PREFACE

Final results from the 1971 Census of Population and Housing are being released in a series of 14 bulletins covering single and cross-classified characteristics of population and dwellings.

It should be recognised that in processing census data for 13 million persons and 4.5 million households there are innumerable possibilities for error. As in other areas of statistics, much of the effort of statisticians is directed to devising procedures which prevent most errors from occurring or which detect and eliminate those which do occur. Despite such efforts, it is impracticable to eliminate every inaccuracy but special steps such as editing and quality control procedures are taken to measure and control the level of such inaccuracy. Thus while some minor errors and discrepancies may be evident in the final results, it is unlikely that they would have any practical significance in the interpretation of the Census data.

A large number of tabulations are being produced for the 1971 Census which, because of their size and complexity, will not be published. In some cases, classifications of characteristics will be available at a finer level than those published in the Bulletins. A complete list of the tabulations produced (published and unpublished) and the levels of classification available will be published in the Catalogue of 1971 Census Tabulations (Bulletin 14). For information on the more detailed classifications and the availability of unpublished tabulations please contact the office of the Bureau of Census and Statistics in each State capital city or in Canberra.

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INTRODUCTION

Publications

The publication programme for the 1971 Census of Population and Housing comprises a series of 14 Bulletins; the title and content of each are as follows :

Bulletin 1. *Summary of Population*

Single characteristics : age, marital status, birthplace, period of residence, nationality, usual major activity, 1966 residence, religion, level of schooling, educational institution, qualifications, occupational status, occupation, industry.

Bulletin 2. *Summary of Dwellings*

Class of dwelling cross-classified by : number of rooms, number of bedrooms, nature of occupancy, electricity and gas, bathroom and kitchen facilities, sewage disposal, inmates by number of rooms, inmates by number of bedrooms.

Bulletin 3. *Demographic Characteristics*

Age and marital status cross-classified by : usual major activity, employment status, birthplace of parents, birthplace, nationality.

Bulletin 4. *Birthplace*

Country of birth cross-classified by : age, marital status, nationality, period of residence, level of schooling, qualifications, occupational status, occupation, industry.

Bulletin 5. *The Labour Force*

Employment status cross-classified by age and marital status. Occupation cross-classified by : occupational status, age, birthplace, qualifications. Industry cross-classified by : occupational status, age, birthplace, qualifications.

Bulletin 6. *Population and Dwelling in Local Government Areas and Urban Centres*

Bulletin 7. *Characteristics of the Population and Dwellings – Local Government Areas*

Single characteristics : age, religion, marital status, nationality, birthplace, period of residence, 1966 residence, usual residence, usual major activity, level of schooling, qualifications, occupational status, industry, occupation, class of dwelling, rent, reason unoccupied, number of rooms and bedrooms, nature of occupancy, facilities, sewage disposal, motor vehicles, material of outer walls.

Bulletin 8. *Characteristics of the Population and Dwellings – Commonwealth Electoral Divisions*

The topics in this Bulletin are identical to those in Bulletin 7.

Index of all tabulations, published and unpublished, produced from the 1971 Census.

Bulletins 1-6 consist of a series of separate parts for each State and Territory and one for Australia. In Bulletin 6 the Northern Territory part is combined with that of the Australian Capital Territory. There is no Australian part to Bulletin 7 and Bulletins 8-14 consist only of one part.

Coverage

In conformity with the 1967 repeal of Section 127 of the Constitution, 1971 Census statistics include Aborigines. In order to provide comparability between the 1971 and 1966 Censuses, tables showing 1966 data have been amended to include Aborigines or their dwellings and therefore differ from the 1966 tables previously published.

Persons with diplomatic immunity (diplomatic and home-based staff of diplomatic missions, and their families) are excluded from the Census. Dwellings occupied by persons with diplomatic immunity are also excluded.

(NOTE. Any discrepancies between totals and sums of components in percentages in tables are due to rounding.)

Any Census Officer or occupier of a dwelling who furnishes false information in a Census Form is liable to a penalty of \$100.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

GENERAL

(a) Intercensal comparability

The data collected for persons of Aboriginal descent at the 1971 Census is not strictly comparable with 1966 Census data on the Aboriginal population because of a change to the question on race used at the 1971 Census.

