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EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains estimates of the civilian labour force for the period August 1966 to December 1978. The estimates have been derived from the population survey which, until February 1978, was conducted in February, May, August and November each year. Since that date the survey has been conducted monthly.

- 2. Survey estimates for February 1978 and subsequent months have been obtained by using a new sample and revised questionnaire and are based on revised population estimates derived from the 1976 population census. In order to provide a series for earlier periods as comparable as possible with the February 1978 and later estimates, the estimates from August 1966 to November 1977 have been revised.
- 3. Although emphasis in the survey is placed on the regular collection of data on demographic and labour force characteristics of the population (i.e. through the labour force survey), supplementary surveys of particular aspects of the labour force or of other subjects are carried out from time to time. Statistics from supplementary surveys are issued in publications which are available free on request. A list of titles is given on page 87.

The population survey

The survey is currently based on a multi-stage area sample of private dwellings (about 30,000 houses, flats, etc.) and non-private dwellings (hotels, motels, etc.), and covers about two-thirds of one per cent of the population of Australia. The information is obtained from the occupants of selected dwellings by carefully chosen and specially trained interviewers, the interviews for monthly surveys generally being conducted during the two weeks beginning on the Monday between the 6th and 12th of each month. The information obtained relates to the week before the interview (i.e. the survey week). Because of operational problems arising from the Christmas and New Year holidays, the December 1978 survey commenced a week earlier than usual (i.e. on 4 December), but most interviews were conducted during the following week. Before February 1978 the interviews were spread over four weeks, chosen so that the survey weeks generally fell within the limits of the calendar month. For further details on the population survey see the Technical Note on page 81.

Scope

- 5. The survey includes all persons aged fifteen years and over except:
 - (a) members of the permanent defence forces
 - (b) certain diplomatic personnel of overseas governments, customarily excluded from census and estimated populations
 - (c) overseas visitors holidaying in Australia, and

 (d) members of non-Australian defence forces (and their dependants) stationed in Australia.

Definitions

- 6. The labour force category to which a person is assigned depends on his actual activity (i.e. whether working, looking for work, etc.) during the survey week. The following definitions relate only to those persons within the scope of the survey. Although the wording of these definitions of employed persons and unemployed persons is different to that adopted for the surveys conducted before February 1978, the changes were made mainly for clarity; they do not signify any change of substance in the definitions, which conform to the international standard definitions specified by the International Labour Organisation.
- 7. Employed persons comprise all those aged fifteen years and over, who during the survey week:
 - (a) worked for one hour or more for pay, profit, commission or payment in kind in a job or business, or on a farm (including employees, employers and self-employed persons); or
 - (b) worked for fifteen hours or more without pay in a family business or on a farm (i.e. unpaid family helper); or
 - (c) were employees who had a job but were not at work and were: on paid leave; on leave without pay for less than four weeks up to the end of the survey week; stood down without pay because of bad weather or plant breakdown at their place of employment for less than four weeks up to the end of the survey week; on strike or locked out; on workers' compensation and expected to be returning to their job; or receiving wages or salary while undertaking full-time study; or
 - (d) were employers or self-employed persons who had a job, business or farm, but were not at work.
- 8. The *employment/population ratio* for any group is the number of employed persons expressed as a percentage of the civilian population aged fifteen years and over in the same group.
- 9. Unemployed persons are those aged fifteen years and over who were not employed during the survey week, and
 - (a) had actively looked for full-time or part-time work at any time in the four weeks up to the end of the survey week and:
 - (i) were available for work in the survey week, or would have been available except for temporary illness (i.e. lasting for less than four weeks to the end of the survey week);

- or (ii) were waiting to start a new job within four weeks from the end of the survey week and would have started in the survey week if the job had been available then;
- or (b) were waiting to be called back to a full-time or part-time job from which they had been stood down without pay for less than four weeks up to the end of the survey week (including the whole of that week) for reasons other than bad weather or plant breakdown.
- 10. Unemployed persons looking for first job are those who had never worked for two weeks or more in a full-time job. Prior to November 1977 they comprise unemployed persons who had never had a job.
- 11. The unemployment rate for any group is the number unemployed expressed as a percentage of the labour force (i.e. employed plus unemployed) in the same group.
- 12. Duration of unemployment is the period from the time the person began looking for work or was laid off to the end of the survey week. Periods of unemployment are recorded in complete weeks and this results in a slight understatement of duration.
- 13. Unemployed persons classified by industry and occupation. Prior to November 1977, unemployed persons were classified according to the industry of their last full-time or part-time job (if they had had one). Since then, classification by industry and occupation has been restricted to their last full-time job lasting two weeks or more in the two years before the survey.
- 14. The *labour force* comprises all persons who, during the survey week, were employed or unemployed, as defined in paragraphs 7 and 9.
- 15. The labour force participation rate for any group is the labour force expressed as a percentage of the civilian population aged fifteen years and over in the same group. Because it is not practicable to ascertain the birthplace of persons in institutions (who are classified as not in the labour force), labour force participation rates for persons classified by birthplace are calculated by using population estimates which exclude those in institutions.
- 16. Full-time workers are those who usually work 35 hours a week or more and others who, although usually part-time workers, worked 35 hours or more during the survey week. Part-time workers are those who usually work less than 35 hours a week and who did so during the survey week. When recording hours of work, fractions of an hour are disregarded. There are discontinuities in statistics for these categories between August and November 1969 due to a change in the classification of teachers, who worked the full school week, from part-time to full-time workers.
- 17. Hours of work. The figures of aggregate hours and of average hours refer to actual hours worked during the survey week, not hours paid for. The figures may be

