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ECONOMIC INDICATORS, QUEENSLAND, JUNE 1994

MAIN FEATURES

- Australia's Gross Domestic Product in trend estimate terms increased 6.0% to \$108,350m from March quarter 1993 to March quarter 1994. Queensland's Gross State Product in trend estimate terms for the quarter ended December 1993 was \$17,088m, an increase of 5.6% from the December 1992 figure.
- In the most recent period, the demand in Queensland for housing finance for owner occupation, new motor vehicle registrations, personal, commercial and lease finance all increased significantly. Growth in retail trade remained constant and the number of unemployed persons decreased.
- Queensland's population increased 2.7% from December 1992 to December 1993, compared with a 1.0% increase in Australia's population over the same period.
- The trend estimate for total dwelling unit approvals increased slightly from 4,436 in March 1994 to 4,455 in April 1994. However, the value of all building approved decreased 36.2% between March and April 1994 and decreased 9.2% between April 1993 and April 1994.
- Total housing finance for owner occupation in Queensland increased 14.5% from February to March 1994 and 39.1% from March 1993 to March 1994. Similarly, personal finance commitments increased 35.2% between March 1993 and March 1994. Total commercial finance commitments and lease finance commitments increased 26.6% and 34.3%, respectively, over the same period.
- Growth in retail trade turnover in trend estimate terms in Queensland has been consistently increasing 0.5% per month from January 1994 to April 1994 inclusive reaching \$1,529.1m in April 1994.
- The trend estimate for total new motor vehicle registrations in Queensland increased 15.8% from April 1993 to April 1994.
- The trend estimate for the unemployment rate in Queensland for May 1994 was 9.4%. This is the lowest trend estimate unemployment rate recorded for Queensland since December 1990. The total number of employed persons in Queensland increased by 3,800 in trend estimate terms between April and May 1994.

Statistics shown in this publication are the latest available at the date of preparation. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues. Reference should therefore always be made to the latest issue, or to the statistical publication on the specific subject when figures are not shown.

