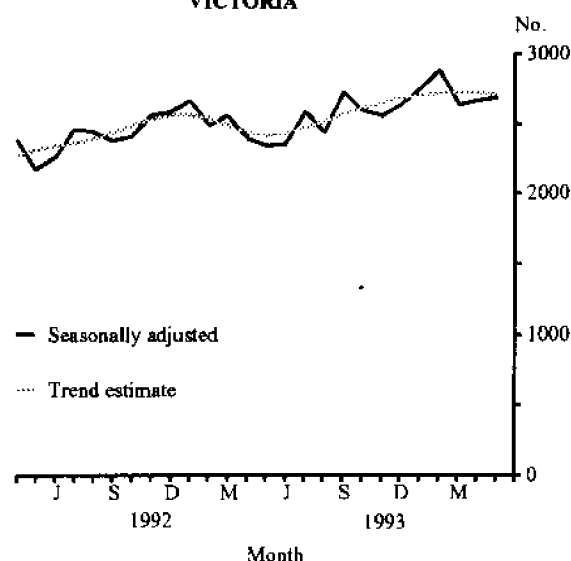

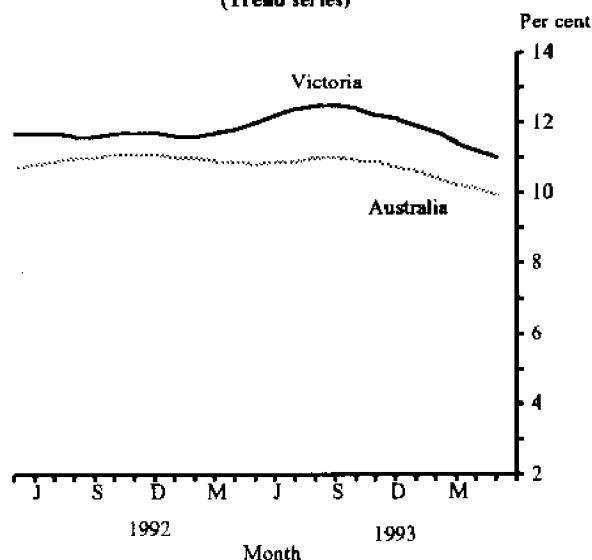

**New dwelling units approved**

The trend estimate of the number of new dwelling units approved in Victoria decreased by 0.4 per cent in May 1994 following a decrease of 0.1 per cent in April 1994. Apart from the slight decreases in April and May 1994 the trend estimate had been increasing on a monthly consecutive basis since May 1993.

The number of new dwelling units approved (trend) in May 1994 in Victoria was 12.0 per cent higher than in May 1993.

**Unemployment rate**

The trend estimate of the unemployment rate for Victoria decreased to 11.0 per cent in May 1994 from 11.2 per cent in April 1994. This was the eighth monthly consecutive decrease since September 1993.

At the national level the unemployment rate (trend) decreased by 0.2 percentage points to 9.9 per cent in May 1994 following monthly consecutive decreases since September 1993.

