common interpretations of those offences, that are specifically mentioned within the text of the Classification. This index is suitable for finding the group to which an offence would be classified, providing there exists some general understanding of the nature of the offence (as opposed to the specific criminal offence title).

- the degree of involvement in the physical act of killing another person.

This subdivision is not further disaggregated.

The attempted unlawful killing of another person, where there is either the intent to kill or to cause grievous bodily harm with the knowledge that it was probable that death or grievous bodily harm would occur (reckless indifference to life), not resulting in death.

This subdivision is not further disaggregated.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

0121 Attempted murder

0121 Attempted murder

The attempted unlawful killing of another person where there is either the intent to kill or to cause grievous bodily harm with the knowledge that it was probable that death or grievous bodily harm would occur (reckless indifference to life) but where death did not actually occur.

Inclusions:

Conspiracy to murder that does not result in death

Exclusions:

Inflict injury where there was not an intent to kill the other person. These are coded to the relevant groups within Division 02, Acts intended to cause injury.

Conspiracy to murder that results in death. These are coded to Group 0111, Murder.

SUBDIVISION 013 MANSLAUGHTER AND DRIVING CAUSING DEATH

The unlawful killing of another person while deprived of the power of self-control by provocation, or under circumstances amounting to diminished responsibility or without intent to kill, as a result of a careless, reckless, negligent, unlawful or dangerous act.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of whether the offence involved manslaughter or driving causing death.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 0131 Manslaughter
- 0132 Driving causing death

0131 Manslaughter

The unlawful killing of another person while deprived of the power of self-control by provocation, or under circumstances amounting to diminished responsibility or without intent to kill, as a result of a careless, reckless, negligent, unlawful or dangerous act (other than the act of driving).

Inclusions:

- Kill an unborn child/infanticide
- Kill by the use of excessive force in self-defence
- Survive suicide pact
- Assist in suicide of another person
- Industrial/corporate manslaughter

Exclusions:

- Breach of Euthanasia Legislation not amounting to murder, attempted murder or assault. These are coded to Group 1329, Regulated Public Order Offences, nec.
- Procure or commit illegal abortion. These are coded to Group 1695, Procure or commit illegal abortion.
- Unlawfully kill a person under care. These are coded to Group 0111, Murder.

0132 Driving causing death

The unlawful killing of another person without intent to kill, as a result of culpable, reckless, or negligent driving.

Inclusions:

- Death caused by a driver under the influence of alcohol/drugs

DIVISION 02

DIVISION 02 - ACTS INTENDED TO CAUSE INJURY

Acts, excluding attempted murder and those resulting in death (Division 01), which are intended to cause non-fatal injury or harm to another person and where there is no sexual or acquisitive element.

This division is further disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of whether or not an act constitutes a direct assault upon a person or persons.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivisions:

021 Assault

029 Other acts intended to cause injury

Inclusions:

Offences that involve reckless behaviour that amounts to intentionality or malice.

Inflict injury where there is no intent to kill the other person.

Exclusions:

Sexual assault and related offences are excluded from this division as they are sufficiently distinct to form a separate division, Division 03, Sexual assault and related offences.

Dangerous or negligent acts causing or potentially causing harm are excluded from this division on the basis that there is not an intention to cause harm. These acts are sufficiently distinct to form a separate division, Division 04, Dangerous or negligent acts endangering persons. Should it not be possible to determine whether there was intent or not, the default is to code to Division 04.

DIVISION 02 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 021 ASSAULT

The direct (and immediate/confrontational) infliction of force, injury or violence upon a person or persons or the direct (and immediate/confrontational) threat of force, injury or violence where there is an apprehension that the threat could be enacted.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of whether or not the assault involved injury, or other circumstances.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

0211 Serious assault resulting in injury

0212 Serious assault not resulting in injury

0213 Common assault

Inclusions:

This subdivision specifically includes face-to-face threatening behaviour if it is believed that the threat could be enacted

Administer drugs with intent to assault

Exclusions:

Ill-treatment of children/child neglect. These are coded to Group 0491, Neglect or ill treatment of persons under care.

Hinder/obstruct police officers or justice officials. These are coded to Group 1562, Resist or hinder police officer or justice official.

Hinder/obstruct government officers involved in maintaining government security. These are coded to Group 1551, Resist or hinder government officer concerned with government security.

Threats to murder or injure that are not face-to-face where there is no belief that the threat could be enacted (i.e. those not constituting assault). These are coded to Group 0532, Threatening behaviour.

Use of force as part of a robbery unless specifically described as a separate offence of 'assault'. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 061, Robbery.

Assault with intent to commit a sexual act. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 031, Sexual assault.

0211 Serious assault resulting in injury

The direct (and immediate/confrontational) infliction of force, injury or violence upon a person or persons resulting in an injury. For the purposes of this group, injury includes, but is not limited to:

- grievous bodily harm;
- actual bodily harm;
- wounding;
- severe mental behavioural disturbance or disorder; or
- loss of a foetus.

Inclusions:

Deliberate transmission of a grievous bodily disease

Torture

Assault with intent to injure

Exclusions:

Common assault. These are coded to Group 0213, Common assault.

Driving causing grievous bodily harm. These are coded to Group 0412, Dangerous or negligent operation (driving) of a vehicle.

Threat of assault (where there is a belief that the threat could be enacted). These are coded to Group 0212, Serious assault not resulting in injury.

Serious assault where injury is not determined. These are coded to Group 0212, Serious assault not resulting in injury.

Child neglect. These are coded to Group 0491, Neglect or ill treatment of person under care.

DIVISION 02 *continued*

0212 Serious assault not resulting in injury

The direct (and immediate/confrontational) infliction of force or violence upon a person or persons not resulting in an injury.

These incidents include, but are not limited to, any of the following circumstances:

- Committed in company;
- Use of a weapon;
- Committed against a vulnerable victim;
- Committed against a pregnant female;
- Committed against a prison officer, police officer or other justice official;
- Involved more than one victim;
- Part of a planned or organised criminal activity; or
- Any aggravating circumstance specified by state or territory criminal legislation.

Inclusions:

Threats to kill that are face-to-face and where there is an apprehension that the threat could be enacted

Threats to assault that are face-to-face and where there is an apprehension that the threat could be enacted

Serious assault where injury is not determined

Exclusions:

Serious assault resulting in injury. These are coded to Group 0211, Serious assault resulting in injury.

Threats to murder or injure that are not face-to-face where there is no belief that the threat could be enacted (i.e. those not constituting assault). These are coded to Group 0532, Threatening behaviour.

0213 Common assault

An assault not involving any of the circumstances defined in Group 0211 and Group 0212.

Exclusions:

An assault committed against a police officer, justice official, prison officer etc. These are coded to Group 0212, Serious assault not resulting in injury.

DIVISION 02 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 029 OTHER ACTS INTENDED TO CAUSE INJURY

Acts involving the indirect and non-confrontational infliction of harm, injury or violence upon a person.

This subdivision is further disaggregated based on whether the offence involved stalking, or other acts intended to cause injury.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

0291 Stalking

0299 Other acts intended to cause injury, nec

Exclusions:

Acts which, though not intended to cause harm, actually or potentially result in injury to oneself or another person. These are coded to the relevant groups within Division 04, Dangerous or negligent acts endangering persons.

0291 Stalking

Acts intended to cause physical or mental harm to a person, or to arouse apprehension or fear in a person, through a repeated course of unreasonable conduct.

For the purposes of this group, stalking includes, but is not limited to, activities such as unauthorised surveillance of an individual, interfering with the individual's property (or that of an associate), sending offensive material, and communicating with the person in a way that could be reasonably expected to arouse apprehension or fear.

Exclusions:

Harassment where there is no indication that the behaviour is intended to cause physical or mental harm, or arouse apprehension or fear. These are coded to Group 0531, Harassment and private nuisance.

Nuisance phone calls. These are coded to Group 0531, Harassment and private nuisance.

0299 Other acts intended to cause injury, nec

Other acts intended to cause injury not elsewhere classified in Division 02, Acts intended to cause injury.

Inclusions:

Administer illicit drugs (where further intent is unknown)

Administer poison (where further intent is unknown)

Drink/food spiking (where further intent is unknown)

Set mantraps

Stupefy

Administer a sedative or hypnotic drug (where further intent is unknown)

Exclusions:

Threatening behaviour. These are coded to Group 0532, Threatening behaviour.

Any action that is direct (face-to-face), and it is believed that the threat could be enacted. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 021, Assault.

Administer drugs with intent to assault. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 021, Assault.

Administer drugs with intent to rape. These are coded to Group 0311, Aggravated sexual assault.

Administer drugs with intent to steal. These are coded to Group 0611, Aggravated robbery.

DIVISION 03

DIVISION 03 - SEXUAL ASSAULT AND RELATED OFFENCES

Acts, or intent of acts, of a sexual nature against another person, which are non-consensual or where consent is proscribed.

This division is further disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of whether or not the sexual act involved physical contact with the person.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivisions:

031 Sexual assault

032 Non-assaultive sexual offences

Inclusions:

Deception to procure sex

Assault with the intent to commit a sexual act

Exclusions:

Regulated activities governing public order sexual standards (e.g. prostitution, censorship) as these offences do not involve an unwilling victim and therefore do not amount to an assault. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 132, Regulated public order offences.

Sexual acts that do not require a specific victim (e.g. indecent exposure, lewdness). These are coded to Group 1325, Offences against public order sexual standards.

Sexual acts not committed against a person (e.g. bestiality, necrophilia). These are coded to Group 1325, Offences against public order sexual standards.

Abduction, taking, detention or enticement for sexual purposes (where known). These are coded to the relevant groups within Division 05, Abduction, harassment and other offences against the person.

