### Main Features: Western Australia

- The total number of people counted by the census in Western Australia increased by 10.5 per cent from 1981 to 1986, and by 12.8 per cent from 1986 to 1991.
- The median age of males in Western Australia was 30 years, while the median age of females was 31 years. The median age of persons was 31 years.
- There were 41,841 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people counted by the census in Western Australia; 51.2 per cent were aged 19 years or less.
- There were 683,398 people aged 15 years or more in Western Australia who reported a marital status of married (56.3%); there were 355,813 people who reported a marital status of never married (29.3%).
- People aged 5 years or more who spoke a language other than English at home were most likely to speak Italian (42,254), Chinese languages (22,360) or German (9,260). Of those who spoke Italian at home, 14.3 per cent did not speak English well and 2.0 per cent did not speak English at all. Of those who spoke Chinese languages, 17.2 per cent did not speak English well and 4.8 per cent did not speak English at all.
- For Australian born people whose parents were both born in the same overseas country, 44.5 per cent had parents who were both born in the United Kingdom, 20.3 per cent had parents who were both born in Italy, and 6.0 per cent had parents who were both born in Yugoslavia.
- People born overseas, excluding overseas visitors, who arrived prior to 1981 came mainly from the United Kingdom (51.6%), Italy (8.8%) and New Zealand (4.6%). People who arrived in the 1990-1991 period came mainly from the United Kingdom (32.8%), New Zealand (8.1%) and Malaysia (7.3%).
- There were 760,720 people in the labour force in Western Australia, of which 87.6 per cent were employed; 182,647 (27.4%) were employed part-time and 449,567 (67.5%) were employed full-time.
- The median annual individual income in Western Australia was \$13,817. The median annual family income was \$34,328; the median annual household income was \$29,164.
- The median housing loan repayment (monthly) was \$524. The median rent (weekly) was \$95.

### Main Features: Perth Statistical Division (Perth)

- The total number of people counted by the census in Perth increased by 10.6 per cent from 1981 to 1986, and by 15.0 per cent from 1986 to 1991.
- Of the people counted in Perth, 39.1 per cent were aged less than 25 years; 55.1 per cent were aged less than 35 years; and 77.1 per cent were aged less than 50 years.
- Of the 11,736 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people counted in Perth, 53.2 per cent were aged less than 20 years.
- People whose birthplace was not classified as a main English speaking country and who were counted in Perth, were most likely to have been born in Italy (2.1%), Malaysia (1.3%), Yugoslavia (1.0%) or India (0.9%).
- Of people aged 15 years or more with a qualification in Perth, 73,488 had a degree or higher qualification; 55.7 per cent of these were males. Also, there were 44,200 people with undergraduate diplomas; 65.5 per cent of these were females.
- There were 48,934 self-employed people counted in Perth, 10.2 per cent of all employed people. Of these, 11,297 (23.1%) were tradespeople.
- The largest minor occupation groups for employed people were sales assistants (5.4%), and labourers and related workers (5.3%). Clerks were the largest major occupation group of employed people, with 79,515 people counted in Perth; within this major group, the largest minor groups were numerical clerks (3.9% of employed people) and stenographers and typists (3.4% of employed people).
- The largest industry subdivision for employed people was retail trade (14.2%). The largest industry divisions for employed people were wholesale and retail trade (20.3%), community services (19.9%) and finance, property, and business services (12.5%).
- In Perth, 87.0 per cent of one family households lived in separate houses, and 81.9 per cent of separate houses were occupied by one family households.
- The median annual individual income in Perth was \$13,842. The median annual family income was \$35,473; the median annual household income was \$29,650.
- The median housing loan repayment (monthly) was \$543. The median rent (weekly) was \$105.

### About this publication

This publication contains final data from the 1991 Census of Population and Housing. It presents census counts of characteristics of people and dwellings cross-classified by social and demographic characteristics for Western Australia, and for the Statistical Division of Perth.

The tables are grouped into broad categories, such as age, birthplace, and labour force. However, all characteristics are listed separately in the index, along with the corresponding numbers of tables in which they appear.

The tables provided are on a place of enumeration basis, which counts people where they were located on census night, 6 August 1991, which may not be where they usually live.

Census Characteristics is produced for each State, Territory, and Australia.

### Scope and coverage

The 1991 Census of Population and Housing was held on 6 August 1991. The purpose of the census was to count every person who spent census night in Australia. This included people in private dwellings, occupied non-private dwellings, camping out, on vessels in or between Australian ports and on board overnight transport.

People were counted where they were located on census night, which may not have been where they usually live.

Visitors to Australia were counted regardless of how long ago they arrived, or how long they planned to stay.

Australian residents out of the country on census night were excluded.

All private dwellings were counted, whether occupied or unoccupied. Occupied non-private dwellings, such as hospitals, gaols, etc. were also counted.

Diplomatic personnel and their families were excluded from the census, as were diplomatic residences.

