


## SEP QTR 1995 KEY POINTS

### TREND ESTIMATES

- GDP(A) increased 0.8% in September quarter to a level 3.0% higher than in September quarter 1994.
- GDP(I) and GDP(E) recorded growth rates of 0.5% and 0.6%, respectively, while GDP(P) grew at a somewhat higher rate of 1.2%.
- The terms of trade increased 1.1% in the September quarter. This resulted in an increase of 1.0% in real gross domestic income, in comparison with the 0.5% growth in GDP(I).
- Gross farm product increased 8.8% in September quarter, while gross non-farm product (GNFP(A)) increased 0.5%.

### SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES

- GDP(A) increased 1.6% in September quarter and is now 3.3% higher than in September quarter 1994.
- Gross farm product increased 20.2% in September quarter (see page 11), while gross non-farm product (GNFP(A)) increased 1.0%.
- Exports increased by 6.0% in September quarter whereas imports only increased by 0.1%.
- Domestic final demand fell 0.5% in September quarter, the first decline in this aggregate since March quarter 1992.

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## REVISIONS IN THIS ISSUE

Current price estimates have been revised for recent quarters, mainly as a result of incorporating more complete survey data. The most significant revisions were to private gross fixed capital expenditure on non-dwelling construction and the increase in private non-farm stocks. The latter series was also seasonally reanalysed. Estimates of GDP(P) have been revised for recent years. New annual benchmarks have been introduced for mining, and water, sewerage and drainage for 1993-94 and for fishing for 1994-95. In addition, earlier years' annual benchmarks have been revised for these industries. For more recent periods the availability of more complete survey data has resulted in revisions to most industries. Revisions to the constant price estimates of the Commonwealth component of government final consumption expenditure have resulted from changes made to the wages component of the deflator to better capture the effects of wage increases arising from enterprise bargaining and performance-based pay. In addition, both the current and constant price estimates of Commonwealth government final consumption expenditure have been seasonally reanalysed because of changes in seasonality which have become apparent in these series since the last reanalysis, conducted in respect of the December quarter 1994 accounts. All series will be seasonally reanalysed prior to the next release of this publication.

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## CHANGES IN THIS ISSUE

The treatment of payments to and from the Child Support Trust Account (CSTA) has been changed in this publication, in line with the revised treatment adopted in *Government Financial Estimates, Australia, 1995-96* (5501.0). The change does not affect estimates of GDP. Payments made through the income tax system to the Child Support Agency (which administers this account) are now treated as part of income tax receipts, while payments from the CSTA are treated as part of personal benefit payments and classified to the "Commonwealth, Social security - other" category in Table 37. Previously, payments to, and receipts from, this agency were regarded as private trust fund transactions which did not affect the aggregates in the national accounts for either the general government or household sectors. The Child Support Agency operates to ensure that non-custodial parents assist in the support of their children. Commonwealth legislation provides the authority for the collection of child support payments from non-custodial parents which are paid into consolidated revenue. Payments are then distributed to custodial parents from the CSTA.

## SEPTEMBER QUARTER

### SUMMARY COMMENT

### FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

- Private expenditure grew 0.8%. There were increases in all categories except cigarettes and tobacco, purchases of motor vehicles, fares and net expenditure overseas. The major contributors to growth were food, household durables and other goods.

### PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

- Dwelling construction fell 4.5% in September quarter, the fourth quarter of decline. By contrast, growth of non-dwelling construction was strong at 3.6%. Investment on equipment fell 0.8%. Overall private GFCE fell 1.5%.

### INCREASE IN PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

- The strong build-up in private non-farm stocks over recent quarters continued with an increase of \$938 million in September quarter following an increase of \$935 million in the June quarter.

### EXPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- A decline of 0.7% in rural exports, mainly due to meat and wool, was more than offset by a 1.9% increase in non-rural exports of goods and a 3.3% increase in exports of services, resulting in an overall increase of 1.7%.

### IMPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- Imports of goods and services increased 0.3% in September quarter, with goods growing 0.6% and services declining 0.6%. Capital goods rose 1.7% with ADP equipment being the major contributor to growth. Consumption goods increased 0.6% and intermediate goods showed no change.