SUBDIVISION 031 SEXUAL ASSAULT

Physical contact, or intent of contact, of a sexual nature directed toward another person where that person does not give consent, gives consent as a result of intimidation or deception, or consent is proscribed (i.e. the person is legally deemed incapable of giving consent because of youth, temporary/permanent (mental) incapacity or there is a familial relationship).

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of whether or not the sexual assault involved aggravating circumstances. Where the existence of aggravating circumstances cannot be determined then 031 applies.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

0311 Aggravated sexual assault

0312 Non-aggravated sexual assault

Inclusions:

Assault with intent to commit a sexual act

Exclusions:

Sexual assault involving sexual servitude. These are coded to Group 0323, Sexual servitude offences.

Abduction, taking, detention or enticement for sexual purposes (where known). These are coded to the relevant groups within Division 05, Abduction, harassment and other offences against the person.

0311 Aggravated sexual assault

Sexual assault, as defined in Subdivision 031, Sexual assault, that involves any of the following aggravating circumstances:

- sexual intercourse (i.e. oral sex and/or penetration of the vagina or anus by any part of the human body or by any object);
- inflict injury or violence;
- possession/use of a weapon;
- consent proscribed/committed against a child; or
- committed in company (i.e. by two or more persons).

Inclusions:

Incest

Rape

Intent/attempt to commit rape

Administer drugs with intent to rape

Unlawful sexual intercourse

Unlawful fellatio/cunnilingus

Carnal knowledge

Assault with the intent to commit a sexual act

Exclusions:

Abduction, taking, detention or enticement for sexual purposes (where known). These are coded to the relevant groups within Division 05, Abduction, harassment and other offences against the person.

0312 Non-aggravated sexual assault

Sexual assault not involving any of the aggravating circumstances as defined in Group 0311, Aggravated sexual assault.

Inclusions:

Indecent assault that does not involve any aggravating circumstances

Threat of sexual assault

SUBDIVISION 032 NON-ASSAULTIVE SEXUAL OFFENCES

Offences of a sexual nature, or intent thereof, against another person that do not involve physical contact with the person and where the person does not give consent, gives consent as a result of intimidation or deception, or consent is proscribed (i.e. the person is legally deemed incapable of giving consent because of youth, temporary/permanent (mental) incapacity or there is a familial relationship).

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of the age of the victim, and the type of non-assaultive sexual offence.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 0321 Non-assaultive sexual offences against a child
- 0322 Child pornography offences
- 0323 Sexual servitude offences
- 0329 Non-assaultive sexual offences, nec

0321 Non-assaultive sexual offences against a child

Offences of a sexual nature, or intent thereof, against a person under the age of 16 years that involve the presence of that person but not physical contact with that person.

Inclusions:

Procure a child for prostitution/pornography

'Grooming' offences, including those offences where a carriage service is used to groom (e.g. cultivate an inappropriate online relationship with a child or children)

Force a minor to witness an act of sexual intercourse

Exclusions:

Produce (not involving the presence of the child depicted), possess, distribute or display child pornography. These are coded to Group 0322, Child pornography offences.

Offences involving physical contact. These are coded to Group 0311, Aggravated sexual assault.

Sexual servitude offences. These are coded to Group 0323, Sexual servitude offences.

Carnal knowledge. These are coded to Group 0311, Aggravated sexual assault.

0322 Child pornography offences

The production, possession, distribution or display of pornographic or abusive material of a child under the age of consent in written, photographic, film, video, digital or other format.

Exclusions:

The direct assault of a child. These are coded to Group 0211, Serious assault resulting in injury; or Group 0212, Serious assault not resulting in injury.

The direct sexual assault of a child. These are coded to Group 0311, Aggravated sexual assault.

Procure a child for prostitution/pornography. These are coded to Group 0321, Non-assaultive sexual offences against a child.

Produce, possess, distribute or display controlled or other pornographic material (excluding child pornography). These are coded to Group 1323, Censorship offences.

Carnal knowledge. These are coded to Group 0311, Aggravated sexual assault.

0323 Sexual servitude offences

A person who provides sexual services and who, because of the use of force or a threat, is not free to:

- stop providing sexual services;
- decline to provide sexual services; or
- leave the place or area where the person provides sexual services.

Inclusions:

Debt bondage

Operate a sexual servitude business

People trafficking involving sexual servitude

Coercive behaviour such as threat of deportation if a person refuses sexual services

Exclusions:

Prostitution offences. These are coded to Group 1324, Prostitution offences.

Sexual assault not involving sexual servitude. These are coded to Group 0311, Aggravated sexual assault; or Group 0312, Non-aggravated sexual assault.

People trafficking not involving sexual servitude. These are coded to Group 1543, Immigration offences.

Unlawful confinement of a person against that person's will, or against the will of any parent, guardian or other person having lawful custody or care of that person, and not involving the taking away of the person. These are coded to Group 0521, Deprivation of liberty/false imprisonment.

0329 Non-assaultive sexual offences, nec

Sexual offences against the person not elsewhere classified in Subdivision 032, Non-assaultive sexual offences.

Inclusions:

Voyeurism

Peeping-tom

Gross indecency

Wilful exposure

DIVISION 04

DIVISION 04 - DANGEROUS OR NEGLIGENT ACTS ENDANGERING PERSONS

Dangerous or negligent acts which, though not intended to cause harm, actually or potentially result in injury to oneself or another person.

This division is further disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of whether or not the dangerous or negligent act involved the operation of a vehicle.

For the purposes of this division, the definition of vehicle is any means of motorised or non-motorised transport in or on which something is carried, conveyed or travels. This includes but is not limited to: car, motorcycle, motorised caravan/campervan, truck, tractor, bus, train, tram, boat, ship, aircraft, vessel, bicycle, wheelchair, skateboard/skates/rollerblades, ride-on mower, horse.

For the purposes of this division, 'driving' and 'operating' are taken to be interchangeable terms for being considered in control of or in charge of a vehicle.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivisions:

- 041 Dangerous or negligent operation of a vehicle
- 049 Other dangerous or negligent acts endangering persons

Exclusions:

Offences that result in death. These are coded to the relevant groups within Division 01, Homicide and related offences.

Offences where there is intent to injure and where there is no sexual or acquisitive element. These are coded to the relevant groups within Division 02, Acts intended to cause injury.

Offences that involve reckless behaviour amounting to intentionality or malice. These are coded to the relevant groups within Division 02, Acts intended to cause injury.

Riot and affray. These are coded to Group 1313, Riot and affray.

Driving offences not of a serious or negligent nature. These are coded to the relevant groups within Division 14, Traffic and vehicle regulatory offences.

DIVISION 04 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 041 DANGEROUS OR NEGLIGENT OPERATION OF A VEHICLE

The dangerous or negligent operation of a vehicle (as defined at the beginning of this division) which, though not intended to cause harm, actually or potentially results in injury to oneself or another person.

This subdivision is disaggregated on the basis of the actual contributing factor (alcohol or other substances, carelessness or speed) that causes the culpable driving.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

0411 Drive under the influence of alcohol or other substance

0412 Dangerous or negligent operation (driving) of a vehicle

Exclusions:

Dangerous or negligent acts not involving the operation of a vehicle. These are coded to Subdivision 049, Other dangerous or negligent acts endangering persons.

0411 Drive under the influence of alcohol or other substance

Offences in which the driver of a vehicle (as defined at the beginning of this division) is under the influence of alcohol or other substance, their driving is impaired, and they actually do or potentially could cause an injury to themselves or another person.

Inclusions:

Ride (bicycle, horse, skateboard, etc.) under the influence of alcohol or other substance

Exclusions:

Drive while exceeding the prescribed content of alcohol. These are coded to Group 1431, Exceed the prescribed content of alcohol or other substance limit.

Death caused by a driver under the influence of alcohol or other substance. These are coded to Group 0132, Driving causing death.

0412 Dangerous or negligent operation (driving) of a vehicle

Dangerous, negligent or culpable operation (driving) of a vehicle (as defined at the beginning of this division) in a manner whereby an injury to themselves or another person occurs, or is potentially likely to occur.

Inclusions:

Dangerous, negligent, careless or reckless driving

Driving causing grievous bodily harm

The negligent or reckless operation of a vehicle

Culpable navigation

Ride (bicycle, horse, skateboard, etc.) in a dangerous or negligent manner

Engage in an unauthorised road race

Fail to have proper control of a vehicle

Speed in a dangerous or negligent manner

Exclusions:

Drive under the influence of alcohol or other substance. These are coded to Group 0411, Drive under the influence of alcohol or other substance.

Drive while exceeding the prescribed content of alcohol or other substance limit. These are coded to Group 1431, Exceed the prescribed content of alcohol or other substance limit.

Drive while disqualified. These are coded to Group 1411, Drive while licence disqualified or suspended.

Exceed the legal speed limit. These are coded to Group 1432, Exceed legal speed limit.

Cause a vehicle to make excessive noise or smoke. These are coded to Group 1422, Roadworthiness offences.

**SUBDIVISION 049 OTHER DANGEROUS OR NEGLIGENT ACTS
ENDANGERING PERSONS**

Dangerous or negligent acts not involving the operation of a vehicle which, though not intended to cause harm, actually or potentially result in injury to oneself or another person.

This subdivision is further disaggregated to distinguish duty of care from other negligent acts that endanger persons, that cannot be placed anywhere else in this division.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 0491 Neglect or ill treatment of person under care
- 0499 Other dangerous or negligent acts endangering persons, nec

0491 Neglect or ill-treatment of person under care

The ill-treatment or wilful neglect of a person under care by a carer, not involving the operation of a vehicle that, though not intended to cause harm, actually or potentially results in injury to the person under care, not amounting to assault.

Inclusions:

- Ill-treatment of patients
- Ill-treatment of elderly persons under care
- Ill-treatment of mentally disabled persons under care
- Child neglect

Exclusions:

Unlawful killing of a person under care. These are coded to Group 0111, Murder.