**Readers are reminded that trend estimates are subject to revision as subsequent months data become available.**

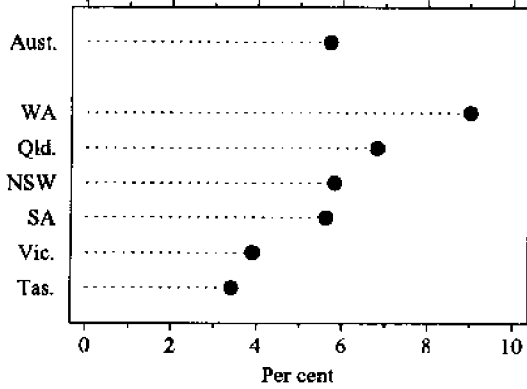

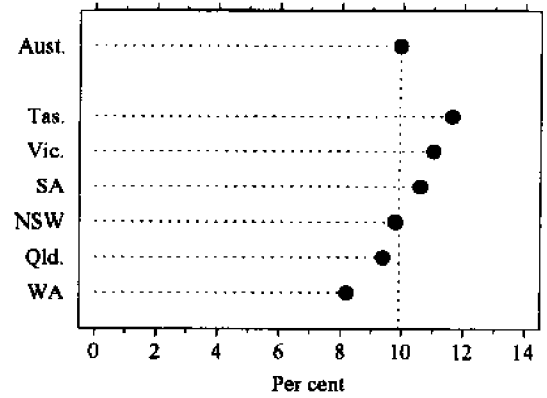

VICTORIA IN RELATION TO OTHER STATES AND AUSTRALIA

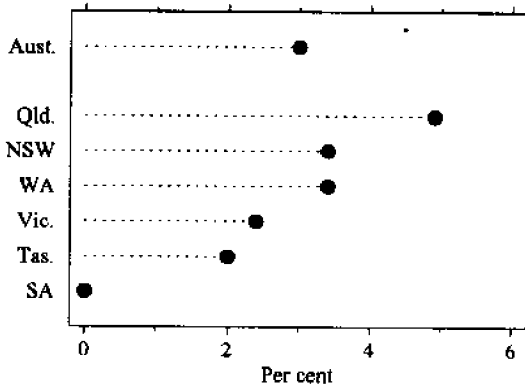
**RETAIL TURNOVER**

April 1994



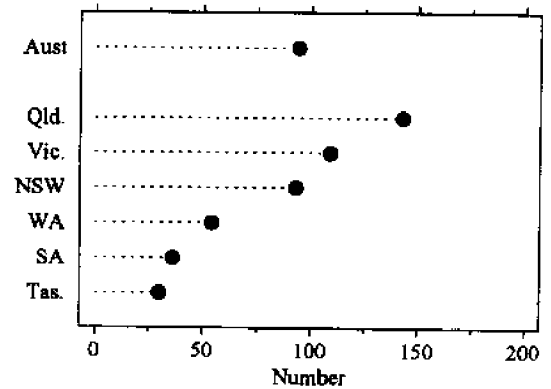
**UNEMPLOYMENT RATE**

May 1994



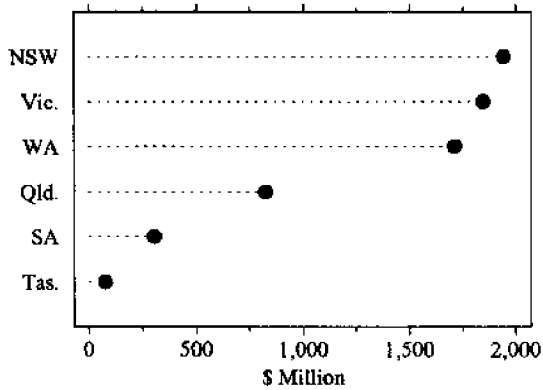
**EMPLOYED PERSONS**

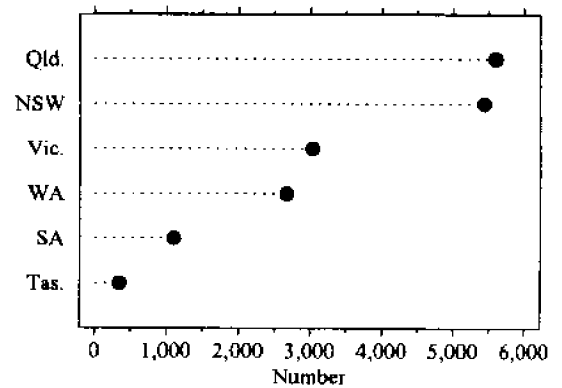

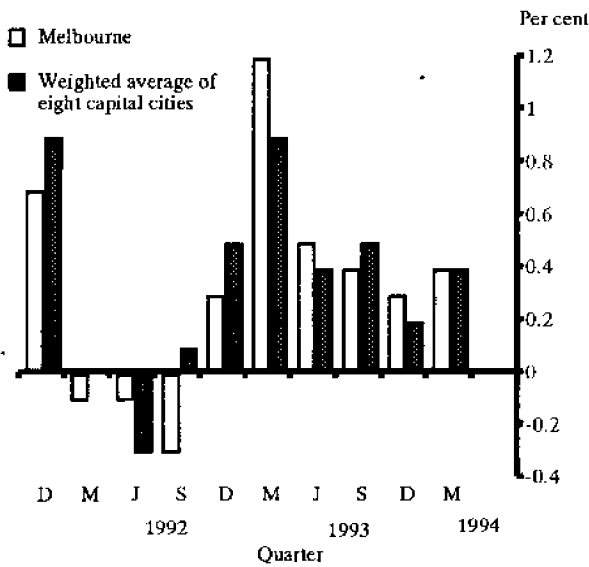
**ACTUAL PRIVATE NEW CAPITAL EXPENDITURE, VICTORIA**  
(Original series)