**SEPTEMBER QUARTER****SUMMARY COMMENT****AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY AND FISHING**

- Increased 8.0% (18.4% in seasonally adjusted terms), reflecting the much higher level of agricultural production expected in 1995-96 compared with 1994-95.

**MINING**

- Growth has been weak over the last four quarters, with an increase of only 0.2% in September quarter.

**MANUFACTURING**

- The trend estimate increased 0.8%, (1.1% in seasonally adjusted terms). The latter increase was associated with flat sales but quite strong growth in stocks of finished goods and work in progress, most notably for transport equipment.

**CONSTRUCTION**

- Declined a little further in September quarter, falling by 0.2%. Quite strong growth in non-dwelling construction was more than offset by a decline in dwelling construction.

**RETAIL TRADE**

- Recorded growth of 0.9% in trend terms (0.5% in seasonally adjusted terms). A large decline in sales of new motor vehicles dampedened growth considerably.


#### WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

- Rose 1.7% (1.6% in seasonally adjusted terms).
- The rise reflects an increase of 0.8% in the number of wage and salary earners and 0.9% in the underlying average earnings. The corresponding changes in seasonally adjusted terms were a rise of 0.7% in the number of wage and salary earners and an increase of 0.9% in underlying earnings.


#### GROSS OPERATING SURPLUS

- GOS of private corporate trading enterprises increased 1.4% (1.1% in seasonally adjusted terms) to a level 2.6% higher than in September quarter 1994.
- Unincorporated farm enterprises made a significant contribution to the increase in GOS for other trading enterprises.

## ANALYSES AND COMMENTS

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### RELIABILITY OF CONTEMPORARY TREND ESTIMATES

Seasonally adjusted series include both the trend effects and the irregular effects which influence movements in a series. As a result, seasonally adjusted estimates do not necessarily provide a good indication of the underlying behaviour of a series. On the other hand, trend estimates represent the underlying direction of the series, excluding seasonal effects and residual/irregular factors. Trend estimates are calculated by smoothing the seasonally adjusted series using a statistical procedure based on centred Henderson moving averages. The procedure used is designed to minimise distortions in the trend level, turning point shape and timing of turning points.

For the most recent quarters, insufficient data exist to use centred Henderson moving averages to calculate the trend values and so approximations to the Henderson moving averages are used for the latest three quarters. This means that revisions to the trend estimates for the last few quarters are unavoidable, even if none of the original data have been revised. More details about trend estimation are contained in the ABS Information Paper *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series — Monitoring "Trends": An Overview* (1348.0) which was released on 19 April 1993.

Potential revisions to trend estimates can be indicated by showing the effects of particular changes in seasonally adjusted estimates that might occur in the next quarter. The table below shows the trend estimates for the last few quarters and the values to which they would be revised if the notional movements in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) actually occurred in December quarter 1995.

Seasonally adjusted growth of 0.5% is required in December quarter 1995 to maintain the trend growth, in December quarter, of 0.8% currently estimated for September quarter 1995.

### TREND ESTIMATE — PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN GDP(A)

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

The graph below provides a comparison of the quarterly growth rates (percentage changes) in constant price GDP(A) in both seasonally adjusted and trend terms in recent years.


Percentage changes



### HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

The proportion of household disposable income devoted to consumption in the September quarter was 96.7%. The balance, household saving, was 3.3%. Caution should be exercised in interpreting this ratio in recent years, because major components of household income and expenditure may still be subject to significant revisions. The impact of these revisions on the saving ratio can cause changes in the apparent direction of the trend. The following graph presents the household saving ratio derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 26).

Trend





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### PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO

In current price terms, the book value of private non-farm stocks increased by \$1,706 million (2.5%), while sales increased by \$1,199 million (1.6%). Consequently, the stocks to sales ratio increased from 0.900 to 0.909. The following graph presents the ratio of private non-farm stocks to sales derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 24).


Trend at Current Prices



### IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

The imports to sales ratio, trended and at current prices, fell marginally to 0.260 in September quarter 1995, from 0.261 in June quarter. The following graph presents the ratio of imports to sales derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 25).