0499 Other dangerous or negligent acts endangering persons, nec

All other dangerous or negligent acts not involving the operation of a vehicle that, though not intended to cause harm, actually or potentially result in injury to oneself or another person and cannot be classified elsewhere in Subdivision 049, Other dangerous or negligent acts endangering persons.

Inclusions:

- Cause grievous bodily harm by a negligent act or omission
- Unlawful interference with aviation (e.g. damage equipment or instruments, unlawfully interfere with a pilot)

Exclusions:

- Assault. These are coded to Subdivision 021, Assault.
- Jaywalking and other pedestrian offences. These are coded to Group 1441, Pedestrian offences.
- Neglect or ill-treatment of persons. These are coded to Group 0491, Neglect or ill-treatment of persons under care.

DIVISION 05

DIVISION 05 – ABDUCTION, HARASSMENT AND OTHER OFFENCES AGAINST THE PERSON

Acts intended to threaten or harass, or acts that unlawfully deprive another person of their freedom of movement, that are against that person's will or against the will of any parent, guardian or other person having lawful custody or care of that person.

This division is further disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of whether the offence involved abduction, deprivation of liberty, harassment or threatening behaviour.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivisions:

- 051 Abduction and kidnapping
- 052 Deprivation of liberty/false imprisonment
- 053 Harassment and threatening behaviour

Inclusions:

Abduct for sexual or other purposes (where known)

Exclusions:

Sexual servitude offences. These are coded to Group 0323, Sexual servitude offences.

SUBDIVISION 051 ABDUCTION AND KIDNAPPING

The unlawful confinement of a person against that person's will, or against the will of any parent, guardian or other person having lawful custody or care of that person.

This subdivision is not further disaggregated.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following group:

0511 Abduction and kidnapping

0511 Abduction and kidnapping

The unlawful taking away or confinement of a person against that person's will, or against the will of any parent, guardian or other person having lawful custody or care of that person.

Inclusions:

Abduct with sexual intent

Abduct with intent to marry

Kidnap for ransom/gain

Attempt or threat of abduction

Exclusions:

Take a hostage in a robbery/siege situation where the hostage is not transported to a different location. These are coded to Group 0521, Deprivation of liberty/false imprisonment.

Sexual servitude offences. These are coded to Group 0323, Sexual servitude offences.

DIVISION 05 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 052 DEPRIVATION OF LIBERTY/FALSE IMPRISONMENT

The unlawful confinement of a person against that person's will, or against the will of any parent, guardian or other person having lawful custody or care of that person, and not involving the taking away of the person.

This subdivision is not further disaggregated.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following group:

0521 Deprivation of liberty/false imprisonment

0521 Deprivation of liberty/false imprisonment

The unlawful confinement of a person against that person's will, or against the will of any parent, guardian or other person having lawful custody or care of that person, and not involving the taking away of the person.

Inclusions:

Take a hostage in a robbery/siege situation where the hostage is not transported to a different location.

Exclusions:

Sexual servitude offences. These are coded to Group 0323, Sexual servitude offences.

DIVISION 05 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 053 HARASSMENT AND THREATENING BEHAVIOUR

Actions that harass or are intended to harass, threaten or invade the privacy of an individual, not amounting to an assault, sexual assault, stalking, blackmail or extortion. The action can be face-to-face, written, or made through a carriage service (e.g. phone, computer etc.).

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of whether the offences involved harassment, or were of a threatening nature.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 0531 Harassment and private nuisance
- 0532 Threatening behaviour

0531 Harassment and private nuisance

Actions that harass or are intended to harass an individual, not amounting to an assault, sexual assault, stalking, blackmail or extortion.

Inclusions:

- Nuisance phone calls
- Sexual harassment (not amounting to assault, sexual assault or stalking)
- Harassment where there is no indication that the behaviour is intended to cause physical or mental harm, or arouse apprehension or fear.

Exclusions:

- Stalking. These are coded to Group 0291, Stalking.
- Actions intended to cause physical or mental harm to the victim or to arouse apprehension or fear in the victim for his or her own safety. These are coded to Group 0291, Stalking.

0532 Threatening behaviour

Declaration of intention to punish or hurt, to injure body, property or reputation, or give warning of intention to inflict harm or revenge, orally via the telephone or taped recordings, using a computer, or in writing.

Inclusions:

- Threat to cause fire or explosion
- Threats to murder or injure that are not face-to-face where there is no belief that these threats could be enacted
- Threat to destroy or damage property
- Bomb threat

Exclusions:

- Direct (face-to-face) threats where it is believed that the threat could be enacted. This constitutes assault and is coded to the relevant groups within Division 02, Acts intended to cause injury.
- Blackmail and extortion. These are coded to Group 0621, Blackmail and extortion.
- Destruction of, or damage to, property. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 121, Property damage.

DIVISION 06

DIVISION 06 - ROBBERY, EXTORTION AND RELATED OFFENCES

Acts intended to unlawfully gain money, property or other items of value from, or to cause detriment to, another person by using the threat of force or any other coercive measure.

This division is further disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of whether or not the act involved the use and/or threatened use of immediate force or violence.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivisions:

061 Robbery

062 Blackmail and extortion

DIVISION 06 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 061 ROBBERY

The unlawful taking of property, with intent to permanently deprive the owner of the property, from the immediate possession, control, custody or care of a person, accompanied by the use, and/or threatened use, of immediate force or violence.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of whether or not the robbery involved aggravating circumstances.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

0611 Aggravated robbery

0612 Non-aggravated robbery

Inclusions:

Demand money with menaces (where the demand is made face-to-face and there are no further threats)

Robbery that does not involve threats or coercive measures to be carried out in the future

0611 Aggravated robbery

Robbery involving any of the following aggravating circumstances:

- infliction of injury or violence on the person;
- possession/use of a weapon; or
- committed in company (i.e. by two or more persons).

Inclusions:

Armed robbery not resulting in an injury

Administer drugs with intent to steal

0612 Non-aggravated robbery

Robbery not involving any aggravating circumstances as defined in Group 0611, Aggravated robbery.

Inclusions:

Robbery not involving any aggravating circumstances

Demand money with menaces not involving any aggravating circumstances

Exclusions:

Demand money/property with menaces via indirect means e.g. a letter. These are coded to Group 0621, Blackmail and extortion.

Theft from a person without the use of force, threat of force or putting the person in fear. These are coded to Group 0821, Theft from a person (excluding by force).

DIVISION 06 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 062 BLACKMAIL AND EXTORTION

The unlawful demanding with intent to gain money, property, or any other benefit from, or with intent to cause detriment to, another person, accompanied by the use of coercive measures, to be carried out at some point in the future if the demand is not met. This may also include the use and/or threatened use of face-to-face force or violence, provided there is a threat of continued violence if the demand is not met.

This subdivision is not further disaggregated.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following group:

0621 Blackmail and extortion

0621 Blackmail and extortion

The unlawful demanding with intent to gain money, property, or any other benefit from, or with intent to cause detriment to, another person, accompanied by the use of coercive measures, to be carried out at some point in the future if the demand is not met. This may also include the use and/or threatened use of face-to-face force or violence, provided there is a threat of continued violence if the demand is not met.

Coercive measures include, but are not limited to, the threat of:

- force or violence;
- the misuse of authority;
- criminal prosecution;
- the destruction of a person's reputation or social standing; or
- the destruction of a person's property.

Inclusions:

Demand money/property with menaces via indirect means e.g. a letter

Industrial/corporate extortion

Exclusions:

Demand/take property via immediate threat only where there are no further, or continued, threats made. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 061, Robbery.

Robbery that does not include threats of coercive measures to be carried out in the future. These are coded to Subdivision 061, Robbery.

DIVISION 07

DIVISION 07 - UNLAWFUL ENTRY WITH INTENT/BURGLARY, BREAK AND ENTER

The unlawful entry of a structure with the intent to commit an offence, where the entry is either forced or unforced.

A structure is defined as a building that is contained by walls and can be secured in some form.

This includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- dwelling (e.g. house, flat, caravan);
- office;
- bank;
- shop;
- factory;
- school; and
- church.

This division is not further disaggregated.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivision:

071 Unlawful entry with intent/burglary, break and enter

Inclusions:

Break, enter and steal

Burglary

Unlawful entry to a structure with intent

Ram raid

Smash and grab

Home invasion (not involving an assault)

Exclusions:

Steal from residential premises where entry was lawfully gained (e.g. stealing from a house to which the offender has been invited). These are coded to Group 0821, Theft from a person (excluding by force).

Trespass without intent to commit a crime. These are coded to Group 1311, Trespass.

Go equipped to steal. These are coded to Group 1312, Criminal intent.

Possess instruments used for theft or burglary. These are coded to Group 1312, Criminal intent.

Face blackened at night. These are coded to Group 1312, Criminal intent.

This division is further disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of the following elements:

- whether or not the property was taken from a motor vehicle;
- whether or not the offence involved the actual taking or obtaining of money or goods; or
- whether or not the intent was to permanently deprive the owner or possessor of the use of the property.

Offences in this division are classified in the following subdivisions:

- 081 Motor vehicle theft and related offences
- 082 Theft (except motor vehicles)
- 083 Receive or handle proceeds of crime
- 084 Illegal use of property (except motor vehicles)

Inclusions:

Conspiracy involving theft and related offences

DIVISION 08 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 081 MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT AND RELATED OFFENCES

The taking of another person's motor vehicle illegally and without permission, with the intent of temporarily or permanently depriving the owner/possessor of the use of the motor vehicle. Additionally, the taking of another person's motor vehicle parts or its contents illegally, whether or not this also involves the taking of the motor vehicle.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of whether or not the taking of another person's motor vehicle was intended to be a temporary or permanent action, or whether it was merely the vehicle's parts or contents that were taken.