- affected by public holidays, leave, absenteeism; temporary absence from work due to sickness, injury, accident and industrial disputes; and stoppages of work due to bad weather, plant breakdown, etc. When hours of work are recorded fractions of an hour are disregarded and this results in slightly lower figures than would be the case if actual time worked was recorded. Persons stood down for the whole of the survey week without pay because of bad weather or plant breakdown at their place of employment are regarded as employed and therefore are included (working no hours) in the calculation of average hours worked. Persons stood down in the survey week for reasons other than bad weather and plant breakdown and waiting to be called back to their job are regarded as unemployed and are therefore excluded from the calculation. There is discontinuity in aggregate and average hours worked by full-time and part-time workers between August and November 1969 due to a reclassification of some school teachers. See paragraph 16.
- 18. Persons not in the labour force are those who, during the survey week, were not in the categories 'employed' or 'unemployed'. This category includes persons who were keeping house (unpaid), attending an educational institution (school, university, etc.), retired, voluntarily inactive, permanently unable to work, inmates of institutions, trainee teachers, members of contemplative religious orders, and persons who during the survey week undertook only jury service or unpaid voluntary work for a charitable organisation, provided they had not actively looked for work in the four weeks up to the end of the survey week, and
 - (a) in the survey week:
 - (i) were without a job, business or farm; or
 - (ii) had worked for less than our hour for pay, profit, commission or payment in kind; or
 - (iii) had worked for less than fifteen hours without pay in a family business or farm;
- or (b) had been stood down without pay for four weeks or more up to the end of the survey week.
- 19. Marital status. Persons in the civilian population aged 15 years and over are classified as married or not married (other). The latter category includes persons who had never married or who were widowed, divorced or separated.

Classification of industry and occupation

20. Industry is classified according to the Australian Standard Industrial Classification (ASIC) 1969 edition except for average hours of work by industry for August 1966 to August 1970 shown in Table 27 which are based on the Classification of Industries, June 1966. Occupation is classified according to the Classification and Classified List of Occupations, Revised June 1976.

Population benchmarks

21. The labour force survey estimates are

calculated in such a way as to conform to the independently estimated distribution of the population by age and sex. When first calculated, these independent estimates (benchmarks) are necessarily derived from incomplete information about population changes (deaths, internal and overseas migration) and can differ from estimates of the population subsequently published by the ABS. When major revisions are made to population estimates, consequential revisions are made to the benchmarks. (See paragraph 23.) For estimates of the population and other demographic statistics, reference should be made to the quarterly publication Population and Vital Statistics (3212.0).

Revision of series

- 22. Information concerning the methods used in revising the estimates from August 1966 (to provide series as comparable as possible with those for the period from February 1978) is given in the following paragraphs.
- 23. Revised population estimates. Survey estimates are not revised for the usually small amendments to population benchmarks arising from new data on deaths and migration. (See paragraph 21.) Revisions are made, however, after each census and when the basis of population estimation is reviewed. Therefore, when the population estimates were revised to take account of the results of the 1966, 1971 and 1976 population censuses, including estimates of underenumeration, and to incorporate a revised method of measuring overseas migration gain (i.e. by excluding movements of less than one year's duration), the labour force survey estimates were also revised. For information concerning the revised population estimates for the period June 1971 to June 1977 see Population and Vital Statistics: June Quarter 1977 (3212.0).
- 24. The new sample and revised questionnaire. A new sample based on the 1976 Population Census was used for the February 1978 survey and the survey data were obtained by means of a revised questionnaire. The new sample was selected in order to reflect the changes in the distribution of the population shown by the 1976 Population Census results. The questionnaire, which had undergone little change since 1960 except for the inclusion in 1975 of additional questions on job-seeking, was revised to provide more accurate and more detailed information concerning the labour force.
- 25. Copies of both the revised questionnaire and the one previously used, together with a description of the main features of the revised questionnaire, are contained in *Information Paper: Questionnaires used in the Labour Force Survey* (6232.0).
- 26. In order to provide an indication of the effects of the new sample and revised questionnaire, two surveys were undertaken during the same four-week period in November 1977, one using the old sample and questionnaire and the other using the new sample and revised questionnaire. Although it would have been desirable to conduct two surveys in other months in order to measure more accurately the effects of the new