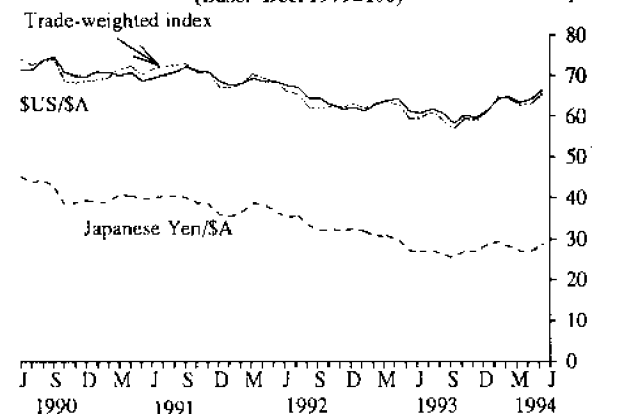

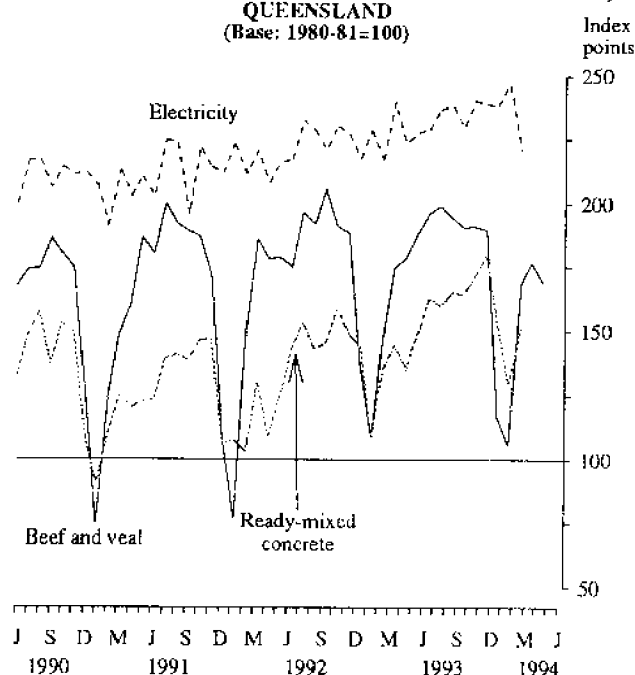

EMPLOYED PERSONS BY SELECTED INDUSTRY DIVISION, QUEENSLAND

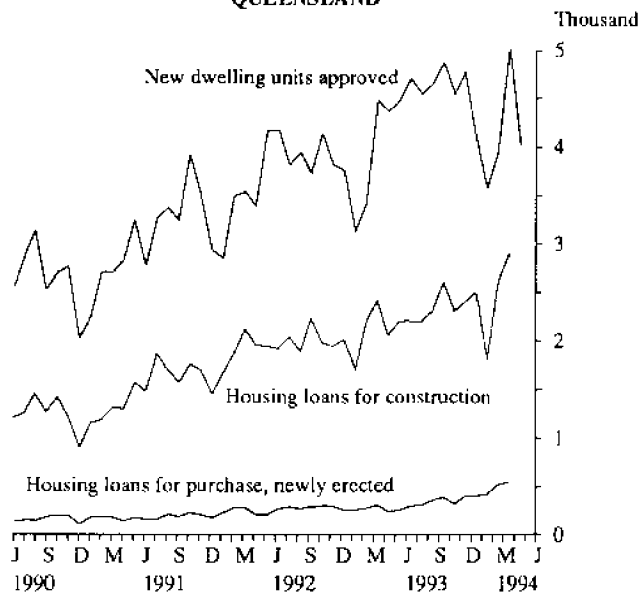

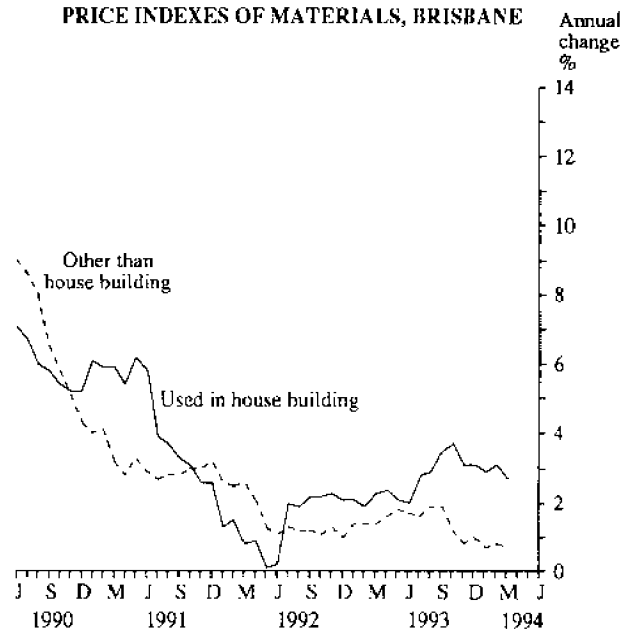

PRICE INDEXES OF MATERIALS, BRISBANE

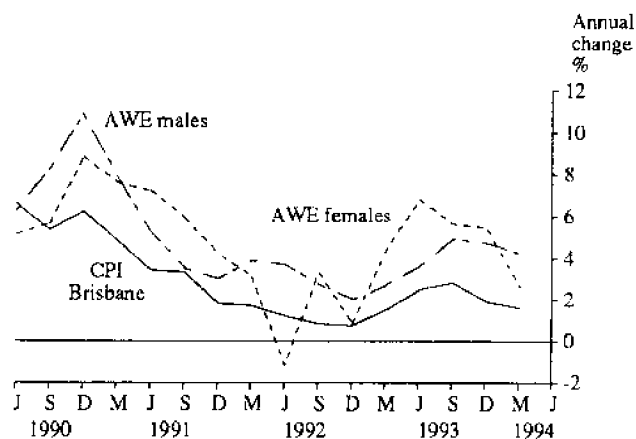

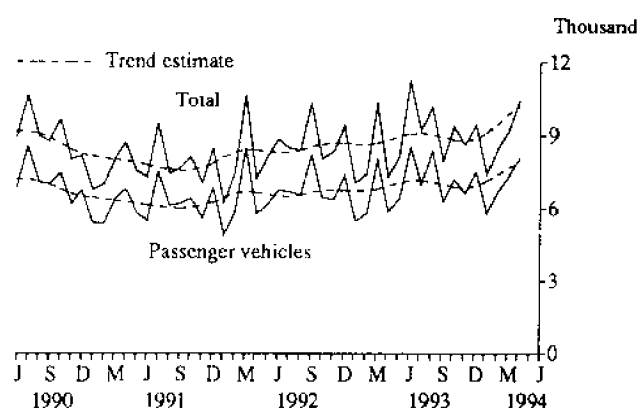