For the purposes of this subdivision the definition of a motor vehicle is any self-propelled vehicle that runs on the land surface and is eligible for registration for use on public roads. This includes, but is not limited to: car, motorcycle, motorised caravan/campervan, truck, lorry, tractor, bus, grader, etc.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

0811 Theft of a motor vehicle

0812 Illegal use of a motor vehicle

0813 Theft of motor vehicle parts or contents

Exclusions:

Tamper with a motor vehicle (where no property is stolen). These are coded to Group 1219, Property damage, nec.

Offences relating to the operation of a stolen motor vehicle. These are coded to the relevant groups within Division 14,

Traffic and vehicle regulatory offences.

0811 Theft of a motor vehicle

The taking of another person's motor vehicle (as defined at the beginning of this subdivision) illegally and without permission, with the intent of permanently depriving the owner or possessor of the use of the motor vehicle.

Inclusions:

Theft of a motor vehicle from motor vehicle retailers

Exclusions:

Theft of a tram, train, ship, aircraft, vessel or any other vehicle not included in the definition of motor vehicle at the beginning of this division. These are coded to Group 0829, Theft (except motor vehicles), nec.

Use/take a motor vehicle temporarily without consent. These are coded to Group 0812, Illegal use of a motor vehicle.

Unlawfully take parts or contents from another person's motor vehicle (as defined at the beginning of this subdivision) illegally and without permission. These are coded to Group 0813, Theft of motor vehicle parts or contents.

0812 Illegal use of a motor vehicle

The taking of another person's motor vehicle (as defined at the beginning of this subdivision) illegally and without permission, with the intent of temporarily depriving the owner or possessor of the use of the motor vehicle.

Exclusions:

Theft of a tram, train, ship, aircraft, vessel or any other vehicle not included in the definition of motor vehicle at the beginning of this division. These are coded to Group 0829, Theft (except motor vehicles), nec.

Permanently take a motor vehicle without consent. These are coded to Group 0811, Theft of a motor vehicle.

SUBDIVISION 081 **MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT AND RELATED OFFENCES**

0813 Theft of motor vehicle parts or contents

The unlawful taking of parts or contents from another person's motor vehicle (as defined at the start of this subdivision) illegally and without permission.

Inclusions:

Theft from a motor vehicle

Exclusions:

The fraudulent conversion of a motor vehicle. These are coded to Group 0991, Dishonest conversion.

Theft of a tram, train, ship, aircraft, vessel or any other vehicle not included in the definition of motor vehicle at the beginning of this division. These are coded to Group 0829, Theft (except motor vehicles), nec.

SUBDIVISION 082 THEFT (EXCEPT MOTOR VEHICLES)

The unlawful taking or obtaining of money, goods, services (other than from motor vehicles) or non-motorised vehicles, without the use of force, threat of force or violence, coercion or deception, with the intent to permanently deprive the owner or possessor of the use of the money or goods.

This subdivision is disaggregated on the basis of the type of theft that occurred.

For the purposes of this subdivision the definition of a vehicle (other than a motor vehicle) includes but is not limited to: tram, train, ship, aircraft, vessel or any other (non-motorised) vehicle.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 0821 Theft from a person (excluding by force)
- 0822 Theft of intellectual property
- 0823 Theft from retail premises
- 0829 Theft (except motor vehicles), nec

0821 Theft from a person (excluding by force)

The taking of money, personal goods or personal information from the immediate possession or control of a person without the use of force, threat of force or violence or putting the victim in fear.

Inclusions:

- Pick pocketing
- Bag snatching where no assault or threat takes place
- Passport theft
- Theft of deeds or bill of sale
- Theft of cheques, credit cards and EFTPOS cards
- Steal from residential premises where entry was lawfully gained

Exclusions:

- Theft from a person with the use of force, threat of force or by putting the victim in fear. These are coded to Group 0611, Aggravated robbery; or Group 0612, Non-aggravated robbery.
- Use of stolen cheques, credit cards and EFTPOS cards. These are coded to Group 0911, Obtain benefit by deception.
- Use of stolen deeds or bill of sale. These are coded to Group 0911, Obtain benefit by deception.
- Identity fraud (i.e. where stolen personal information is used to obtain a benefit). These are coded to Group 0911, Obtain benefit by deception.

0822 Theft of intellectual property

Theft, whether by photocopying, photographing, electronic or other means, of copyrights, patents or other intellectual property defined by legislation.

Inclusions:

- Computer hacking involving theft of intellectual property
- Computer software piracy
- Industrial espionage not involving physical removal of property

Exclusions:

- Computer hacking involving fraud. These are coded to Group 0911, Obtain benefit by deception.
- Computer hacking involving property damage. These are coded to Group 1219, Property damage, nec.
- Computer hacking involving breach of government security. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 155, Offences against government security.
- Computer hacking not involving theft of intellectual property, fraud, property damage or breach of government security. These are coded to Group 1612, Offences against privacy.

SUBDIVISION 082 THEFT (EXCEPT MOTOR VEHICLES) *continued*

0823 Theft from retail premises

Theft of goods for sale, other than motor vehicles, by avoiding payment for those goods. If a theft includes the taking of items for sale and items not for sale, such as tools, equipment or furnishings, it is included here, however if the theft only involves items not for sale, it is coded elsewhere.

Shoplifting

Theft from market stalls

Theft from wholesale or factory retail outlets

Theft of retail goods

Exclusions:

Theft of motor vehicles from motor vehicle retailers. These are coded to Group 0811, Theft of a motor vehicle.

Evade payment for services. These are coded to Group 0829, Theft (except motor vehicles), nec.

Theft, of money, goods or services, not elsewhere classified in Subdivision 082, Theft (except motor vehicles).

Inclusions:

Leave a restaurant without paying

Theft of another person's vehicle, other than a motor vehicle

Illicit drug theft

Theft of weapons or explosives

Theft by avoiding payment

Fare evasion

Fuel drive-offs

Theft of electricity, gas or water

Evade payment for services

Theft from a retail premises that only involves the taking of tools, equipment, furnishings or other items not for sale

Theft of animals/livestock

Theft of a tram, train, ship, aircraft, vessel or any other (non-motorised) vehicle not included in the definition of motor vehicle at the beginning of this division

SUBDIVISION 084 ILLEGAL USE OF PROPERTY (EXCEPT MOTOR VEHICLES)

The taking of another person's property, other than a motor vehicle, illegally and without permission with the intent of temporarily depriving the owner or possessor of the use of the property.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following group:

0841 Illegal use of property (except motor vehicles)

0841 Illegal use of property (except motor vehicles)

DIVISION 09 - FRAUD, DECEPTION AND RELATED OFFENCES

Offences involving a dishonest act or omission carried out with the purpose of deceiving to obtain a benefit.

This division is disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of the type of fraud or deception involved.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivisions:

- 091 Obtain benefit by deception
- 092 Forgery and counterfeiting
- 093 Deceptive business/government practices
- 099 Other fraud and deception offences

Inclusions:

- Utter a forged/counterfeit document
- Unlicensed person practicing a trade/profession
- Identity fraud
- Conspiracy to defraud

Exclusions:

Deceive a witness. These are coded to Group 1561, Subvert the course of justice.

Deception offences relating to weapons and explosives, other than those relating to licensing. These offences are coded to the relevant groups within Division 11, Prohibited and regulated weapons and explosives offences.

SUBDIVISION 091 OBTAIN BENEFIT BY DECEPTION

The use of deception or impersonation with the intent of dishonestly obtaining property, goods, services or other benefit, or to avoid a disbenefit.

This subdivision is not further disaggregated.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following group:

0911 Obtain benefit by deception

0911 Obtain benefit by deception

The use of deception or impersonation with the intent of dishonestly obtaining property, goods or services or other benefit, or to avoid a disbenefit.

Inclusions:

Identity fraud
Creation of a fictitious identity
Forgery involving the assumption of another person's identity
Cheque/credit/EFTPOS card fraud
Prescription drug fraud
False representation
State a false name
Income taxation fraud
Phishing
Use of stolen deeds/bill of sale
Make false/misleading statement with intent to obtain a benefit
Social security fraud (federal)
Social welfare fraud (state)
Sales taxation fraud
Fraud against insurance companies
Fraudulent third-party motor vehicle claims
Avoid payment of customs and excise
Imposition
Computer hacking involving fraud

Exclusions:

Obtain a benefit through fraudulent trade practices. These are coded to Group 0931, Fraudulent trade practices.
Misrepresentation of professional status. These are coded to Group 0932, Misrepresentation of professional status.
Computer hacking involving property damage. These are coded to Group 1219, Property damage, nec.
Computer hacking involving breach of government security. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 155, Offences against government security.
Computer hacking not involving theft of software, fraud, property damage or breach of government security. These are coded to Group 1612, Offences against privacy.

DIVISION 09 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 092 FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING

Actions involving the making or use of false currency or the falsifying of official documents with an intention to deceive, obtain money, goods or services, or obtain a benefit or advantage. This includes the possession of equipment to make false/illegal instruments.

This subdivision is further disaggregated by the type of forgery, and the possession of forgery equipment.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 0921 Counterfeiting of currency
- 0922 Forgery of documents
- 0923 Possess equipment to make false/illegal instrument

0921 Counterfeiting of currency

Offences involving the passing or possession of counterfeited coins or notes.

0922 Forgery of documents

Offences involving the passing or possession of forged official documents.

Inclusions:

- Create false documents
- Forge passport or visa
- Forge birth certificate
- Forge Commonwealth document
- Forge bill of sale, share certificate
- Supply false documentation to get a weapons/explosives licence/permit
- Supply false documentation to get, keep or upgrade a vehicle licence/permit
- Forge signature on document
- Forge motor vehicle registration certificate

Exclusions:

- Theft of deeds or bill of sale. These are coded to Group 0821, Theft from a person (excluding by force).
- Forgery involving the assuming of another person's identity. These are coded to Group 0911, Obtain benefit by deception.