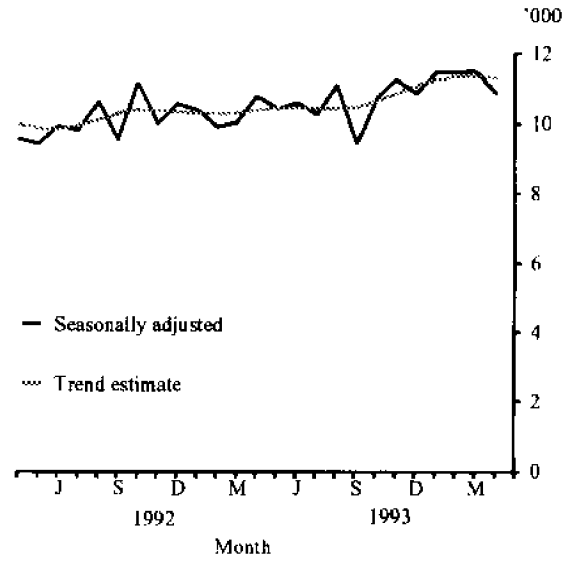
**SECURED HOUSING FINANCE COMMITMENTS TO INDIVIDUALS, VICTORIA**  
(Original series)



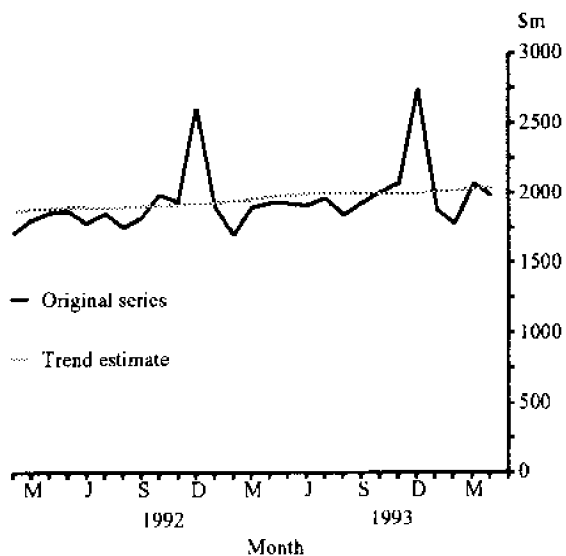
**CONSUMER PRICE INDEX: ALL GROUPS**  
Percentage change from previous quarter



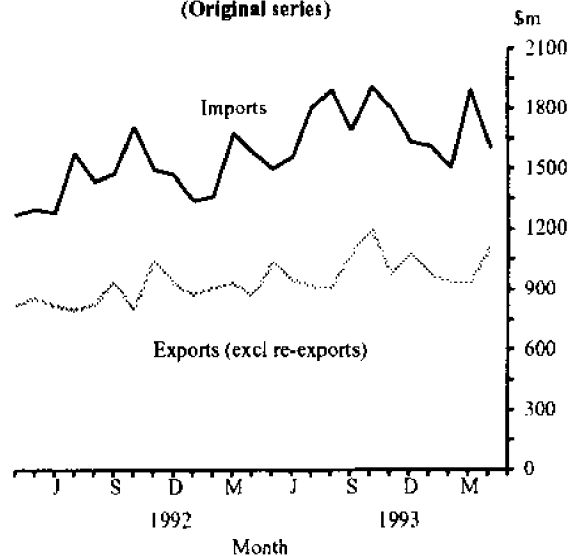
**NEW MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED, VICTORIA**