Trend at Current Prices



### TERMS OF TRADE

In September quarter 1995 the terms of trade index derived from trend estimates (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 16) rose 1.1%. A rise of 2.2% in the implicit price deflator (IPD) for exports more than offset a rise of 1.1% in the IPD for imports.


Trend (1989–90 = 100)



### REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the Technical Note included in the September quarter 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989–90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income*. The graph below provides a comparison of trend GDP(I) at average 1989–90 prices and real gross domestic income. Trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of real gross domestic income are shown in Tables 68 and 69 respectively.

### PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE— NON-DWELLING CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT

Movements in private gross fixed capital expenditure can often be affected by large second-hand transactions and large one-off purchases. Details of recent transactions in second-hand assets between the private and public sectors, expenditure on new equipment and new work on non-dwelling construction are provided in the table below.

The following components are estimated in this way by extrapolating from benchmarks based mainly on the periodic Retail Censuses and Selected Service Industry Surveys:

Food; Alcoholic drinks; Clothing, fabrics and footwear; Household appliances; Other household durables; and Other goods.

### GROSS OPERATING SURPLUS - PRIVATE CORPORATE TRADING ENTERPRISES

The level recorded in this aggregate for September quarter 1995 includes amounts for three enterprises (viz. Qantas, United Energy and GFE Resources Ltd) which were previously included in the public trading enterprises sector.

There are two major differences between the estimates for gross operating surplus shown in the national accounts and those reported in *Company Profits, Australia* (\$651.0). The national accounts estimates are after the deduction of the stock valuation adjustment and exclude capital gains and losses; for example those arising from foreign currency loans, asset sales and asset revaluations. The stock valuation adjustment was much lower in September quarter 1995 than in June quarter 1995. However, the impact of this change on the national accounts measure of GOS in comparison with the company profits survey measure was significantly reduced because the latter included significant capital losses in the June quarter and significant capital gains in the September quarter.

### WAGES SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

Quarterly movements in wages, salaries and supplements can at times be significantly affected by changes in the level of severance, termination and redundancy payments or in the level of supplements to wages and salaries (ie employers' contributions to superannuation and workers' compensation claims). Employers' contributions to superannuation have been increased in September quarter 1995 as a consequence of the one percentage point increase in the minimum employer contribution required, from 1 July 1995, under the Superannuation Guarantee Levy legislation. Severance, termination and redundancy payments for recent quarters are shown below (although an estimate for September quarter 1995 is not yet available) together with estimates for supplements for the last nine quarters. (These estimates can be shown only in original terms because wages, salaries and supplements are seasonally adjusted in total.)

### GROSS FARM PRODUCT

Gross farm product rose 20.2% in seasonally adjusted constant price terms in the September quarter 1995. On a seasonally adjusted basis production of wheat, other grain crops and other crops increased significantly, while livestock slaughterings was the only major agricultural commodity to record a fall in output in the quarter.

It should be noted that the convention used to seasonally adjust wheat, sugar cane, other grain crops and other crops has particular implications for the interpretation of quarter-to-quarter changes in seasonally adjusted gross farm product. The method used is to divide the annual production of these crops by four and allocate this amount to each of the four quarters in a financial year. Although this avoids problems that would be associated with the application of standard methods of seasonal adjustment to the production of crops, it introduces a step in the seasonally adjusted estimates between June and September quarters because it concentrates the whole of the annual change for these crops into the September quarter, followed by zero growth in December, March and June quarters. (A more detailed description of the seasonal adjustment of gross farm product is provided in Appendix 1 of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).)

### FARM TREND ESTIMATES

Trend estimates are calculated using a centred 7-term Henderson moving average of the seasonally adjusted series (see paragraphs 6 and 7 of the Explanatory Notes). Estimates for the three most recent quarters normally cannot be calculated using this centred average method; instead an asymmetric average is used. This can lead to revisions in the trend estimates for the last three quarters when data become available for the latest quarters, even if none of the original data for earlier quarters has changed.