At censuses prior to the 1966 Census, the instructions relating to race were insufficient to enable respondents to classify themselves according to the degree of racial mixture. From 1933 to 1961 persons were asked the following question :

'For persons of European Race, wherever born, write "European". For non-Europeans state the race to which they belong, for example, "Aboriginal", "Chinese", "Negro", "Afghan", etc. If the person is half-caste with one parent of European race, write also "H.C.", for example "H. C. Aboriginal", "H. C. Chinese", etc.'

At the 1966 Census the instructions were re-designed as follows in an endeavour to obtain more precise data on racial mixture and also to avoid the opprobrium attaching to the term 'half-caste' :

'State each person's race. For persons of European race, wherever born, write "European". Otherwise state whether Aboriginal, Chinese, Indian, Japanese, etc., as the case may be. If of more than one race, give particulars, for example, $\frac{1}{2}$ European - $\frac{1}{2}$ Aboriginal, $\frac{3}{4}$ Aboriginal - $\frac{1}{4}$ Chinese, $\frac{1}{2}$ European - $\frac{1}{2}$ Chinese'.

It was concluded, following investigations into the validity of the 1966 Census data on race, that :

- (i) reporting by Aborigines was insufficiently precise to differentiate persons who were 50 per cent Aboriginal from those who were more than 50 per cent Aboriginal;
- (ii) information on 'Aborigines' obtained at censuses prior to 1966 was similarly imprecise;
- (iii) the total of all persons who were 50 per cent or more Aboriginal may have been defective because of the inclusion of persons who were less than 50 per cent Aboriginal but described themselves simply as 'Aboriginal' and the exclusion of persons who were 50 per cent Aboriginal but stated their race as 'European'.

With the repeal in 1967 of Section 127 of the Constitution it was no longer necessary, for the constitutional purposes of reckoning the Australian population, to identify 'Aborigines' - defined for this purpose as persons of greater than half Aboriginal descent. However, for general interest and, in particular, to meet the statistical requirements of Commonwealth and State authorities responsible for Aboriginal affairs, it was decided in the 1971 Census that an attempt should be made to ascertain the race with which a person identifies himself.

The question on race (*see* Question 5, page xii of Schedule) was accordingly re-designed for the 1971 Census. The instruction in brackets makes it clear that mixed-race persons are to choose the race to which they consider themselves to belong.

The published 1966 Census figures in this bulletin relate to those persons who described themselves as being 50 per cent or more Aboriginal or simply 'Aboriginal'. Not included in published 1966 Census figures are some 16,425 persons who described themselves as being of less than 50 per cent Aboriginal descent. It is not known what proportion of such persons at the 1971 Census stated their race to be 'Aboriginal'.

The figures shown in Table 1 appear to show a marked increase in the number of people identifying themselves as Aboriginal, particularly in urban areas. The apparent movement between urban and rural distributions of the Aboriginal population probably represents both a change in response and an actual population movement. Similar caution should be observed in examining Table 35, which shows 1966 and 1971 Census figures for the Torres Strait Islander population.

(b) Coverage of the tables in this bulletin

In the tables, the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander populations are shown separately. Aborigines and Torres Strait Islanders enumerated in Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory have not been separately identified in the detailed tables but are included in the Australia totals. The summary table below shows the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander populations in all States and Territories. It is suspected that the figure of 96 Torres Strait Islanders in Tasmania may be overstated by the incorrect reporting of people of Bass Strait Island descent.

Enquiries concerning a dissection by State or Territory of those tables showing Australia totals only should be referred to the Bureau of Census and Statistics in each State capital or in Canberra.

GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION

'Major urban' denotes all urban centres with a population of 100,000 or more. The population and dwellings in all other urban centres below this size are included under 'other urban'. The balance of the State or Territory other than migratory is classified as rural.

The people who on census night were enumerated travelling on board ships in Australian waters or between two Australian ports, or who were on long distance trains, buses or aircraft, were classified as migratory.

Table 42 in this bulletin shows the Aboriginal population by Local Government Area and Statistical Divisions. Although the number of Aborigines in all Local Government Areas is available on request from the Bureau of Census and Statistics, only those Local Government Areas with 20 or more Aborigines are listed in Table 42. Copies of maps showing Local Government Area and Statistical Division boundaries are available individually or can be obtained in Bulletin 13 – Maps.