0923 Possess equipment to make false/illegal instrument

Possess or use equipment to make false or illegal documents or currency, with the intent to obtain a benefit or advantage.

Inclusions:

- Use of counterfeiting equipment
- Possess equipment used for the manufacture of official documents
- Possess equipment/plates used for the manufacture of coins/notes
- Computer hacking involving fraudulent creation of a false/illegal instrument

Exclusions:

- Computer hacking involving the theft of intellectual property. These are coded to Group 0822, Theft of intellectual property.

DIVISION 09 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 093 DECEPTIVE BUSINESS/GOVERNMENT PRACTICES

Actions carried out by deceitful or dishonest conduct as part of trade or commercial business activity, with the intent to avoid liability or obtain an advantage, financial or otherwise.

This subdivision is further disaggregated by the type of deceptive business/government practice that has been committed.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 0931 Fraudulent trade practices
- 0932 Misrepresentation of professional status
- 0933 Illegal non-fraudulent trade practices

0931 Fraudulent trade practices

Actions carried out as part of trade or commercial activity that are intended to deceive consumers, stakeholders or other interested parties.

Inclusions:

- Securities industry frauds (e.g. insider trading, issue misleading prospectus)
- Breach of company code legislation (e.g. falsification of registers, false advertising)
- Breach of the Trade Practices Act that constitutes a fraud offence
- Fraudulent trade or commercial practices
- Charge for goods or services that are not provided
- Wind back speedometers on used cars
- Sell used parts as new
- Sell or attempt to sell a ticket for admission to entertainment where part of the proceeds are purportedly devoted to a charitable purpose without authorisation
- Bait advertising (e.g. advertised sales in which stock is very limited, or is discounted for only a very brief period)
- Price fixing (e.g. an agreement between business competitors to sell the same product at the same price, in order to push prices up)
- Computer hacking involving fraudulent trade practices
- False advertising

Exclusions:

- Company offences involving the use of false instruments. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 092, Forgery and counterfeiting.
- Secret commissions associated with trade practices. These are coded to Group 0999, Other fraud and deception offences, nec.
- Advertisements falsely claiming a professional status. These are coded to Group 0932, Misrepresentation of professional status.

0932 Misrepresentation of professional status

Acts intended to deceive others into a mistaken belief that a person belongs to a particular profession, trade, rank or status.

Inclusions:

- Advertisements falsely claiming a professional status
- Impersonation of a professional or justice official
- Unlicensed/unregistered person practicing a trade or profession

Exclusions:

- False advertising. These are coded to Group 0931, Fraudulent trade practices.

DIVISION 09 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 093 DECEPTIVE BUSINESS/GOVERNMENT PRACTICES

continued

0933 Illegal non-fraudulent trade practices

Acts intended to obtain financial gain or advantage through dishonest or unscrupulous means, not involving fraud.

Inclusions:

Selective supply (or non-supply) of a product by a manufacturer or wholesaler to business entities operating in competition with each other

Acceptance or solicitation of a 'gazumping' offer

DIVISION 09 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 099 OTHER FRAUD AND DECEPTION OFFENCES

Other fraud and deception offences not included elsewhere in Division 09.

This subdivision is further disaggregated based on whether the offence involved dishonest conversion, or any other fraudulent or deceptive elements.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 0991 Dishonest conversion
- 0999 Other fraud offences, nec

0991 Dishonest conversion

Dishonestly converting money or goods that come into a person's possession or control, not involving the use of deception or taking without consent.

Inclusions:

- Embezzlement
- Misappropriation
- Steal as a public servant
- Theft by a person in a position of trust (e.g. accountant, bailee, agent, collector, business partner, employee, council member)
- Fraudulent conversion of a motor vehicle

Exclusions:

- Theft of a motor vehicle, its contents, or parts for the purpose of dishonest conversion. These are coded to Group 0811, Theft of a motor vehicle; or Group 0813, Theft of motor vehicle parts or contents.
- Theft of goods or services for the purpose of dishonest conversion. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 082, Theft (except motor vehicles).

0999 Other fraud and deception offences, nec

Other fraud/deception offences not elsewhere classified in Division 09.

Inclusions:

- Collect for an unregistered charity
- Pretend to exercise any kind of witchcraft, sorcery, enchantment or conjuration to tell fortunes
- Interfere with boundary marks
- Secret commissions

DIVISION 10

DIVISION 10 - ILLICIT DRUG OFFENCES

The possessing, selling, dealing or trafficking, importing or exporting, manufacturing or cultivating of drugs or other substances prohibited under legislation.

The term drug is used to describe narcotics, opiates, hallucinogens and any other substance prohibited under legal control.

This division is disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of the type of drug activity involved.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivisions:

- 101 Import or export illicit drugs
- 102 Deal or traffic in illicit drugs
- 103 Manufacture or cultivate illicit drugs
- 104 Possess and/or use illicit drugs
- 109 Other illicit drug offences

Exclusions:

Offences involving the misuse or illegal obtaining of licit drugs. These are coded to Group 1626, Licit drug offences.

Prescription drug fraud. These are coded to 0911, Obtain benefit by deception.

Illicit drug theft. These are coded to Group 0829, Theft (except motor vehicles), nec.

Administer illicit drugs or poison to a person. These are coded to Group 0299, Other acts intended to cause injury, nec.

DIVISION 10 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 101 IMPORT OR EXPORT ILLICIT DRUGS

Actions resulting or intended to result in either the importation of illicit drugs or controlled substances into Australia, or the exportation of illicit drugs or controlled substances from Australia.

This subdivision is disaggregated on the basis of whether illicit drugs are imported or exported.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

1011 Import illicit drugs

1012 Export illicit drugs

Inclusions:

Conspiracy to import or export illicit drugs

1011 Import illicit drugs

Actions resulting or intended to result in the importation of illicit drugs or controlled substances into Australia where the amount involved is deemed to be of a quantity sufficient for commercial activity.

Inclusions:

Drug couriers involved in importing illicit drugs

1012 Export illicit drugs

Actions resulting or intended to result in the exportation of illicit drugs or controlled substances from Australia where the amount involved is deemed to be of a quantity sufficient for commercial activity.

Inclusions:

Drug couriers involved in exporting illicit drugs

DIVISION 10 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 102 DEAL OR TRAFFIC IN ILLICIT DRUGS

The supply or purchase of an illicit drug or controlled substance of any quantity, or the possession of an illicit drug or controlled substance where the amount involved is deemed to be of a quantity for commercial activity.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of whether commercial or non-commercial quantities of drugs or controlled substances are trafficked or dealt. Where the quantity is not known, code to the subdivision level.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

1021 Deal or traffic in illicit drugs – commercial quantity

1022 Deal or traffic in illicit drugs – non-commercial quantity

Inclusions:

Conspiracy to deal or traffic in illicit drugs

Possess a commercial/traffickable quantity of illicit drugs

1021 Deal or traffic in illicit drugs - commercial quantity

The supply, purchase or possession of an illicit drug or controlled substance, where the amount involved is deemed to be of a quantity sufficient for commercial activity.

1022 Deal or traffic in illicit drugs - non-commercial quantity

The supply or purchase of an illicit drug or controlled substance, where the amount involved is deemed to be of a quantity for personal use rather than commercial activity.

DIVISION 10 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 103 MANUFACTURE OR CULTIVATE ILLICIT DRUGS

Actions resulting or intended to result in either the manufacture of controlled substances, or growing of plants used to make illicit drugs.

This subdivision is further disaggregated based on whether the illicit drugs are manufactured or cultivated.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 1031 Manufacture illicit drugs
- 1032 Cultivate illicit drugs

Inclusions:

Conspiracy to manufacture/cultivate illicit drugs

1031 Manufacture illicit drugs

Actions resulting intended to result in the manufacture of controlled substances used to make illicit drugs.

Inclusions:

- Possess drug precursors with intent to manufacture illicit drugs
- Possess equipment with intent to manufacture illicit drugs

1032 Cultivate illicit drugs

Actions resulting or intended to result in the cultivation or growing of illegal or controlled plants used to make illicit drugs.

Inclusions:

Cultivate controlled plant

DIVISION 10 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 104 POSSESS AND/OR USE ILLICIT DRUGS

The possession of a non-commercial quantity and/or use of an illicit drug or other controlled substance.

This subdivision is disaggregated on the basis of possession and use of non-commercial quantities of illicit drugs or other controlled substances.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

1041 Possess illicit drugs

1042 Use illicit drugs

Exclusions:

Possess commercial/trafficable quantity of illicit drug. These are coded to Subdivision 102, Deal or traffic in illicit drugs.

1041 Possess illicit drugs

The possession of a non-commercial quantity of an illicit drug or controlled substance for which possession or use is prohibited under legislation.

Exclusions:

Use or self-administration of an illicit drug or controlled substance. These are coded to Group 1042, Use illicit drugs.

1042 Use illicit drugs

The use of an illicit drug or controlled substance, the possession or self-administration of which is prohibited under legislation.

Inclusions:

Self-administer an illicit drug or controlled substance

Exclusions:

Possess an illicit drug or controlled substance. These are coded to Group 1041, Possess illicit drugs.

Administer an illicit drug or controlled substance to another person where further intent is unknown. These are coded to Group 0299, Other acts intended to cause injury, nec.

DIVISION 10 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 109 OTHER ILLICIT DRUG OFFENCES

Other illicit drug offences not elsewhere classified in Division 10, Illicit drug offences.

This subdivision is not further disaggregated.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following group:

1099 Other illicit drug offences, nec

1099 Other illicit drug offences, nec

Other illicit drug offences not elsewhere classified in Division 10, Illicit drug offences.

Inclusions:

Possess money with intent to obtain drugs

Possess pipes, syringes, or other utensils associated with the use of drugs

Permit premises to be used to take, sell or distribute drugs

Fail to keep register for drugs of addiction

Exclusions:

Possess money from the sale of illicit drugs. These are coded to Group 0831, Receive or handle proceeds of crime.

