ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES FEBRUARY 1997

MAIN FEATURES

EMPLOYMENT	The seasonally adjusted number of employed persons in NSW was 2,839,500 in January 1997, an increase of 0.5% on the previous month. Nationally, employment also rose by 0.5% over the same period.
UNEMPLOYMENT	The seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons in NSW was 238,800 in January 1997, a rise of 0.6% on the previous month and 1.4% higher than in January 1996. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in January 1997 was 7.8% in NSW and 8.6% nationally.
NEW MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS	In seasonally adjusted terms, new motor vehicle registrations in NSW increased by 3.7% from 17,875 in November 1996 to 18,534 in December 1996.
BUILDING APPROVALS	The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved in NSW in December 1996 was 3,890, an increase of 2.8% on the previous month and 14.9% higher than in December 1995.
FINANCE	The value of housing finance commitments for owner occupation in NSW in December 1996 fell by 6.5% from November 1996, but rose 32.0% from December 1995.

NOTES

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.

For detailed explanatory notes and definitions for the items shown in this publication, readers are referred to the specific ABS publications.

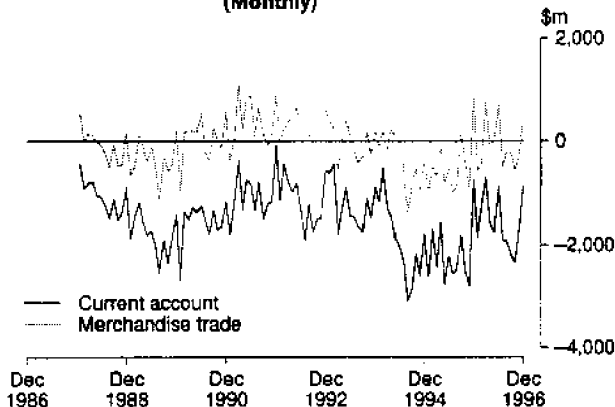

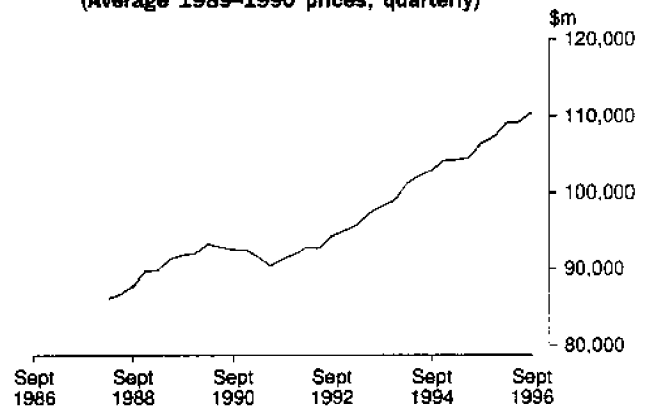

BALANCE OF PAYMENTS AUSTRALIA (Monthly)



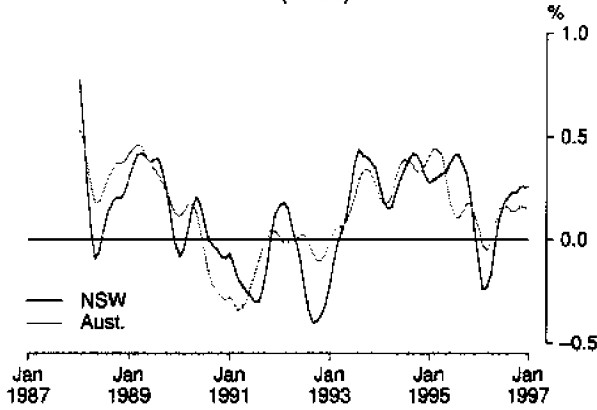
GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT, AUSTRALIA SEASONALLY ADJUSTED (Average 1989-1990 prices, quarterly)



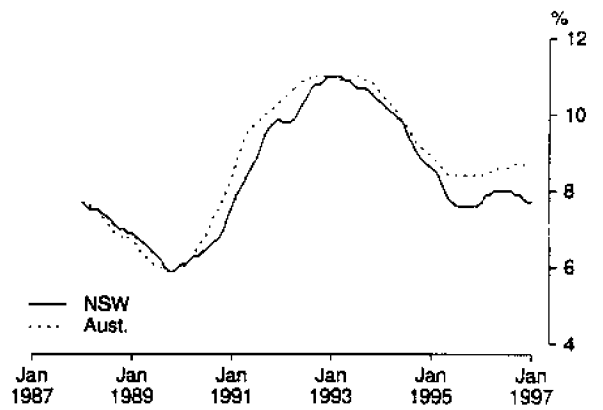

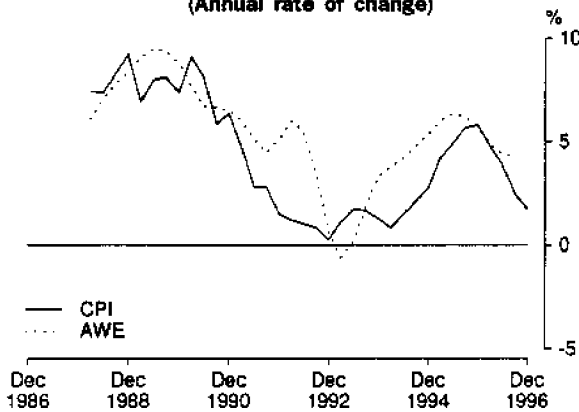
MONTHLY CHANGE IN NUMBER OF PERSONS EMPLOYED (Trend)



