


DEC QTR 1994 KEY POINTS

TREND ESTIMATES

- The trend estimate of gross domestic product - average (GDP(A)) increased 0.5% in December quarter 1994.
- The trend estimate of GDP(A) has increased 4.6% since December quarter 1993.
- The growth rates of GDP(I), GDP(E) and GDP(P) have varied considerably over recent quarters.
- Nevertheless, all four measures of GDP have recorded slowing growth rates in the last two quarters.
- Real gross domestic income (ie GDP(I) at constant prices adjusted for changes in the terms of trade - see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 17) increased 1.2% in the December quarter.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES

- Seasonally adjusted GDP(A) increased 0.4% in December quarter, following growth of 1.2% in September quarter.
- GDP(E) increased 0.5% in the December quarter, while both GDP(I) and GDP(P) grew 0.4%.
- Seasonally adjusted GDP(A) has increased 5.0% since December quarter 1993.

REVISIONS IN THIS ISSUE	<p>Quarterly estimates for all aggregates have been revised in accordance with revised annual estimates which will be published later in <i>Australian National Accounts: National Income, Expenditure and Product, 1993-94</i> (5204.0). In addition, seasonally adjusted estimates have been revised following the annual reanalysis of seasonally adjusted series.</p> <p>The largest revisions to September quarter 1994 estimates were made to wages, salaries and supplements (down \$853 million) and private non-farm stocks (up \$384 million).</p> <p>Estimates of GDP(P) have been revised for all years as a result of revised base year (1989-90) gross product estimates for all industries and the effects of adopting a new industry classification (see below). In addition, estimates for recent quarters have been revised due to the availability of more complete survey data. In particular, growth in the September quarter 1994 seasonally adjusted estimate has been amended substantially (from 1.0% to 2.0%) mainly due to upward revisions to manufacturing, wholesale trade and transport and storage.</p> <p>Although there have been significant revisions to the seasonally adjusted estimates for the three independent measures of GDP in the September quarter 1994, the growth in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) was only revised down marginally from 1.3% to 1.2%. The previously published estimates of growth in trend GDP(A) have not been revised significantly, except for September quarter 1994, for which growth was reduced from 1.2% to 0.9%, mainly because of the relatively low growth in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) in the December quarter.</p>	

CHANGES IN THIS ISSUE	<p>As foreshadowed in last quarter's issue of this publication, national accounts industry statistics are now classified to a new industrial classification - the <i>Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification</i> (ANZSIC). The change impinges on those statistics with an industry dimension. In this publication they are the components of GDP(P) and private non-farm stocks.</p> <p>As a result of the adoption of ANZSIC, a number of changes have been made to the layout of the publication.</p> <p>For further details of the change to ANZSIC and the consequent changes to the layout of the publication see page 11.</p>

DECEMBER QUARTER SUMMARY COMMENT

FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

- Private expenditure grew 0.8%, with increases in most categories. Food, entertainment and 'other goods and services' were the major contributors to growth.
- Government expenditure fell 0.7%. Both the Commonwealth and State and local sectors contributed to the fall.

GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

- Private dwelling construction grew 1.6% (but fell by 2.6% in seasonally adjusted terms), while non-dwelling construction fell 2.0%. Private investment in equipment increased 6.5%, boosted by the acquisition from overseas of a satellite and an LNG tanker in the December quarter.
- Public expenditure grew 0.4%, but fell by 4.1% in seasonally adjusted terms.

INCREASE IN PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

- An increase of \$1,141 million this quarter continued the steady acceleration in the stocks buildup over the last eight quarters. All major sectors contributed to the growth in the latest quarter.

EXPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- Showed no change. Exports of goods fell 0.7%, while services increased 3.0%. Rural exports were major contributors to the decline in exports of goods.

IMPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- Increased 4.3%. Two high value capital goods (a satellite and an LNG tanker) and computer equipment were major contributors.