DIVISION 11

DIVISION 11 - PROHIBITED AND REGULATED WEAPONS AND EXPLOSIVES OFFENCES

Offences involving prohibited or regulated weapons and explosives. Those offences also involving assault, sexual assault or robbery are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivisions 021, Assault; 031, Sexual assault; and 061, Robbery respectively.

This division is further disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of whether or not the weapons and/or explosives are prohibited or simply regulated.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivisions:

- 111 Prohibited weapons/explosives offences
- 112 Regulated weapons/explosives offences

Exclusions:

Theft of weapons or explosives. These are coded to Group 0829, Theft (except motor vehicles), nec.

DIVISION 11 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 111 PROHIBITED WEAPONS/EXPLOSIVES OFFENCES

Offences relating to weapons or explosives that are prohibited under legislation.

This subdivision is disaggregated on the basis of the type of activity related to prohibited weapons/explosives.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

1111 Import or export prohibited weapons/explosives

1112 Sell, possess and/or use prohibited weapons/explosives

1119 Prohibited weapons/explosives offences, nec

Exclusions:

Offences relating to regulated or restricted weapons/explosives. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 112, Regulated weapons/explosives offences.

1111 Import or export prohibited weapons/explosives

The importation or exportation of prohibited weapons/explosives into/out of Australia.

Exclusions:

Offences relating to the importation and exportation of regulated or restricted weapons/explosives. These are coded to Group 1123, Deal or traffic regulated weapons/explosives offences.

1112 Sell, possess and/or use prohibited weapons/explosives

The sale, possession, and/or use of prohibited weapons/explosives.

Exclusions:

Offences relating to the sale, possession and/or use of regulated weapons/explosives. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 112, Regulated weapons/explosives offences.

1119 Prohibited weapons/explosives offences, nec

Prohibited weapons/explosives offences not elsewhere classified in Subdivision 111, Prohibited weapons/explosives offences.

Inclusions:

Manufacture or modify prohibited weapons/explosives

Exclusions:

Offences relating to the manufacture or modification of regulated or restricted weapons/explosives. These are coded to Group 1129, Regulated weapons/explosives offences, nec.

Theft of weapons or explosives. These are coded to Group 0829, Theft (except motor vehicles), nec.

DIVISION 11 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 112 REGULATED WEAPONS/EXPLOSIVES OFFENCES

Offences relating to weapons/explosives that are legalised or regulated by legislation.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of whether the regulated weapons/explosives are trafficked or unlawfully obtained/misused.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

1121 Unlawfully obtain or possess regulated weapons/explosives

1122 Misuse of regulated weapons/explosives

1123 Deal or traffic regulated weapons/explosives offences

1129 Regulated weapons/explosives offences, nec

Inclusions:

Offences relating to the sale, possession and/or use of regulated weapons/explosives

Exclusions:

Offences relating to prohibited or banned weapons/explosives. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 111, Prohibited weapons/explosives offences.

1121 Unlawfully obtain or possess regulated weapons/explosives

Unlawfully obtain or possess regulated weapons/explosives, excluding theft of regulated weapons/explosives.

Inclusions:

Possess firearm without licence/permit

Possess unregistered firearm

Purchase firearm/ammunition without permit

Exclusions:

Supply false documentation to get a licence/permit. These are coded to Group 0922, Forgery of documents.

Theft of any weapons/explosives. These are coded to Group 0829, Theft (except motor vehicles), nec.

1122 Misuse of regulated weapons/explosives

Offences relating to the operation or handling of legal or regulated weapons/explosives.

Inclusions:

Discharge offences (e.g. discharge at prohibited times or places)

Storage offences (e.g. fail to secure firearm, carry weapons dangerously or concealed)

Unlawful use (e.g. possess a weapon with intent to commit an offence)

Lend a weapon to a minor/unlicensed person

Unlawfully modify or alter regulated weapons, where this results in the creation of a weapon capable of being registered, regardless of whether or not it is actually registered

Exclusions:

Weapons/explosives sales offences. These are coded to Group 1123, Deal or traffic regulated weapons/explosives.

Manufacture prohibited weapons, or modify or alter regulated weapons to create prohibited weapons. These are coded to Group 1119, Prohibited weapons/explosives offences, nec.

DIVISION 11 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 112 REGULATED WEAPONS/EXPLOSIVES OFFENCES

continued

1123 Deal or traffic regulated weapons/explosives

Offences relating to the exchange (selling or trafficking) of regulated weapons/explosives.

Inclusions:

Dispose/sell firearm or ammunition to an unlicensed person

Sell firearms/ammunition without a dealers licence

Unlicensed importing/exporting of regulated weapons/explosives

Take regulated weapons/explosives across state/territory borders unlawfully

Exclusions:

Dealer's licence offences that do not relate specifically to the buying or selling of weapons/explosives. These are coded to Group 1129, Regulated weapons/explosives offences, nec.

Offences relating to importing or exporting prohibited weapons/explosives. These are coded to Group 1111, Import or export prohibited weapons/explosives.

1129 Regulated weapons/explosives offences, nec

Regulated weapons/explosives offences not elsewhere classified in Subdivision 112, Regulated weapons/explosives offences.

Inclusions:

Registration offences by licensed owner (e.g. failing to notify change of address)

Registration offences by dealers (e.g. failing to display licence on premises, not keeping register)

Offences relating to the manufacture or modification of regulated weapons/explosives

Dealer's licence offences that do not relate specifically to the buying or selling of weapons/explosives

Exclusions:

Theft of any weapons/explosives. These are coded to Group 0829, Theft (except motor vehicles), nec.

DIVISION 12

DIVISION 12 - PROPERTY DAMAGE AND ENVIRONMENTAL POLLUTION

The wilful and unlawful destruction, damage or defacement of public or private property, or the pollution of property or a definable entity held in common by the community.

For this division, 'destruction' means altering the property in any way so as to render it imperfect or inoperative.

This division is further disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of whether property was damaged by pollution or by other means.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivisions:

121 Property damage

122 Environmental pollution

Exclusions:

Possess any object with intent to destroy or damage property. This should be coded to Group 1312, Criminal intent.

Threat to damage or destroy property. This should be coded to Group 0532, Threatening behaviour.

DIVISION 12 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 121 PROPERTY DAMAGE

The wilful and unlawful destruction, damage or defacement of property excluding pollution.

For this subdivision, 'property' means something of a tangible nature, including money, land, conveyances or animals, capable of being owned either privately or publicly.

For this subdivision, 'destruction' means altering the property in any way so as to render it imperfect or inoperative, other than polluting.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of whether property damage occurred as a result of fire or explosion, or other means.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

1211 Property damage by fire or explosion

1212 Graffiti

1219 Property damage, nec

Inclusions:

Damage or kill flora/fauna

Property damage caused by a riot

Tamper with a motor vehicle

Exclusions:

Desecrate graves/interfere with corpse. These are coded to Group 1319, Disorderly conduct, nec.

1211 Property damage by fire or explosion

Property damage caused by fire or explosion.

Inclusions:

Arson

Malicious property damage by fire or explosion

Exclusions:

Malicious property damage not by fire or explosion. These are coded to Group 1219, Property damage, nec.

1212 Graffiti

Property damage caused by the application of substances (e.g. paint, posters and/or plastic, metal or wood based compounds) to the surface of the property.

Inclusions:

Graffiti/deface building

Bill posting

Exclusions:

Vandalism. These are coded to Group 1219, Property damage, nec.

DIVISION 12 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 121 **PROPERTY DAMAGE** *continued*

1219 Property damage, nec

Property damage other than by fire or explosion.

Inclusions:

Vandalism

Sacrilege

Kill/injure cattle or other animals

Damage/obstruct mines

Tamper with a motor vehicle (where no property is taken)

Tamper with a fire hydrant

Malicious property damage not by fire or explosion

Industrial sabotage (e.g. a conscious action or inaction directed towards the damaging or destruction of the work environment.)

Contaminate commercial goods

Computer hacking involving property damage

Exclusions:

Graffiti/deface building. These are coded to Group 1212, Graffiti.

Bill posting. These are coded to Group 1212, Graffiti.

Malicious property damage by fire or explosion. These are coded to Group 1211, Property damage by fire or explosion.

DIVISION 12 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 122 ENVIRONMENTAL POLLUTION

Actions that result in the polluting of property.

For this subdivision, 'property' is deemed to be the definable entities of air, water, noise, soil, or the environment, that are held in common by the community.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of the nature of the element of the environment polluted.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

1221 Air pollution offences

1222 Water pollution offences

1223 Noise pollution offences

1224 Soil pollution offences

1229 Environmental pollution, nec

Exclusions:

Offences concerned with motor vehicle pollution. These are coded to Group 1422, Roadworthiness offences.

Offences involving breaches of environmental rules and regulations but not actually involving pollution. These are coded to Group 1691, Environmental regulation offences.

1221 Air pollution offences

Actions that result in the polluting of air.

1222 Water pollution offences

Actions that result in the polluting of water and/or water utilities.

1223 Noise pollution offences

Actions that result in levels of noise exceeding government regulations.

1224 Soil pollution offences

Actions that result in the polluting of soil.

1229 Environmental pollution, nec

Environmental pollution offences not elsewhere classified in Subdivision 122, Environmental pollution.

DIVISION 13

DIVISION 13 - PUBLIC ORDER OFFENCES

Offences relating to personal conduct that involves, or may lead to, a breach of public order or decency, or that is indicative of criminal intent, or that is otherwise regulated or prohibited on moral or ethical grounds. In general these offences do not involve a specific victim or victims; however some offences, such as offensive language and offensive behaviour, may be directed towards a single victim.