Agricultural production, particularly for grain crops, is expected to increase significantly in 1995-96 following the breaking of the recent drought in many parts of Australia. Using normal procedures the trend estimates for the last three quarters could be expected to be revised significantly in later issues of the quarterly national accounts as additional quarters are added to the series. Consequently, in order to minimise such revisions to the trend estimates for gross farm product (and other related aggregates) for the last three quarters the usual procedures have been modified to take account of the expected higher level of farm production in 1995-96. The modification involves extending the seasonally adjusted gross farm product series for the last three quarters of 1995-96 using forecasts and calculating the trend estimates up to September quarter 1995 using a centred 7-term Henderson moving average. This method of calculating the trend estimates for farm product at current and constant prices resulted in the following differences compared with the normal procedure:

These differences have been used to adjust the "normal" trend estimates of gross operating surplus of unincorporated enterprises on the income side of the domestic production account and public marketing authority stocks on the expenditure side. The adjustments to trend estimates of gross farm product at average 1989-90 prices have thus been incorporated in the constant price trend estimates of GDP(I), GDP(E) and GDP(P).

### PRIVATE FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

Recently there have been a number of enquiries regarding which components of private final consumption expenditure are estimated using data from the monthly retail survey, the results of which are published in *Retail Trade, Australia* (8501.0).

# EXPLANATORY NOTES

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## INTRODUCTION

**1** This publication contains estimates of the components of gross domestic product and national expenditure and supporting tables for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the eight previous quarters and the last four financial years. Seasonally adjusted and trend estimates of the major aggregates and some selected series are also provided for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the twelve previous quarters. The List of Tables, pages 13 and 14, show the full range of data provided.

## CONCEPTS, SOURCES AND METHODS

**2** These are documented in *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). In association with the introduction of constant price estimates at average 1989–90 prices, some of the methods used to derive constant price estimates were changed. The major changes are described in Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989–90 Prices* (5243.0).

## ACCURACY OF QUARTERLY ESTIMATES

**3** Estimating for a period of less than one year presents special problems. It is often difficult to adhere strictly to definitions used in annual estimates when deriving quarterly ones. This is particularly the case for the quarterly measure of income, because it is not always possible to match the value of production for a quarter with the cost incurred in that production. Difficulties are also encountered in obtaining detailed data for short periods and in preparing consistent estimates from different sources with different accounting procedures and periods. Furthermore, the quarter-to-quarter growth in seasonally adjusted terms is very sensitive to the timing of recording a transaction. If the recording of a transaction is delayed by one quarter, seasonally adjusted movements will be distorted for three consecutive quarters. All these problems affect the accuracy of the current and constant price estimates and should be taken into account in interpreting the estimates.

## REVISIONS

**4** Most figures are subject to revision as more complete and accurate information becomes available. The revisions are of two types: those made to recent quarters and those made as a consequence of a redistribution across all quarters within a year following revisions to annual totals. Major revisions made this quarter are discussed on page 2.

## TREND ESTIMATES

**5** Given the qualifications regarding the accuracy and reliability of the quarterly national accounts, the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) considers that trend estimates provide the best guide to the underlying movements, and are more suitable than either the seasonally adjusted or original data for most business decisions and policy advice.

**6** A trend estimate is obtained by removing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. For estimates in this publication, it is calculated using a centred 7-term Henderson moving average of the seasonally adjusted series. Estimates for the three most recent quarters cannot be calculated using this centred average method; instead an asymmetric average is used. This can lead to revisions in the trend estimates for the last three quarters when data become available for later quarters, even if none of the original data for earlier quarters has changed.

**7** If a series has a high 'irregular' component, then the trend estimates will be subject to greater revision for the latest few quarters as data become available for subsequent quarters than would otherwise be the case. However, it is important to note that this does not make the trend series inferior to the seasonally adjusted or original series. In fact, in such cases the effect of the irregular component on overall movements is likely to be even more marked in the seasonally adjusted and the original estimates than in the trend series.

TREND ESTIMATES (continued)

IMPLICIT PRICE DEFULATOR (IPD)

**9** The quarterly implicit price deflators (IPDs) are derived by dividing seasonally adjusted and trend current price estimates by the corresponding constant price estimates.