DECEMBER QUARTER SUMMARY COMMENT

AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY AND FISHING

- fell 10.9% in trend terms and 5.2% in seasonally adjusted terms. The major impact of the drought has been to reduce production of wheat and other cereal crops.

MANUFACTURING

- The trend estimate increased 1.9% to be 10.8% higher than in December quarter 1993. The seasonally adjusted estimate increased 1.5% (the major contributors to this growth were non-metallic mineral products and machinery and equipment).

WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE

- Wholesale grew 3.9% in trend terms and 2.4% in seasonally adjusted terms. Sales of computers and other machinery and equipment showed strong growth in the December quarter.
- The trend estimate for the retail industry increased 1.1%, while the seasonally adjusted estimate was 1.4% higher. Growth was widespread, but was particularly strong for motor vehicle retailers.

TRANSPORT AND STORAGE

- Increased 2.9% in trend terms and is 10.6% higher than in December 1993. In seasonally adjusted terms this industry rose 2.6%. All sectors except air transport rose markedly.


WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

- Rose 1.0% in both trend and seasonally adjusted terms.
- The rise reflects an increase of 0.9% in the number of wage and salary earners and 0.1% in the underlying average earnings. The corresponding changes in seasonally adjusted terms were an increase of 1.4% in the number of wage and salary earners and a fall of 0.3% in average earnings.


GROSS OPERATING SURPLUS

- GOS of private corporate trading enterprises grew 2.8% (1.4% in seasonally adjusted terms) to a level 11.9% higher than in December quarter 1993.

ANALYSES AND COMMENTS

RELIABILITY OF CONTEMPORARY TREND ESTIMATES

Seasonally adjusted series include both the trend effects and the irregular effects which influence movements in a series. As a result, seasonally adjusted estimates do not necessarily provide a good indication of the underlying behaviour of a series. On the other hand, trend estimates represent the underlying direction of the series, excluding seasonal effects and residual/irregular factors. Trend estimates are calculated by smoothing the seasonally adjusted series using a statistical procedure based on centred Henderson moving averages. The procedure used is designed to minimise distortions in the trend level, turning point shape and timing of turning points.

For the most recent quarters, insufficient data exist to use centred Henderson moving averages to calculate the trend values and so approximations to the Henderson moving averages are used for the latest three quarters. This means that revisions to the trend estimates for the last few quarters are unavoidable, even if none of the original data have been revised. More details about trend estimation are contained in the ABS Information Paper *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series — Monitoring "Trends"; An Overview* (1348.0) which was released on 19 April 1993.

Potential revisions to trend estimates can be indicated by showing the effects of particular changes in seasonally adjusted estimates that might occur in the next quarter. The table below shows the trend estimates for the last few quarters and the values to which they would be revised if the notional movements in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) actually occurred in March quarter 1995.

Seasonally adjusted growth of 0.8% is required in March quarter 1995 to maintain the trend growth, in March quarter, of 0.5% currently estimated for December quarter 1994.

TREND ESTIMATE — PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN GDP(A)



The graph below provides a comparison of the quarterly growth rates (percentage changes) in constant price GDP(A) in both seasonally adjusted and trend terms in recent years.


Percentage changes



HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

The proportion of household disposable income devoted to consumption in the December quarter was 96.7%. The balance, household saving, was 3.3%. Caution should be exercised in interpreting this ratio in recent years, because major components of household income and expenditure may still be subject to significant revisions. The impact of these revisions on the saving ratio can cause changes in the apparent direction of the trend. The following graph presents the household saving ratio derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 26).



PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO

In trend current price terms, the book value of private non-farm stocks increased by \$1,557 million (2.5%) this quarter, while sales increased by \$1,245 million (1.8%). Consequently, the stocks to sales ratio increased from 0.906 to 0.912. The following graph presents the ratio of private non-farm stocks to sales derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 24).


Trend at Current Prices



IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

The imports to sales ratio, trended and at current prices, rose to 0.259 this quarter from 0.252 last quarter. The following graph presents the ratio of imports to sales derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 25).