This division is further disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of whether or not the behaviour is regulated.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivisions:

- 131 Disorderly conduct
- 132 Regulated public order offences
- 133 Offensive conduct

DIVISION 13 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 131 DISORDERLY CONDUCT

Offences involving personal conduct that is disorderly or is indicative of criminal intent.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of the type of disorderly conduct.

Associating with criminal offenders, or behaving in a manner, or possessing tools, clothing or other material, that indicates an intent to commit a criminal offence.

- Face blackened at night
- Possess articles of disguise
- Possess any object with intent to destroy or damage property

Exclusions:

- Unlawfully on premises with intent, or in possession of materials indicating intent. These are coded to Group 0711,
Unlawful entry with intent/burglary, break and enter.

1313 Riot and affray

A public disturbance involving acts or threats of violence for a common purpose by an assemblage of persons.

Inclusions:

- Take part in a riot

1319 Disorderly conduct, nec

Disorderly conduct not elsewhere classified in Subdivision 131, Disorderly conduct.

Inclusions:

Disorderly behaviour in a public place

Desecrate graves/interfere with corpse

Throw stones not causing injury

Hoaxes causing public nuisance

Exclusions:

Unlawfully use animal. These are coded to Group 1334, Cruelty to animals.

Riot and affray. These are coded to Group 1313, Riot and affray.

Vilify or incite hatred on racial, cultural, religious or ethnic grounds. These are coded to Group 1333, Vilify or incite hatred on racial, cultural, religious or ethnic grounds.

Bomb threats. These are coded to Group 0532, Threatening behaviour.

Hoax calls to emergency services. These are coded to Group 1549, Offences against government operations, nec.

SUBDIVISION 132 REGULATED PUBLIC ORDER OFFENCES

Offences involving behaviour that is regulated or prohibited on moral or ethical grounds.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of the type of regulated public order activity involved.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 1321 Betting and gambling offences
- 1322 Liquor and tobacco offences
- 1323 Censorship offences
- 1324 Prostitution offences
- 1325 Offences against public order sexual standards

Regulated activities governing public order standards

1321 Betting and gambling offences

Offences arising from the operation of illegal betting or gaming, or breaches of rules or regulations that apply to legal betting or gaming operations.

1322 Liquor and tobacco offences

The production, and/or sale or purchase of, alcoholic or tobacco products without a licence or in breach of licensing conditions.

Sale of alcohol products without a licence
Sale of alcoholic products in contravention of licence conditions
Purchase of alcoholic products in contravention of licence conditions

Exclusions:

Consumption of legal substances in regulated spaces. These are coded to Group 1326, Consumption of legal substances in regulated spaces.

1323 Censorship offences

The production, possession, distribution or display of prohibited or controlled pornographic or other material in written, photographic, film, video or other format.

Exclusions:

Procure a child for pornography. These are coded to Group 0321, Non-assaultive sexual offences against a child.
Child pornography offences. These are coded to Group 0322, Child pornography offences.

SUBDIVISION 132 REGULATED PUBLIC ORDER OFFENCES *continued*

1324 Prostitution offences

1326 Consumption of legal substances in regulated spaces

Actions involving the consumption of legal substances (e.g. alcohol or tobacco) in prohibited or regulated public spaces.

Inclusions:

Drink alcohol in an alcohol free zone

Possess alcohol in an alcohol free zone

Smoke in a designated non-smoking area

Exclusions:

The production, and/or sale or purchase, of alcoholic or tobacco products without a licence or in breach of licensing conditions. These are coded to Group 1322, Liquor and tobacco offences.

1329 Regulated public order offences, nec

Regulated public order offences not elsewhere classified in Subdivision 132, Regulated public order offences.

Inclusions:

Breach of euthanasia legislation not amounting to murder, manslaughter, attempted murder or assault

Advertise/seek out a surrogate mother

Exclusions:

Kill an unborn child/infanticide. These are coded to Group 0131, Manslaughter.

Procure or commit illegal abortion. These are coded to Group 1695, Procure or commit illegal abortion.

SUBDIVISION 133 OFFENSIVE CONDUCT

Offences involving personal conduct that is deemed offensive to members of the public.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of the type of offensive conduct.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

1332 Offensive behaviour

1333 Vilify or incite hatred on racial, cultural, religious or ethnic grounds

1334 Cruelty to animals

1331 Offensive language

The use of abusive, invective or improper verbal language that is likely to be considered offensive by another person.

1332 Offensive behaviour

Behaviour of a non-verbal kind that is likely to be considered offensive by another person.

Inclusions:

Vagrancy

Begging

Public drunkenness

Coarse forms of gesticulation

Engage in intercourse in front of a minor/child (unless there is an intent to force the child to watch)

Busk without a permit

Exclusions:

Force a minor/child to witness an act of sexual intercourse. These are coded to Group 0321, Non-assaultive sexual offences against a child.

1333 Vilify or incite hatred on racial, cultural, religious or ethnic grounds

Offences involving the incitement of hatred towards, serious contempt for, or severe ridicule of, a person or group of persons on the grounds of their race, culture, religion or ethnicity.

Exclusions:

Vilify or incite hatred resulting in physical harm. These are coded to Division 02, Acts intended to cause injury.

Vilify or incite hatred resulting in property damage. These are coded to Division 12, Property damage and environmental pollution.

1334 Cruelty to animals

An act that causes suffering, pain, harm, or puts an animal's life in danger or causes death. It can be in the form of neglect to tame animals by not giving food and water or training animals by use of physical force.

Unlawfully use animal

Breach cruelty to animal legislation

Exclusions:

Flora and fauna offences. These are coded to Group 1691 Environmental regulation offences.

Bestiality. These are coded to Group 1325, Offences against public order sexual standards.

DIVISION 14

DIVISION 14 - TRAFFIC AND VEHICLE REGULATORY OFFENCES

Offences relating to vehicles and most forms of traffic, including offences pertaining to the licensing, registration, roadworthiness or use of vehicles, bicycle offences and pedestrian offences.

This division is further disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of whether or not the offence was in breach of regulations relating to having a driver's licence, the registration or roadworthiness of a particular vehicle, or the manner in which the vehicle is operated. While some 'drink driving' offences, such as exceed the prescribed blood alcohol limit, are included in this division, others such as drive under the influence of alcohol or other substance form part of Division 04, Dangerous or negligent acts endangering persons.

For the purposes of this division the definition of vehicle is any means of motorised or non-motorised transport in or on which something is carried, conveyed or travels. This includes but is not limited to: car, motorcycle, motorised caravan/campervan, truck, tractor, bus, train, tram, boat, aeroplane, bicycle, wheelchair, skateboard/skates/rollerblades, ride-on mower, horse, etc.

For the purposes of this division, 'drive' and 'operate' are taken to be interchangeable terms for being considered in control of or in charge of a vehicle.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivisions:

- 141 Driver licence offences
- 142 Vehicle registration and roadworthiness offences
- 143 Regulatory driving offences
- 144 Pedestrian offences

Exclusions:

Dangerous or negligent driving (including driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs and culpable driving), actually or potentially causing injury. These are coded to Subdivision 041, Dangerous or negligent operation of a vehicle.

Motor vehicle theft. These are coded to Subdivision 081, Motor vehicle theft and related offences.

Fraud relating to motor vehicles. These are coded to Division 09, Fraud, deception and related offences.

SUBDIVISION 141 DRIVER LICENCE OFFENCES

Driver licence offences pertaining to the ownership or use of a driver's licence.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of the most common driving offences.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

1411 Drive while licence disqualified or suspended

1412 Drive without a licence

1419 Driver licence offences, nec

1411 Drive while licence disqualified or suspended

Offences relating to the use of driver's licence that has been disqualified or suspended.

Inclusions:

Drive while licence is disqualified

1412 Drive without a licence

Offences relating to driving without an authorised driver's licence excluding where the licence has been suspended or disqualified.

Inclusions:

Drive with an expired licence

Unlicensed driving

Exclusions:

Drive while licence disqualified or suspended. These are coded to Group 1411, Drive while licence disqualified or suspended.

1419 Driver licence offences, nec

All other driver licence offences not elsewhere classified in Subdivision 141, Driver licence offences

Inclusions:

Drive contrary to the conditions of a licence enabling restricted driving

L or P plate licence offences (e.g. driving without L or P plates displayed as required)

Fail to produce licence on demand

Exclusions:

Drive without a licence. These are coded to Group 1412, Drive without a licence.

Drive while licence disqualified or suspended. These are coded to Group 1411, Drive while licence disqualified or suspended.

DIVISION 14 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 142 VEHICLE REGISTRATION AND ROADWORTHINESS OFFENCES

Offences relating to the registration or roadworthiness of the vehicle itself, rather than the manner in which the vehicle is being driven.

For the purposes of this subdivision, 'roadworthiness' refers to the soundness of road, air and/or sea vehicles.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of registration and roadworthiness offences.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

1421 Registration offences

1421 Registration offences

Offences relating to the registration of a vehicle.

Inclusions:

Drive an unregistered vehicle (where the manner of driving does not contravene any law or regulation)

Number plates obscured/missing/not attached

Fail to transfer vehicle ownership

Drive an uninsured vehicle

1422 Roadworthiness offences

Offences relating to the roadworthiness of a vehicle.

Inclusions:

Faulty or no lights

Defective vehicle

Drive an unroadworthy vehicle (where the manner of driving does not contravene any law or regulation)

Offences concerned with motor vehicle pollution

Cause a vehicle to make excessive noise or smoke

DIVISION 14 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 143 REGULATORY DRIVING OFFENCES

Offences relating to the breaches of regulations governing the manner in which the vehicle is operated.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of the most common regulatory driving infringements, exceeding speed, alcohol or other substance limits, parking offences, and other regulatory offences.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 1431 Exceed the prescribed content of alcohol or other substance limit
- 1432 Exceed legal speed limit
- 1433 Parking offences
- 1439 Regulatory driving offences, nec

1431 Exceed the prescribed content of alcohol or other substance limit

Offences where the driver of a vehicle, where vehicle is defined at the beginning of this division, exceeds the prescribed content of alcohol or other substance.