Movements in IPDs can be greatly affected by changes in the physical composition of the aggregates and their components. For this reason, quarterly IPDs derived from seasonally adjusted or trend data are preferred to those using original data. The seasonal adjustment process itself is also a possible source of distortion. For further information see Appendix VI of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).

SEASONAL ADJUSTMENT:

GENERAL METHOD

**10** Data that are affected by seasonal factors are adjusted to remove the effects of these factors. The general methods for doing so are described in Appendix I of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). Three important points should be noted here:

- The methods used in seasonal adjustment do not force the sum of the adjusted estimates for each quarter of a year to equal the original annual total.
- Where constant price estimates have no apparent seasonality in their implicit price deflators, the estimates are adjusted using the corresponding factors for current price estimates.
- Special methods have been used to adjust some components of gross farm product. These concern the adjustment of crop production where production/harvest only occurs in a couple of quarters each year. In these instances, the output for each financial year is distributed equally over the four quarters.

MEASURES OF GDP

GDP(I)

INCOME APPROACH

**11** GDP(I) is the sum of factor incomes, consumption of fixed capital (depreciation) and net indirect taxes. The preferred current price measure of GDP is GDP(I). It is the overall measure which is consistent with subsidiary measures such as national income and the other consolidated tables (such as the national income and outlay account). GDP(I) also provides the base year benchmarks for the constant price estimates of GDP(P). Constant price estimates of GDP(I) are derived by deflating current price estimates of GDP(I) by the implicit price deflator of GDP(E).

GDP(E)

EXPENDITURE APPROACH

**12** GDP(E) is the sum of all final expenditures, changes in stocks, and exports less imports. Constant price estimates of GDP(E)) are the sum of all these components at average 1989-90 prices.

GDP(P)

PRODUCTION APPROACH

**13** GDP(P) is calculated as the market value of goods and services produced by an industry (i.e. gross output) less the cost of goods and services used in the productive process (i.e. intermediate consumption). Constant price estimates of GDP(P) are the sum of constant price estimates (at average 1989-90 prices) for each industry.

MEASURES OF GDP (continued)

GDP(A) **14** While the three measures above are identical in concept, they can differ significantly in practice, especially in the short term, because of the different data sources used for each measure. Using the average of the three, GDP(A), smooths out these differences. GDP(A) is considered by the ABS to be the most satisfactory indicator of short-term seasonally adjusted or trend growth (see the Feature Article in the June quarter 1990 issue of *Australian National Accounts: National Income and Expenditure* (5206.0)).

ANALYSIS OF CONTRIBUTIONS  
TO GROWTH

**15** Tables 6 and 7 present analyses of the contribution provided by each major component to the percentage change in trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of constant price GDP(I). The figures in each table are additive within each quarter, unlike the percentage changes shown in other tables in this publication. The formula used to calculate the contribution of each aggregate to the growth in GDP is:

$$\frac{A(t) - A(t-1)}{GDP(t-1)} \times 100$$

where

- A(t) = value of aggregate A in quarter under consideration  
A(t-1) = value of aggregate A in preceding quarter  
GDP(t-1) = value of GDP in preceding quarter.

TERMS OF TRADE

**16** There are several ways of measuring the terms of trade. In this publication, the following index is used:

$$\frac{\text{Implicit price deflator for exports of goods and services}}{\text{Implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services}} \times 100$$

Estimates of the terms of trade are shown in Tables 11, 12, 18, 19, 68 and 69.

REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

**17** GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the *Technical Note* included in the September 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income* (or real GDI). The following adjustment is made to GDP(I) at constant prices to obtain an estimate of real GDI:

- exports of goods and services at current prices are deflated by the implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services
- the actual constant price value of exports is then deducted from this value, and
- the resultant terms of trade adjustment is then added to GDP(I) at constant prices to give real GDI presented in Tables 68 and 69.

GROSS PRODUCT PER UNIT  
OF LABOUR INPUT

**18** Indexes of constant price gross product per person employed and per hour worked are commonly referred to as measures of labour productivity. However, it should be noted that these indexes reflect not only the contribution of labour to changes in product per unit of labour, but also the contribution of capital and other factors (such as managerial efficiency, economies of scale, etc.).