Trend at Current Prices



TERMS OF TRADE

In December quarter 1991 the terms of trade index derived from trend estimates (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 16) rose 0.9%. A fall of 0.1% in the implicit price deflator (IPD) for imports was reinforced by a rise of 0.9% in the IPD for exports.


Trend (1989-90 = 100)



REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the Technical Note included in the September quarter 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income*. The graph below provides a comparison of trend GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices and real gross domestic income. Trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of real gross domestic income are shown in Tables 68 and 69 respectively.

PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE -- NON-DWELLING CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT

Movements in private gross fixed capital expenditure can often be affected by large second-hand transactions and large one-off purchases. Details of recent transactions in second-hand assets between the private and public sectors, expenditure on new equipment and new work on non-dwelling construction are provided in the table below.

NEW INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION

The Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC) has been developed for use in both countries for the production and analysis of industry statistics. It replaces the Australian Standard Industrial Classification (ASIC) and the New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (NZSIC) which have been in use for many years. Both have been widely accepted as statistical standards in their own right.

There have been extensive consultations with external users to ensure that the ANZSIC reflects the structure of Australian and New Zealand industry and user requirements for statistics. The Australian Bureau of Statistics and the New Zealand Department of Statistics encourage other organisations to use the classification in their own work in order to improve the comparability and usefulness of the statistics.

In the development of the ANZSIC greater emphasis has been placed on alignment with the international standards than has been the case in the past. The International Standard Industrial Classification of All Economic Activities (ISIC), Revision 3, has been used as the international standard for reference purposes. A principal objective has been to achieve a better balance across the classification by giving more attention to the services sector, and to take account of the effects of technological changes and changes in the structure of industry generally since the 1983 edition of the ASIC.

The adoption of ANZSIC in this publication has led to changes in industry classification categories. A notable example is the contraction of manufacturing industry detail into nine subdivisions compared with the twelve that were published under the ASIC. Many ANZSIC categories have the same or a similar title to the corresponding ASIC category, but their definitions are different. In some cases the difference is relatively minor, such as that between the ANZSIC and ASIC manufacturing divisions, but other differences are more substantial, such as those pertaining to some manufacturing subdivisions and wholesale and retail trade. In addition, the composition of the market and the non-farm market sectors has been changed in this issue (refer to paragraphs 21 and 22 of the Explanatory Notes). Users are referred to a detailed analysis of ANZSIC/ASIC and ASIC/ANZSIC concordances contained in the joint ABS, New Zealand Department of Statistics publication *Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification, 1993* (1292.0).

The adoption of ANZSIC has presented considerable difficulties in compiling consistent time series. In most cases it has been possible to compile historical estimates on a true ANZSIC basis, or close to it. In others, relationships observed in an overlap period have been used to transform data from an ASIC basis. A notable example of the latter is wholesale trade.

The adoption of ANZSIC has led to an increase in the number of pages devoted to the components of GDP(P). The analytical tables relating to GDP(P) now incorporate estimates for the 17 ANZSIC divisions and 20 subdivisions, including the 9 for manufacturing. To accommodate this expansion, it has been necessary to discontinue some tables published previously, in particular, the contributions to growth in GDP(P) tables (previously Tables 8 and 9) and revisions to the various measures of trend GDP (previously Tables 48 to 50). However, the corresponding revisions to percentage changes in trend GDP have been retained.

ANALYSES AND COMMENTS (continued)

PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

In conjunction with the adoption of ANZSIC, the national accounts estimates for book value levels and increases in private non-farm stocks have been aligned with those published in *Stocks, Selected Industry Sales and Expected Sales, Australia* (5629.0) from September quarter 1985. There have therefore been consequential revisions to the estimates for the stocks to sales ratio.