Inclusions:

- Drive while exceeding the prescribed content of alcohol
- Ride (bicycle, horse, skateboard, etc.) while exceeding the prescribed content of alcohol
- Drive while affected by an illicit substance

Exclusions:

- Drive under the influence of alcohol or other substance; offences where the driver is under the influence of alcohol or other substance and their driving is impaired, and they actually do or potentially could cause an injury to themselves or another person. These are coded to Group 0411, Driving under the influence of alcohol or other substance.
- Dangerous, negligent, careless or reckless driving. These are coded to Group 0412, Dangerous or negligent operation (driving) of a vehicle.

1432 Exceed legal speed limit

Offences where a driver of a vehicle (as defined at the beginning of this division) exceeds the speed restrictions pertaining to a particular area.

Inclusions:

- Exceed prescribed speed limit in a road works zone
- Exceed speed limit in speed restricted water zones

Exclusions:

DIVISION 15 - OFFENCES AGAINST JUSTICE PROCEDURES, GOVERNMENT SECURITY AND GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS

An act or omission that is deemed to be prejudicial to the effective carrying out of justice procedures or any government operations. This includes general government operations as well as those specifically concerned with maintaining government security.

This division is further disaggregated into subdivisions on the basis of whether or not the act or omission was against justice procedures or government operations.

Offences in this division are classified into the following subdivisions:

- 151 Breach of custodial order offences
- 152 Breach of community-based orders
- 153 Breach of violence and non-violence orders
- 154 Offences against government operations
- 155 Offences against government security
- 156 Offences against justice procedures

Exclusions:

Offences against justice procedures or government security or government operations where there is an intent to kill, assault, or steal. These are coded to the relevant groups within Division 01, Homicide and related offences; Division 02, Acts intended to cause injury; or Division 08, Theft and related offences.

SUBDIVISION 151 BREACH OF CUSTODIAL ORDER OFFENCES

An act or omission breaching the conditions of a custodial order. This includes offences relating to a person regaining their liberty unlawfully, as well as offences relating to a breach of the conditions specified within a home detention order or suspended sentence.

This subdivision is further disaggregated by the type of custodial order that is breached.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 1511 Escape custody offences
- 1512 Breach of home detention
- 1513 Breach of suspended sentence

Exclusions:

Breach of community-based order. These are coded to the relevant groups within Subdivision 152, Breach of community-based orders.

1511 Escape custody offences

Offences relating to a person who was in lawful custody regaining, his/her liberty unlawfully.

1521 Breach of community service order

An act or omission breaching the conditions of a community service order. This refers to the community-based management of court-ordered sanctions and fine conversions, which principally involve the provision of supervision, programmes or community work.

Breach of reparation orders

1522 Breach of parole

An act or omission breaching the conditions of a parole order.

Inclusions:

Fail to report to parole officer

Exclusions:

Breach of periodic detention. These are coded to Group 1511, Escape custody offences.

Breach of suspended sentence. These are coded to Group 1513, Breach of suspended sentence.

1523 Breach of bail

An act or omission breaching the conditions of a bail order.

Inclusions:

Abscond whilst on bail

Fail to comply with a condition of a bail order

Bail act offences

1524 Breach of bond - probation

An act or omission breaching the conditions of a bond that requires supervision.

Inclusions:

Breach of probation

1525 Breach of bond - other

An act or omission breaching the conditions of a bond that does not require supervision.

1529 Breach of community-based orders, nec

An act or omission breaching the conditions of any other community-based order not otherwise specified within Subdivision 152.

Breach of suspended sentence. These are coded to Group 1513, Breach of suspended sentence.

DIVISION 15 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 153 BREACH OF VIOLENCE AND NON-VIOLENCE ORDERS

An act or omission breaching the conditions of a violence or non-violence related restraining order.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of whether the breached was related to a violence or non-violence order.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

1531 Breach of violence orders

1532 Breach of non-violence orders

1531 Breach of violence order

An act or omission breaching the conditions of a violence order.

Inclusions:

Breach of apprehended violence order

Breach of domestic violence order

1532 Breach of non-violence orders

An act or omission breaching the conditions of a restraining order other than a violence order.

Exclusions:

Breach of a domestic violence order. These are coded to Group 1531, Breach of violence order.

DIVISION 15 *continued*

SUBDIVISION 154 OFFENCES AGAINST GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS

An act with the intent of resisting or hindering government officers, or government operations, other than police, justice or government security officers.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of whether the offence was against an individual person or an operation.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

1541 Resist or hinder government official (excluding police officer, justice official or government security officer)

1542 Bribery involving government officials

1543 Immigration offences

1549 Offences against government operations, nec

1541 Resist or hinder government official (excluding police officer, justice official or government security officer)

An act with the intent of resisting or hindering government officers, other than police officers, justice officials or government security officers, who are carrying out duties under authority of legislation.

Inclusions:

Resist customs officials

Hinder ambulance or fire brigade officers

Exclusions:

Fail to declare goods. These are coded to Group 1694, Import/export regulations.

1542 Bribery involving government officials

The offering, giving or accepting of a bribe involving a government official whilst exercising his/her official authority.

Bribery of elected government representatives (federal, state or local)

Exclusions:

Bribery to subvert the justice process (e.g. bribing a witness, juror or justice official). These are coded to Group 1561, Subvert the course of justice.

Bribes that threaten national security (e.g. buy/sell/disclose national secrets). These are coded to Group 1559, Offences against government security, nec.

1543 Immigration offences

Offences involving illegal entry, people smuggling across international borders, or the failure to comply with immigration visa conditions, including undertaking employment when not permitted, or overstaying exit date.

Inclusions:

Illegal immigrant

Visa offences

People trafficking

Exclusions:

Passport or visa offences involving theft or fraud. These should be coded to Group 0821, Theft from a person (excluding by force) or Group 0911, Obtain benefit by deception.

People trafficking involving sexual servitude. These are coded to Group 0323, Sexual servitude offences.

SUBDIVISION 154 OFFENCES AGAINST GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS

1549 Offences against government operations, nec

Offences against government operations, other than those of a security nature, with the intent of impeding the normal functioning capacity of that operation. Included in this group are offences against government statutory bodies or agencies that operate under specific government regulation.

Theft of electricity, gas or water. These are coded to Group 0829, Theft (except motor vehicles), nec.

SUBDIVISION 155 OFFENCES AGAINST GOVERNMENT SECURITY

An act or omission prejudicial to effective enforcement of government operations concerned with the preservation of national security.

This subdivision is further disaggregated on the basis of whether the enforcement of government security operations involved government officials.

Offences in this subdivision are classified into the following groups:

- 1551 Resist or hinder government officer concerned with government security
- 1559 Offences against government security, nec

Inclusions:

Computer hacking involving breach of government security

1551 Resist or hinder government officer concerned with government security

An act with the intent of resisting or hindering the official directions of a government officer, other than a police officer or justice official, who is concerned with maintaining government security. Official directions are those given in the conduct of the officer's duties.

1559 Offences against government security, nec

Offences against government security other than resisting or hindering the official directions of a government officer, other than a police officer or justice official, who is concerned with maintaining government security.

- 1622 Disease prevention offences
- 1623 Occupational health and safety offences
- 1624 Transport regulation offences
- 1625 Dangerous substances offences

APPENDIX 1 CHANGES: ASOC 1997 TO ASOC 2008

INTRODUCTION

The second edition of the ASOC reflects a substantial review of all facets of the classification. The first edition of the classification was released in 1997 and there have been significant legislative changes at state and territory level since the first edition was released. A second edition of the classification has been released in order to maintain its relevance for crime and justice agencies and to enable data providers to align local legal codes to the national ASOC framework.

This appendix lists all the changes that have been made at the division, subdivision and group level for the revised edition of ASOC.

The second edition of ASOC is separated into 16 divisions, reflecting the same structure as the first edition. Four divisions have undergone name changes.

09 Division 09, previously titled 'Deception and related offences' has been renamed 'Fraud, deception and related offences' to more clearly reflect the subdivisions and groups within the division.

11 Division 11, previously titled 'Weapons and explosives offences' has been renamed 'Prohibited and regulated weapons and explosive offences' to better reflect that only prohibited or regulated weapons are counted in this division.

14 Division 14, previously titled 'Road traffic and Motor vehicle regulatory offences' has been renamed 'Traffic and vehicle regulatory offences' to incorporate non-road vehicles, such as boats and aircrafts, and non-motor vehicles.

ASOC SUBDIVISIONS

The second edition of ASOC includes 49 subdivisions, three more than the first edition.

021 Subdivision 021 has been disaggregated to include assault resulting in serious injury, assault not resulting in serious injury, and common assault.

053 Subdivision 053 has been created to include 'Harassment and private nuisance' and 'Threatening behaviour', which were previously located in Division 16.

091 Subdivision 091, previously titled 'Fraud, forgery or false financial instrument' is now a new subdivision, titled 'Obtain benefit by deception'.

092 Subdivision 092, previously titled 'Counterfeiting currency and related offences' is now titled 'Forgery and counterfeiting'.

093 Subdivision 093, previously titled 'Dishonest conversion' is now titled 'Deceptive business/government practices'.

153 Subdivision 153 includes all breaches of violence and non-violence orders, and is now titled 'Breach of violence and non-violence orders'.

155 This subdivision has been created in order to relocate what was previously Subdivision 153 'Offences against government security'. Subdivision 155 now includes all groups which resided in Subdivision 153 in the first edition.

156 Subdivision 156 is a new subdivision, titled 'Offences against justice procedures'. This subdivision has moved from 152 to 156 in order to keep the three subdivisions relating to breaches of orders together.

161 Subdivision 161, previously titled 'Harassment and Related Offences' is now titled 'Defamation, libel and privacy offences'.