THE HOUSEHOLDER'S SCHEDULE

The Householder's Schedule used for the 1971 Census of Population and Housing represents a major departure in design from that used at the 1966 and earlier Censuses. The single large sheet used previously, with provision for a maximum of 8 persons, was replaced by a booklet-type schedule with extensive use of the tick-box type question. In this schedule (a facsimile of which appears on pages ix to xii), the first page (page 1) provided for a list of persons in the dwelling, pages 2 and 3 contained questions relating to the dwelling, while the remaining 16 pages provided for two pages of questions to be completed in respect of each person listed on page 1.

The ordering of the questions was designed to minimise the number of questions to be answered by any one person. For persons under 5 years of age a maximum of 12 questions required an answer and 15 questions applied to those under 15 years of age. Males were not required to answer questions on issue and duration of marriage (Question 11) and only employed persons completed details of hours worked, occupational status, industry and occupation (Questions 15-18).

In the following notes on the individual topics appearing in this bulletin, reference to the specific question in the Householder's Schedule appears in parentheses. All comments relating to the Aboriginal Population apply also to the Torres Strait Islander population.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

Age (Column 4, page 1 of Schedule)

At the Census, in cases where age was not given, an age was allocated by first establishing the minimum age range within which the correct age most probably lay (as indicated by answers to other questions on the Schedule) and then by selecting an age within that range, from a table of random ages based on the age distribution of the Aboriginal population at the 1966 Census.

Marital status (Column 5, page 1 of Schedule)

It will be seen from the wording of the question that the status referred to is that at the time of enumeration regardless of any previous status.

In the very small proportion of cases where the question on marital status was not answered a status was allocated as follows :

Males under 18 years and females under 17 years were allocated to 'never married' unless there was definite evidence to the contrary in other answers on the Schedule. All persons aged less than 15 years were classified as 'never married'. For other persons 'never married' was imputed if Questions 10 and 11 were not answered, 'widowed' if 10(b) was answered, and 'now married' if the answer was 'yes' to the question 'Is this person at present married?' in Question 11(a). Otherwise a marital status was selected from a random list according to age, compiled from 1966 Census data on the distribution of the Aboriginal population by age and marital status.

Religion (Question 7, page 4 of Schedule)

Section 21 of the *Census and Statistics Act 1905-1966* provides that 'No person shall be liable to a penalty for omitting or refusing to state the religious denomination or sect to which he belongs or adheres' which accounts for the rather high incidence of 'not stated'. In 1971, at the request of a number of users, the instruction 'if no religion write "none"' was added to the question. The result has been a significant rise in the 'no religion' category compared to previous censuses and a fall in the 'not stated' category.

Schooling (Question 8, page 4 of Schedule)

At the 1966 Census persons were asked to state the highest level of schooling *completed*. For the 1971 Census the question was redesigned to obtain a measure of the highest level *attended*.

Persons no longer at school were requested to mark the grade in the current local system corresponding to the highest grade which they had attended.

Education systems differ between the Australian States and the question on schooling was varied appropriately in Schedules used in different States.

The following table was used to assign grades (or forms) in each State or Territory to an approximately comparable level.

The category 'Child not yet attending school' includes children aged 0-4 years and a small number of 5 and 6 year olds who had not commenced schooling. Persons aged 5-15 years who failed to answer the question were allocated a level based on the modal level for that age in each State using the most currently available information on the distribution of the school population by age and level.

Qualifications (Question 13, page 5 of Schedule)

For the 1971 Census the qualifications have been classified to five major levels and specific fields within each level. The levels have been determined as follows :

Trade : formal recognition of competency in a skilled manual occupation which is usually obtained through an apprenticeship and satisfactory progress in part-time studies concurrently with practical training (e.g. plumber, fitter, compositor, carpenter, hairdresser).

Technician : a level which requires theoretical knowledge, as well as practical skills, e.g. wool classing or nursing certificates issued by technical colleges following periods of 4 or 5 years part-time study after passing intermediate or final secondary school examinations are classified as 'technician'.

Tertiary (Other than university degree) : a level relating to qualifications obtained following substantial advanced study beyond matriculation conferred by institutions and professional associations, e.g. Associate of Australian Society of Accountants, Diploma in Business Studies, Teaching Certificate, Diploma of Engineering.

Bachelor degree : usually conferred by a university following a period of at least 3 years full-time study or equivalent part-time study and includes post-graduate diplomas.

Higher degree : conferred by a university in recognition of substantial studies beyond the Bachelor level.