### **Data limitations**

The census is subject to a number of errors, although the effect of such errors on overall census results is generally insignificant.

### Underenumeration

Although the census aims to count each person, there are some people who are missed. Underenumeration in the 1991 Census is estimated to be 1.9% for Australia. The data in this publication are not adjusted for underenumeration.

### Data limitations continued

### Respondent error

Because processing procedures cannot detect all errors made by people in completing the census form, some remain in final data.

### **Processing error**

Some processing errors may occur, although stringent quality control measures have been used to minimise them.

### Random adjustment

Random error is added to census data to ensure confidentiality. This means that small cells are randomly adjusted to avoid releasing information about particular individuals, families, households or dwellings. The effect is statistically insignificant and does not impair the usefulness of the tables.

Further information on data quality will be provided in *Census Update* and in the 1991 Census data quality papers.

### 1986 Census data

Similar data from the 1986 Census were published in the series Census 86 - Cross-classifed Characteristics of Persons and Dwellings, State/Australia (2490-8.0).

### Terms and concepts

General descriptions of terms and concepts used in this publication are provided below. Tables are also footnoted where applicable for additional clarity. Detailed definitions are provided in the 1991 Census Dictionary (2901.0).

### **Dwellings**

The census collector recorded each dwelling as either private or non-private.

A private dwelling is normally a house, flat, part of a house, or even a room; but can also be a house attached to, or rooms above, shops or offices; an occupied caravan in a caravan park or on a residential allotment or a boat in a marina; a houseboat; or a tent if it is standing on its own block of land. Private dwellings are either occupied or unoccupied.

Non-private dwellings include occupied motels, gaols, welfare institutions, hospitals, retirement villages, boarding schools etc. Only occupied non-private dwellings were included in the census.

### Terms and concepts continued

### **Employed**

Employed full-time means that the person worked 35 hours or more in the main job held in the week before the census.

Employed part-time means that the person worked less than 35 hours in the main job held in the week before the census.

### **Family**

A census family is a group of related individuals in a household where at least one person is aged 15 years or more. Family tables do not include visitors to the dwelling. Families in non-private dwellings or holidaying away from home on census night are not coded as a family unit.

### Family income

This is the sum of the personal incomes of each resident family member aged 15 years or more. If any of these family members have income *not stated*, or a spouse or offspring is temporarily absent, family income is classified as *partial income stated* in this publication.

Parental income is similar to family income except that only the income of the parent(s) is included. Parental income compares most closely with the family income variable of the 1986 Census.

### Household

A census household is either a person living alone or people who usually reside and eat together. A household resides in a private dwelling. The household type is based on information about relationships about residents present and people temporarily absent. The relationships of visitors to one another or to any resident are not considered. A household can contain up to three families.

### Household income

This is the sum of the personal incomes of each resident household member aged 15 years or more. If any of these residents has an income *not stated*, or a spouse, offspring or co-tenant is temporarily absent, household income is classified as *partial income stated* in this publication.

### Offspring

Dependent offspring are 0 to 14 years of age, or are full-time students aged 15 to 24 years. Unrelated children are classified as dependent children if they usually reside with the family. Other offspring are 15 to 24 years of age and not full-time students, or 25 years of age or more.

In the 1986 Census, 21 to 24 year old full-time students were classified as related adults. As a result, sole parents with adult children were classified as families of related adults; in the 1991 Census, these cases are classified as one parent families.

### Terms and concepts continued

### Temporarily absent

Only spouses, offspring and co-tenants who were listed as temporarily absent on census night are considered when determining household type.

### Geographic areas

The tables in this publication are at State/Territory level and capital city Statistical Division (SD) level.

Statistical divisions (SDs) are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions characterised by identifiable social and economic links between the inhabitants and the economic units in the region, under the unifying influence of one or more major towns or cities. They do not cross State or Territory boundaries.

Capital city SDs are predominantly urban in character and the boundaries are delineated to contain the anticipated urban development of the capital cities (and associated urban centres) for a period of at least twenty years.

The geographic areas used by the census are defined by the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC). Definitions and lists of codes and names of the geographic areas are contained in the publications 1991 Census Geographic Areas (2905.0), 1991 Census Urban Centres/Localities Code List (2909.0) and Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC) (1216.0), edition 2.1.

### **ABS** population estimates

Official ABS population estimates (estimated resident population) are also separately available from the ABS. The estimates are based on census counts that have been adjusted to:

- include people who were in Australia on census night but were missed in the census;
- include Australian residents who were temporarily overseas on census night (these people were not within the scope of the census); and
- exclude overseas visitors counted in the census who are not usual residents of Australia.

The adjusted census count is then updated quarterly using demographic statistics. These are statistics on births, deaths, and overseas and internal migration.

ABS population estimates are published in Australian Demographic Statistics (3101.0), produced quarterly, and in Estimated Resident Population by Sex and Age: States and Territories of Australia (3201.0), produced annually.
