

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EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains results from the 1986 Census of Population and Housing for Christmas Island. It contains 39 tables summarising characteristics of persons, families and dwellings. The data are based on the census count at place of enumeration (i.e. persons are counted where they spent census night, 30 June 1986). Census table numbers in this publication are prefixed with the letter 'C' to denote this. A similar publication is also available for the Cocos (Keeling) Islands.

2. The 1986 Census is the first census of Christmas Island conducted as an integral part of the Australian Census, using almost identical forms, collection and processing procedures. The ABS has assisted, however, with previous censuses of this island since the 1961 Census, which were conducted by the Department of Home Affairs or equivalent.

3. For comparison purposes, statistics from the 1981 Census are included in the tables where appropriate.

4. Further details on individual topics and classifications can be obtained from the relevant information papers (see paragraph 14).

Scope and coverage

5. The 1986 Census of Population and Housing was conducted in Australia, and the external Territories of Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands. It was the aim of the census to count every person who spent census night, 30 June 1986, on Christmas Island, including persons on vessels moored offshore. All dwellings were counted, whether occupied or unoccupied.

Definitions

Census Count - place of Enumeration (C)

6. Persons were counted where they were actually located on census night. Visitors to Christmas Island were included and Christmas Island residents away from the island on census night were excluded. No adjustment is made in this publication for census underenumeration. There is no census count available of persons who usually reside on Christmas Island, but who were counted in Australia or on the Cocos (Keeling) Islands.

Dwellings

7. For the 1986 Census, dwellings in the external Territories are classified into three basic groups: occupied private dwellings, unoccupied private dwellings, and non-private dwellings.

- (a) An *occupied private dwelling* is defined as the premises occupied by a household (see paragraph 8) on census night. A private dwelling is normally a house, flat, part of a house or even a room but can also be a house above shops or offices, a boat, a tent, houseboat, or caravan if standing on its own block of land and not occupied by members of the same household resident in an adjacent dwelling.

Because a structure may contain more than one household, the number of dwellings (households) counted in the census can be greater than the total number of structures in any given area.

- (b) An *unoccupied private dwelling* is a structure built specifically for private living purposes and capable of being lived in, but unoccupied at the time of the census. Vacant houses, holiday homes, huts, cabins (other than seasonal workers' quarters) and houseboats are counted as unoccupied dwellings; but vacant tents, garages and caravans if not on a separate block (and if not normally occupied) are not. Only private dwellings can be classified as unoccupied. Unoccupied dwellings include: dwellings which are vacant for demolition or repair, dwellings to let, and dwellings where all members of the household were absent on census night.

- (c) *Non-private dwellings* (NPDs) are dwellings with accommodation not in the dwelling categories listed above, and are classified according to their function. These dwellings include schools, hotels, motels, guest houses, boarding houses, gaols, religious and charitable institutions, hospitals, nursing homes, defence establishments and other communal dwellings. Usually occupants of such dwellings use communal facilities (such as hotel dining-rooms or mess halls) attached to the particular establishment. Self-contained units provided by commercial enterprises such as hotels, motels, homes for the elderly or guest houses are treated as part of a non-private dwelling, not as separate dwellings. Campers out on census night are also included in the NPD count.

Household

8. For census purposes, a household is either a person living alone or a group of people living together as a single domestic unit with common eating arrangements. It is possible for more than one household to live in one house or structure. For example, a lodger who lives with a family and provides all his/her own food is not a member of the family's household but constitutes a separate household and, therefore, completes a separate household form. The premises occupied by households are classified as private dwellings.

Data quality

9. Statistical collections such as the census are subject to a number of sources of error. While some errors (such as deliberate misreporting) defy detection and correction procedures, the effect of such errors in overall census results is expected to be generally insignificant. Information on data quality for mainland States and Territories will be released from 1989.

Main sources of error in the census are:

- (a) *Underenumeration*. Despite efforts to obtain full coverage of persons and dwellings (other than those associated with overseas diplomatic mis-

sions), some undercounting still occurs. No measure of underenumeration for Christmas Island is available. However, based on a small survey of households undertaken very shortly after the census, undercounting of persons in the 1986 Census was estimated to be 1.9 per cent (on a place of enumeration basis) for Australia as a whole.

- (b) *Partial response.* In those instances where the householder omitted to provide a response to a question, a 'not stated' code was allocated, with the exception of non-response to age, sex, marital status, and SLA of usual residence. These variables were imputed using other information on the census form, and specially constructed random tables. In addition, variables such as birthplace were, in some cases, imputed where the appropriate response was clear from other information on the census form.
- (c) *Respondent error.* Computer editing procedures are used to detect obvious errors made by individuals in completing the form (for example, a six year old person who was married). However, these procedures cannot detect all respondent errors and some remain in final output.
- (d) *Processing error.* Errors created during the processing of the census are kept at an acceptable level by means of a quality control system, which involves sample checking at different stages of the coding and keying operations, and taking corrective action where necessary.
- (e) *Introduced random error.* Adjustments are made to table cells to allow the maximum of detailed census data to be released, while still protecting the confidentiality of information about individual persons. The adjustments made are very small and the general value of the data is not impaired. However, no reliance should be placed on cells with counts of three or less.

The same Act also protects your privacy. It forbids the publication of, or passing to anyone outside the Statistics Bureau, any information or statistics that could identify any person. Under no circumstances are any names or addresses kept.

To help you, below is an easy guide to filling in your Census Form. Use it with your Census 86 booklet.

Who to include on your form.

In question 1, list all persons (INCLUDING VISITORS) who spent the night of Monday, 30 June 1986, in this household. Include any persons who returned on Tuesday, 1 July 1986, without having been counted somewhere else. USE ONE COLUMN FOR EACH PERSON.

If there are more than 8 persons in this household, ask your Census Collector for extra Personal Forms.

What is a Household?

Persons living and eating together as a domestic unit are a household. A person who lives alone is also a household. If there is more than one household at this address, ask your Census Collector for as many extra Household Forms as you need. A SEPARATE FORM MUST BE USED FOR EACH HOUSEHOLD.

How to answer each question.

Please use black or blue ball point pen, or ink.

Read everything carefully. Give your answer, then go to the next question.

Most questions only need a tick in the answer box. Numbers and letters alongside the boxes are only for processing purposes.

If you do not know the exact answer, give the best answer you can.

Your privacy.

If any person in this household prefers a separate Census Form for privacy reasons, ask your Census Collector for a Personal Form and a Privacy Envelope. For that person, enter name, sex, relationship to Person 1 and write "PF" in the age question on this form. The completed Personal Form should be sealed in the envelope and given unopened to the collector.

You may also ask for a Privacy Envelope if you do not want your collector to see your completed Census Form.

Finished?

After filling in the Census Form, please sign it and write the household address in the address panel below.

Your collector will return as soon as possible after Monday, 30 June 1986, for the completed Census Form.

If you have any difficulty filling out this form, please refer to your Census 86 booklet. If you still have a problem, ask your Census Collector for help or phone the Census Hotline on _____.
