

LIVESTOCK PRODUCTS – MEAT, QUEENSLAND, JULY 1994

MAIN FEATURES

- During July 1994, 78,456 tonnes of meat were produced, 14 per cent more than production in June 1994, but 3 per cent less than production in July 1993. Beef production was 88 per cent of all meat produced in July 1994.
- For July 1994, compared with July 1993, production rose for lamb (11 per cent) and pigmeats (4 per cent). Production fell for beef (3 per cent), veal (36 per cent) and mutton (36 per cent) over the same period.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The statistics on slaughterings and meat production for Queensland (Tables 1 to 3) are based on a monthly collection from abattoirs and an annual collection from slaughterhouses. Final figures for slaughterhouses for 1992–93 are included in this publication. From July 1992, an estimate of livestock slaughtered on farms is no longer included. Numbers and weights from July 1992 have been revised accordingly. This change in scope means that figures from July 1992 are not directly comparable to figures prior to July 1992. Figures refer only to livestock slaughtered and passed for human consumption and do not include animals condemned or killed for boiling down.

2. The foreign trade statistics (Tables 4 and 5) have been compiled from information in export entries submitted by exporters or their agents to the Australian Customs Service as required by the Customs Act. Figures have been classified on a State of origin basis and show the export of meat produced in Queensland.