IMPLICIT PRICE DEFLATORS

The implicit price deflator derived from seasonally adjusted estimates of private gross fixed capital expenditure on equipment rose by 1.0% in the December quarter 1994, following falls in the previous three quarters. The principal factor causing the increase was the purchase of an LNG tanker. This large item is deflated using a ship price index which has grown much more from the base period (1989-90) than most other price indexes. In the absence of a similar expensive ship being purchased in the March quarter 1995, one would expect a decline in the implicit price deflator for that quarter, everything else being equal. As the LNG tanker was imported, there was also an upward effect on the implicit price deflator for imports. However, the value of imports is much higher and other factors were sufficient to generate a decline in its implicit price deflator in the December quarter.

The implicit price deflator derived from seasonally adjusted estimates of private gross fixed capital expenditure on non-dwelling construction increased by 2.0% in September quarter 1994 but fell by 1.5% in the December quarter. These movements are mainly attributable to changes in the composition of expenditure on non-dwelling construction between the States and between non-dwelling building and engineering construction, since the price indexes for these components have grown at quite different rates from the base period (1989-90).

EXPLANATORY NOTES

INTRODUCTION

1 This publication contains estimates of the components of gross domestic product and national expenditure and supporting tables for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the eight previous quarters and the last four financial years. Seasonally adjusted and trend estimates of the major aggregates and some selected series are also provided for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the twelve previous quarters. The List of Tables, pages 13 and 14, show the full range of data provided.

CONCEPTS, SOURCES AND METHODS

2 These are documented in *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). In association with the introduction of constant price estimates at average 1989–90 prices, some of the methods used to derive constant price estimates were changed. The major changes are described in Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989–90 Prices* (5243.0).

ACCURACY OF QUARTERLY ESTIMATES

3 Estimating for a period of less than one year presents special problems. It is often difficult to adhere strictly to definitions used in annual estimates when deriving quarterly ones. This is particularly the case for the quarterly measure of income, because it is not always possible to match the value of production for a quarter with the cost incurred in that production. Difficulties are also encountered in obtaining detailed data for short periods and in preparing consistent estimates from different sources with different accounting procedures and periods. Furthermore, the quarter-to-quarter growth in seasonally adjusted terms is very sensitive to the timing of recording a transaction. If the recording of a transaction is delayed by one quarter, seasonally adjusted movements will be distorted for three consecutive quarters. All these problems affect the accuracy of the current and constant price estimates and should be taken into account in interpreting the estimates.

REVISIONS

4 Most figures are subject to revision as more complete and accurate information becomes available. The revisions are of two types: those made to recent quarters and those made as a consequence of a redistribution across all quarters within a year following revisions to annual totals. Major revisions made this quarter are discussed on page 2.

TREND ESTIMATES

5 Given the qualifications regarding the accuracy and reliability of the quarterly national accounts, the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) considers that trend estimates provide the best guide to the underlying movements, and are more suitable than either the seasonally adjusted or original data for most business decisions and policy advice.

6 A trend estimate is obtained by removing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. For estimates in this publication, it is calculated using a centred 7-term Henderson moving average of the seasonally adjusted series. Estimates for the three most recent quarters cannot be calculated using this centred average method; instead an asymmetric average is used. This can lead to revisions in the trend estimates for the last three quarters when data become available for later quarters, even if none of the original data for earlier quarters have changed.

7 If a series has a high 'irregular' component, then the trend estimates will be subject to greater revision for the latest few quarters as data become available for subsequent quarters than would otherwise be the case. However, it is important to note that this does not make the trend series inferior to the seasonally adjusted or original series. In fact, in such cases the effect of the irregular component on overall movements is likely to be even more marked in the seasonally adjusted and the original estimates than in the trend series.

TREND ESTIMATES (continued)

IMPLICIT PRICE DEFULATOR (IPD)

9 The quarterly implicit price deflators (IPDs) are derived by dividing seasonally adjusted and trend current price estimates by the corresponding constant price estimates.

Movements in IPDs can be greatly affected by changes in the physical composition of the aggregates and their components. For this reason, quarterly IPDs derived from seasonally adjusted or trend data are preferred to those using original data. The seasonal adjustment process itself is also a possible source of distortion. For further information see Appendix VI of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).