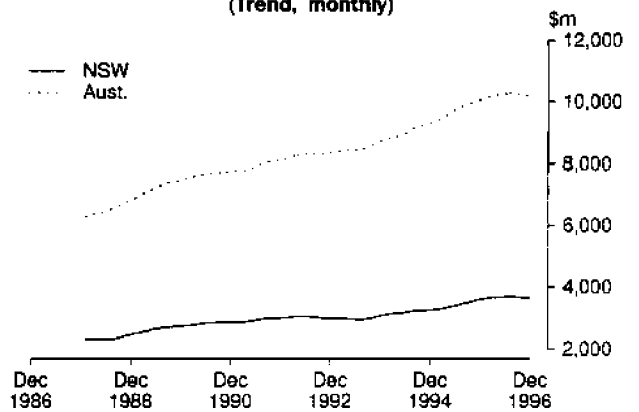
UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (Trend)



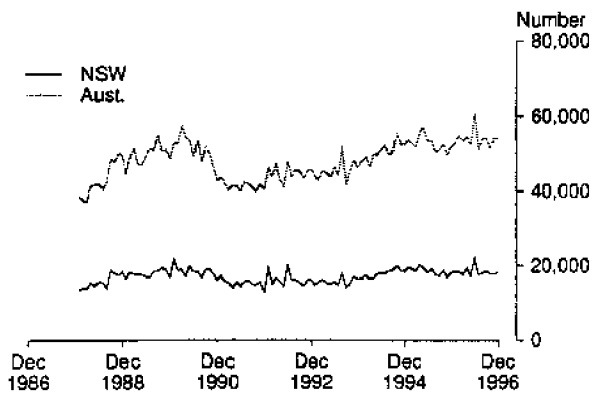
PRICES AND EARNINGS, NSW (Annual rate of change)



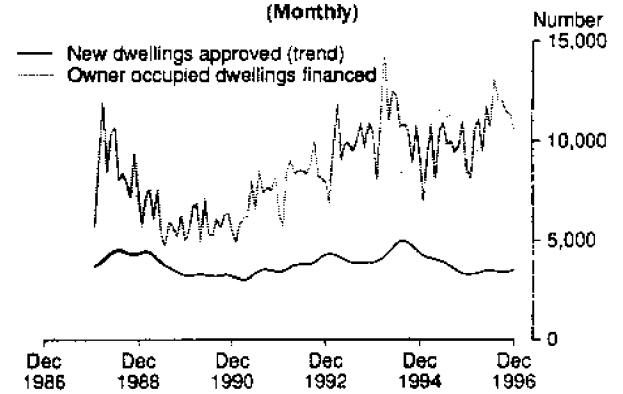
RETAIL TURNOVER (Trend, monthly)



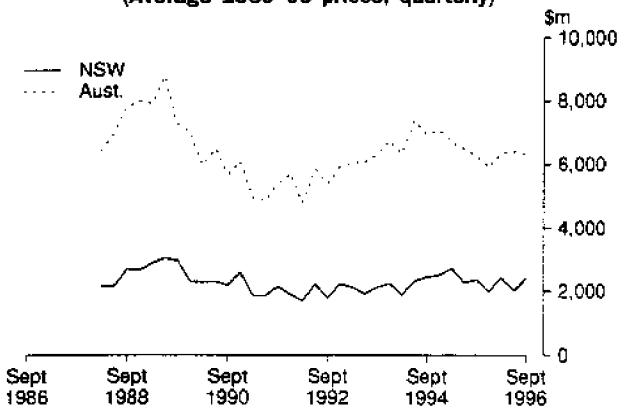
NEW MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED (Monthly)



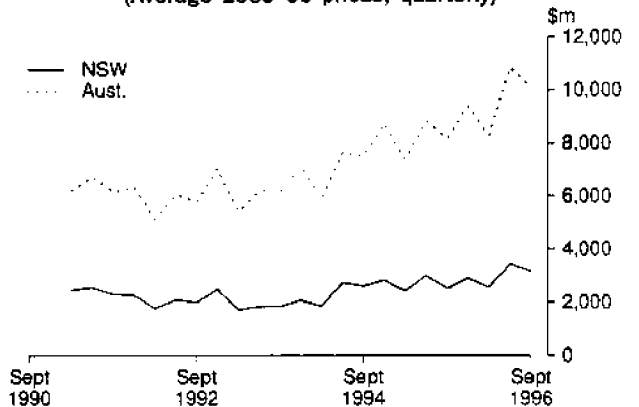
NEW DWELLINGS APPROVED AND HOUSING FINANCE COMMITMENTS, NSW (Monthly)