Some qualifications could not be classified to any of the above levels. Most of these relate to short specialised courses in such fields as typewriting and shorthand, farm book-keeping, dressmaking, automotive maintenance.

Persons who were qualified and studying for a qualification are shown in Table 8 according to the qualification held. All persons studying for a higher degree appear in the table as qualified at the Bachelor degree level.

Usual major activity (Question 2, page 4 of Schedule)

The classification of a persons stated *usual* major activity is distinct from the labour force classification. The labour force classification is based on statements about a person's actual activity during the specific week prior to the Census. Thus the number of people with the activity 'Working in a job' represents those people who *usually* do so and is therefore unlikely to agree with the number of people classified as 'in the labour force'.

The labour force and occupational status (Questions 14 and 16, page 5 of Schedule)

The term 'labour force' is used throughout 1971 Census publications in place of 'work force' in conformity with the Bureau's quarterly population survey and with international usage.

The labour force is defined as those persons 15 years of age and over who answered 'yes' to any of the four parts of Question 14. Thus the labour force comprises those persons who worked, those who had a job from which they were temporarily absent, those who were temporarily laid off without pay for the whole of the reference week *and* those who did not work, did not have a job and were actively looking for work.

Persons helping but not receiving wages or salary who usually worked less than 15 hours a week are excluded from the labour force. Bonded trainees (including trainee teachers) and cadets engaged in full-time study at educational institutions are also excluded, even though such insitutions were conducted by their employer.

The unemployed members of the labour force are those persons who answered 'No' to Questions 14(a) and 14(b) and 'Yes' to Question 14(d) AND those who answered 'Yes' to Question 14(a), 'No' to Question 14(b) and 'Yes' to Question 14(c). Thus the unemployed consist of those persons who did no work during the reference week *and* either looked for work (having no job) or were temporarily laid off from a job.

The approach adopted in the 1971 Census for determining the labour force conforms closely to the recommendations of the Eighth International Conference of Labour Statisticians held in Geneva in 1954 and to the approach used at the 1966 Census.

According to the definition any labour force activity during the previous week, however little, results in the person being counted in the labour force.

Thus many persons whose main activity is not a labour force one (e.g. housewife, full-time student) are drawn into the labour force by virtue of part-time or occasional labour force activity in the previous week. Answers to Question 2 on the Schedule indicate that there were substantially more of such persons at the Census of 1971 than at the Census of 1966 and that they were predominantly females.

On the other hand, the definition excludes persons who may frequently or usually participate in the labour force but who in the previous week happened to have withdrawn from the labour force. Answers to Question 2 on the Schedule indicate that there were substantially more of such persons at the Census of 1971 than at the Census of 1966, especially among males.

A similar definition of the labour force is used in the quarterly population sample survey conducted by the Bureau by the method of personal interview. This survey is used to measure changes in the labour force from quarter to quarter in the intercensal period.

Evidence from post-enumeration surveys and pilot tests indicates that the personal interview approach tends to identify a large number of persons as in the labour force than does the filling in of the census questions on the Schedule by the householder and that this tendency has increased between the 1966 and 1971 Censuses.

The above considerations should be borne in mind if comparisons of the total labour force or labour force participation rates are made between the 1966 and 1971 Censuses, or between the 1971 Census and the 1971 labour force quarterly estimates.

The relationship between the terms 'occupational status', 'employment status' and 'labour force status' as used in 1971 Census publications is illustrated by the following classifications :

Occupation (Question 18, page 5 of Schedule)

Occupation is defined as the type of work performed by an employed person and should not be confused with the type of productive activity, business or service carried out by the establishment in which a person works, e.g. a carpenter employed by a steel-making establishment would have the occupation of 'carpenter' and industry 'steel manufacture'; an electrician working at an oil refinery would have the occupation of 'electrician' but his industry would be that of 'oil refining' (see Industry).

In accordance with the International Standard Classification of Occupations the structure of the Australian classification used for the 1971 and previous censuses is based primarily on the nature of the work done. The 1971 classification was prepared from the International Standard Classification of Occupations 1958 (revised 1966). The changes in the revised classification were given careful consideration in the preparation of the 1971 Australian classification. A number of new entries have been created to maintain convertibility to the international classification and others created to give more precise codes in certain occupation groups.