SEASONAL ADJUSTMENT:**GENERAL METHOD**

10 Data that are affected by seasonal factors are adjusted to remove the effects of these factors. The general methods for doing so are described in Appendix I of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). Three important points should be noted here :

- * The methods used in seasonal adjustment do not force the sum of the adjusted estimates for each quarter of a year to equal the original annual total.
- * Where constant price estimates have no apparent seasonality in their implicit price deflators, the estimates are adjusted using the corresponding factors for current price estimates.
- * Special methods have been used to adjust some components of gross farm product. These concern the adjustment of crop production where production/harvest only occurs in a couple of quarters each year. In these instances, the output for each financial year is distributed equally over the four quarters.

MEASURES OF GDP**GDP(I) INCOME APPROACH**

11 GDP(I) is the sum of factor incomes, consumption of fixed capital (depreciation) and net indirect taxes. The preferred current price measure of GDP is GDP(I). It is the overall measure which is consistent with subsidiary measures such as national income and the other consolidated tables (such as the national income and outlay account). GDP(I) also provides the base year benchmarks for the constant price estimates of GDP(P). Constant price estimates of GDP(I) are derived by deflating current price estimates of GDP(I) by the implicit price deflator of GDP(E).

GDP(E)**EXPENDITURE APPROACH**

12 GDP(E) is the sum of all final expenditures, changes in stocks, and exports less imports. Constant price estimates of GDP(E) are the sum of all these components at average 1989–90 prices.

GDP(P)**PRODUCTION APPROACH**

13 GDP(P) is calculated as the market value of goods and services produced by an industry (i.e. gross output) less the cost of goods and services used in the productive process (i.e. intermediate consumption). Constant price estimates of GDP(P) are the sum of constant price estimates (at average 1989–90 prices) for each industry.

MEASURES OF GDP (continued)

GDP(A) **14** While the three measures above are identical in concept, they can differ significantly in practice, especially in the short term, because of the different data sources used for each measure. Using the average of the three, GDP(A), smooths out these differences. GDP(A) is considered by the ABS to be the most satisfactory indicator of short-term seasonally adjusted or trend growth (see the Feature Article in the June quarter 1990 issue of *Australian National Accounts: National Income and Expenditure* (5206.0)).

ANALYSIS OF CONTRIBUTIONS TO GROWTH

15 Tables 6 and 7 present analyses of the contribution provided by each major component to the percentage change in trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of constant price GDP(I). The figures in each table are additive within each quarter, unlike the percentage changes shown in other tables in this publication. The formula used to calculate the contribution of each aggregate to the growth in GDP is:

$$\frac{A(t) - A(t-1)}{GDP(t-1)} \times 100$$

where

$A(t)$ = value of aggregate A in quarter under consideration

$A(t-1)$ = value of aggregate A in preceding quarter

$GDP(t-1)$ = value of GDP in preceding quarter.

TERMS OF TRADE

16 There are several ways of measuring the terms of trade. In this publication, the following index is used:

$$\frac{\text{Implicit price deflator for exports of goods and services}}{\text{Implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services}} \times 100$$

Estimates of the terms of trade are shown in Tables 11, 12, 18, 19, 68 and 69.

REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

17 GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the *Technical Note* included in the September 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income* (or real GDI). The following adjustment is made to GDP(I) at constant prices to obtain an estimate of real GDI:

- exports of goods and services at current prices are deflated by the implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services
- the actual constant price value of exports is then deducted from this value, and
- the resultant terms of trade adjustment is then added to GDP(I) at constant prices to give real GDI presented in Tables 68 and 69.

GROSS PRODUCT PER UNIT
OF LABOUR INPUT

18 Indexes of constant price gross product per person employed and per hour worked are commonly referred to as measures of labour productivity. However, it should be noted that these indexes reflect not only the contribution of labour to changes in product per unit of labour, but also the contribution of capital and other factors (such as managerial efficiency, economies of scale, etc.).