**19** When analysing labour productivity indexes it is critical to note that they are subject to the vagaries of the growth (or business) cycle as well as the effects of any measurement error in either output or labour input. Differences in the amplitude and phase of the output and input cycles can result in labour productivity indexes deviating substantially from their longer-term trend. Analytical work undertaken within the ABS suggests that movements in employment and hours worked tend to lag movements in GDP. Over a 20 year period, the lag at turning points in the growth cycle varied between zero and four quarters, with the average being between two and three quarters. The implication is that, in the period of the growth cycle when the growth in output is declining, indexes of labour productivity are likely to decline, particularly if rapid growth in GDP is abruptly ended. Conversely, labour productivity indexes are likely to grow strongly when the economy comes out of a cyclical trough.

**20** A simple way to estimate the underlying trend in labour productivity is to compare the values of a labour productivity index spanning a growth cycle e.g. from the peak of one growth cycle to the peak of another. Note that such estimates rest on the assumption that labour is being utilised to the same degree at each growth cycle peak. Average annual growth rates, over growth cycles, of estimates of gross product per hour worked in the *market* and *non-farm market sectors* are shown in *Australian National Accounts: Multifactor Productivity* (5234.0).

MARKET AND NON-FARM  
MARKET SECTORS

**21** The estimates of gross product at constant prices for six industries: Finance and insurance; Property and business services; Government administration and defence; Education; Health and community services; and Personal and other services are derived either wholly or primarily by using either deflated input cost data or hours worked as indicators of output. As such, the estimates cannot adequately reflect changes in productivity. For the purpose of measuring changes in productivity, it is therefore preferable that these industries be excluded. The constant price product of a group of industries referred to as the *market sector* is defined to be *GDP(P) less the above six industries, less Ownership of dwellings* (for which capital stock is used as the indicator of output), *plus the imputed bank service charge related to the 'non-market' industries*.

**22** A second industry group, referred to as the *non-farm market sector*, comprises the market sector *less Agriculture, forestry and fishing*. Productivity estimates derived for this group are free of the effects caused by the volatility of agricultural production due to changing seasonal conditions.

INDEXES OF EMPLOYMENT AND  
HOURS WORKED

**23** The quarterly employment indexes used to derive the gross product per person employed indexes comprise all labour engaged in the production of goods and services and include not only civilian wage and salary earners but also employers; self-employed persons; persons working one hour or more without pay in a family business or on a farm; and members of the Australian defence forces. For details of how the employment and hours worked estimates are formed, refer to Section 23 of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts Sources and Methods* (5216.0), and also Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989-90 Prices* (5243.0) which describes changes in methods introduced in conjunction with the rebase of constant price estimates to average 1989-90 prices.

PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO	<b>24</b> The ratio is presented in Tables 68 and 69. The denominator of this ratio, in current price terms, is defined as : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ private final consumption expenditure on goods</li> <li>▪ plus private gross fixed capital expenditure on dwellings, non-dwelling construction and equipment</li> <li>▪ plus public gross fixed capital expenditure</li> <li>▪ plus exports of non-rural goods.</li> </ul>
IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO	<b>25</b> The ratio is merchandise imports (ie total imports of goods) to sales (as defined in paragraph 24 above). This ratio is presented in Tables 68 and 69.
HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO	<b>26</b> This is the ratio of household saving to household disposable income, where household saving is the difference between household disposable income and private final consumption expenditure. The ratio is a memorandum item in Tables 27 and 28 and is also shown in Table 67.
GDP(A) PER CAPITA	<b>27</b> This is the ratio of GDP(A) to an estimate of the resident Australian population. For all but the most recent quarters, the resident population data are drawn from <i>Australian Demographic Statistics</i> (3101.0). For the most recent quarters, estimates are made by extrapolating from the latest available data.
DATA ON FLOPPY DISK	<b>28</b> All quarterly series in this publication are available in spreadsheet format on floppy disk, <i>Australian National Accounts: Quarterly Data on Floppy Disk</i> (5228.0). These data generally run from September quarter 1959. An important exception is GDP(P) and its components which run from September quarter 1974.