Industry (Question 17, page 5 of Schedule)

Industry is defined as the branch of productive activity, business or service carried out by the establishment in which a person is employed.

For the 1971 Census the classification of industry was based on the Preliminary Edition of the Australian Standard Industrial Classification (ASIC).

Because of space considerations some of the full industry titles of the ASIC have had to be abbreviated for inclusion in this publication. The table overleaf sets out the corresponding ASIC codes for each of the industry titles used in this publication so that reference to the ASIC document itself (*Australian Standard Industrial Classification, Preliminary Edition 1969, Volume 1*), and to other statistics classified according to ASIC, will be facilitated.

For the purposes of the population census an 'undefined' category was added, where appropriate, to individual Divisions, Subdivisions and Groups of the classification to facilitate the coding of imprecise or generalised descriptions of industrial activities on the census schedules.

At the 1966 and previous Censuses, industry was determined from the respondent's own stated description of the 'kind of industry, business or service' in which he worked. With the adoption of ASIC for the 1971 Census comparability with previous censuses is greatly impaired, not only because of changes in the classification itself but also because in 1971 the industry coding in general was not determined from the stated description. Instead the name and address of the establishment at which the respondent worked (Question 17(a), (b), (c)) in general provided the industry code for employees of that establishment. However, in a number of cases, due to deficient replies concerning name and address of employer or because the establishment had not been pre-coded for industry, recourse still had to be made in coding to the respondent's own description (Question 17(d)) of the industry in which he worked.

Class of dwelling (as a personal characteristic; *See also* notes on dwelling characteristics). (Question D, page 2 of Schedule)

Table 13 includes the total Aboriginal population classified by the class of dwelling at which they were enumerated, irrespective of whether the dwelling was an 'Aboriginal dwelling' (see below).

CHARACTERISTICS OF DWELLING

Definition of dwelling

An occupied dwelling is defined as any habitation occupied on Census night by a household group and may comprise the whole or only a part of a building. A household group is a person or group of persons living and eating together. The number of occupied dwellings and the number of households are therefore identical.

Non-private dwellings are those dwellings which provide group accommodation such as hotels, motels, hostels, and staff quarters and institutions such as hospitals, nursing homes, prisons, boarding schools, etc., and which were occupied on Census night. For such dwellings no details of the characteristics other than class of dwelling were sought.

Persons who on Census night were camping out, travelling on board ships in Australian waters or between two Australian ports, or who were enumerated on long distance trains, buses or aircraft were not regarded as living in a dwelling for census purposes and are shown under 'not in dwelling' in Table 15. Persons classified as campers out include those living *temporarily* in tents, caravans or houseboats or who were camped out on Census night. Tents, huts, caravans and houseboats which were being used to provide *permanent* or *semipermanent* accommodation were classified as dwellings.

Definition of an Aboriginal Dwelling

An 'Aboriginal dwelling' has been defined as one where the head of the household is an Aborigine and does not represent all dwellings at which Aborigines were enumerated. Further, all persons in 'Aboriginal' dwellings are not necessarily Aborigines.

Class of dwelling (Question D1, page 2 of Schedule)

For the 1971 Census the question on the Schedule was expanded by means of illustrations and descriptions to assist householders in assigning their dwelling to an appropriate dwelling type.

'Private house' comprised dwelling types 1 to 4 on the Schedule.

'Self-contained flat' is dwelling type 6.

'Improvised dwelling' is dwelling type 8.

'other private dwelling' includes dwelling types 5, 7 and 9.

In cases where the question was not answered, a class was allocated on the basis of other information on the Schedule and answers for adjacent dwellings.

Number of rooms (Question D4, page 3 of Schedule)

For census purposes 'rooms' exclude bathrooms, toilets, pantries, laundries, storerooms, halls and rooms used only for business purposes, but include permanently enclosed sleep-outs. Combined purpose rooms such as a living-dining room were treated as one room.

When no answer had been given to this question a number was allocated on the basis of the answer given for the geographically nearest dwelling of the same class, except in the case of improvised homes, caravans, houseboats, etc. when a number was allocated from a table of random numbers based on the distribution of the number of rooms, recorded in those types of dwelling at the 1966 Census.

Number of bedrooms (Question D5, page 3 of Schedule)**Material of outer walls (Question D3, page 3 of Schedule)**

Cases where no answer was given were allocated a material based on the answer given for the geographically nearest dwelling of the same class.