19 When analysing labour productivity indexes it is critical to note that they are subject to the vagaries of the growth (or business) cycle as well as the effects of any measurement error in either output or labour input. Differences in the amplitude and phase of the output and input cycles can result in labour productivity indexes deviating substantially from their longer-term trend. Analytical work undertaken within the ABS suggests that movements in employment and hours worked tend to lag movements in GDP. Over a 20 year period, the lag at turning points in the growth cycle varied between zero and four quarters, with the average being between two and three quarters. The implication is that, in the period of the growth cycle when the growth in output is declining, indexes of labour productivity are likely to decline, particularly if rapid growth in GDP is abruptly ended. Conversely, labour productivity indexes are likely to grow strongly when the economy comes out of a cyclical trough.

20 A simple way to estimate the underlying trend in labour productivity is to compare the values of a labour productivity index spanning a growth cycle e.g. from the peak of one growth cycle to the peak of another. Note that such estimates rest on the assumption that labour is being utilised to the same degree at each growth cycle peak. Average annual growth rates, over growth cycles, of estimates of gross product per hour worked in the *market* and *non-farm market* sectors are shown in *Australian National Accounts: Multifactor Productivity* (5234.0).

MARKET AND NON-FARM
MARKET SECTORS

21 The estimates of gross product at constant prices for six industries: Finance and insurance; Property and business services; Government administration and defence; Education; Health and community services; and Personal and other services are derived either wholly or primarily by using either deflated input cost data or hours worked as indicators of output. As such, the estimates cannot adequately reflect changes in productivity. For the purpose of measuring changes in productivity, it is therefore preferable that these industries be excluded. The constant price gross product of a group of industries referred to as the *market sector* is defined to be GDP(P) *less* the above six industries, *less* Ownership of dwellings (for which capital stock is used as the indicator of output), *plus* the imputed bank service charge related to the "non-market" industries.

22 A second industry group, referred to as the *non-farm market sector*, comprises the market sector *less* Agriculture, forestry and fishing. Productivity estimates derived for this group are free of the effects caused by the volatility of agricultural production due to changing seasonal conditions.

INDEXES OF EMPLOYMENT AND
HOURS WORKED

23 The quarterly employment indexes used to derive the gross product per person employed indexes comprise all labour engaged in the production of goods and services and include not only civilian wage and salary earners but also employers; self-employed persons; persons working one hour or more without pay in a family business or on a farm; and members of the Australian defence forces. For details of how the employment and hours worked estimates are formed, refer to Section 23 of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts Sources and Methods* (5216.0), and also Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989-90 Prices* (5243.0) which describes changes in methods introduced in conjunction with the rebase of constant price estimates to average 1989-90 prices.

PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS
TO SALES RATIO

24 The ratio is presented in Tables 68 and 69. The denominator of this ratio, in current price terms, is defined as :

- * private final consumption expenditure on goods
- * plus private gross fixed capital expenditure on dwellings, non-dwelling construction and equipment
- * plus public gross fixed capital expenditure
- * plus exports of non-rural goods.

IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

25 The ratio is merchandise imports (ie total imports of goods) to sales (as defined in paragraph 24 above). This ratio is presented in Tables 68 and 69.

HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

26 This is the ratio of household saving to household disposable income, where household saving is the difference between household disposable income and private final consumption expenditure. The ratio is a memorandum item in Tables 27 and 28 and is also shown in Table 67.

GDP(A) PER CAPITA

27 This is the ratio of GDP(A) to an estimate of the resident Australian population. For all but the most recent quarters, the resident population data are drawn from *Australian Demographic Statistics* (3101.0). For the most recent quarters, estimates are made by extrapolating from the latest available data.

DATA ON FLOPPY DISK

28 All quarterly series in this publication are available in spreadsheet format on floppy disk, *Australian National Accounts: Quarterly Data on Floppy Disk* (5228.0). These data generally run from September quarter 1959. An important exception is GDP(P) and its components which run from September quarter 1974. The cost is currently \$130.00 per release or \$390.00 for an annual subscription. Place your order by ringing (06) 252 6627.