- sample and revised questionnaire, that could not be done because of considerations of cost. Also, because of the cost of conducting two surveys concurrently, the sample size of both surveys had to be reduced to one-half of one per cent of the population (from the normal two-thirds of one per cent). The results of the two November surveys were used to calculate certain adjustment factors which were applied to the estimates from August 1966 to August 1977 to make them as comparable as possible with the results of later surveys. (See paragraphs 36 and 37.)
- 27. It was expected that the estimates derived from the new sample and revised questionnaire would differ to some extent from those derived from the old sample and questionnaire, for the following reasons:
 - (a) Whilst the revised questionnaire was designed to collect data according to basically the same definitions as previously, it was expected that the improved wording of some questions aimed at collecting more accurate data would result in some changes.
 - (b) A different sample could be expected to produce a different result.
 - (c) Dwellings in the old sample had been included in the survey for at least three occasions and up to a maximum of nine, whilst all dwellings in the new sample were included in the survey for the first time. From previous experience it was considered likely that there would be differences in the quality of the data provided by new entrants into the survey and those who had been surveyed several times.
- 28. In revising the estimates for the period August 1966 to November 1977 the old estimates were first recalculated by incorporating revised population benchmarks, as explained in paragraph 23. These adjusted estimates were then further revised to take account of the effect of the new sample and revised questionnaire. The methods used are summarised below.
- 29. Estimates for November 1977. Estimates for the various employment status categories of the population were obtained as follows:
 - (a) Employed persons. The estimates adopted were those obtained by using the new sample and revised questionnaire.
 - (b) Unemployed persons looking for full-time work. It was considered that the revised questionnaire had relatively little effect on the estimates for this category and the November 1977 estimates were obtained by averaging the results of the two November surveys. The amalgamation of the two results produced estimates based on a sample of one per cent of the population.
 - (c) Unemployed persons looking for part-time work. In the old questionnaire only one question was asked in order to establish

whether persons had been looking for work and this was followed by a question on whether full-time or part-time work was being sought. In the revised questionnaire two questions were asked: whether or not the persons had been looking for full-time work, and if not, whether or not they had been looking for part-time work. It was clear that a considerable increase in the estimated number of unemployed persons seeking part-time work had resulted from the inclusion of a separate question on this aspect of unemployment and the estimates obtained by using the new sample and revised questionnaire were therefore adopted.

- (d) Labour force. Revised estimates were obtained by adding revised estimates of employed and unemployed persons.
- (e) Persons not in the labour force. Revised estimates were obtained by subtracting revised labour force estimates from revised population benchmarks.
- 30. Estimates for periods before November 1977. The estimates for employed and unemployed persons for the period from August 1966 to August 1977 were adjusted to new population benchmarks (see paragraph 23) and were then further revised by applying to them adjustment factors derived from the results of the two surveys conducted for November 1977. (See paragraphs 34 and 35.) For each group the ratio of the estimate adopted for November (see paragraph 29) and the adjusted estimate based on the new benchmarks was applied to each of the earlier adjusted estimates. A more satisfactory revision of the estimates would have been possible had sufficient resources been available to conduct dual surveys over a number of months rather than only for November 1977.
- 31. Estimates for the labour force and for persons not in the labour force were obtained by addition and subtraction in the same manner as outlined in paragraph 29(d) and 29(e).

Revised labour force estimates

- 32. For periods before August 1976 revised labour force estimates in full detail are available only for August of each year. For the months of February, May and November, only broad revised aggregates (as in Table 1) are available. Estimates for States, Territories and State capital cities are only available each August prior to August 1971. Estimates classified by birthplace are not available prior to February 1972. Estimates of the number of married women employed full-time in the various industries are not available prior to August 1971.
- 33. This publication contains revised estimates of the more important cross-classifications of labour force statistics for the period August 1966 to December 1978 and generally shows details for a limited number of quarters and months for which the estimates are available. More State estimates are shown in the State publications listed in paragraph 46. Unpublished data may be available on request and inquiries should be

made through the contacts listed at the top of the Contents page.

Comparability of series

- 34. The adjustment factors mentioned in paragraphs 26 and 30 were applied at the level of State by sex by marital status by employment status by occupational status. Because of the resources required and the limited time available, and because with any further disaggregation the adjustment factors would in many cases have been based on very small estimates with high sampling variability, it was considered that this procedure was the most practicable in the circumstances. In the course of the revision the opportunity was taken to eliminate some other discontinuities: for example, those caused by a change in the definition of unemployment.
- 35. The method adopted for the revision provided comparable series for those characteristics taken into account when calculating the adjustment factors, but not necessarily for other characteristics. Thus no account was taken of the possible effects of the new sample and revised questionnaire on the distribution of the labour force by such characteristics as age, country of birth, industry, occupation, hours worked, and duration of unemployment. As a result, revised estimates for these characteristics for periods before November 1977 may not be strictly comparable with estimates for November 1977 and later periods.
- 36. Revised estimates for the period August 1976 to November 1977, which were first published in the February 1978 issues of *Unemployment (Preliminary Estimates)* (6201.0), *The Labour Force (Preliminary)* (6202.0) and *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0), supersede estimates appearing in earlier issues of those publications and in the series of publications entitled *The Labour Force* (6204.0), covering the period 1964 to 1977.
- 37. When comparing estimates for February 1978 and subsequent months with those for earlier periods it should be noted that with the introduction of monthly surveys the interviews are now conducted during a two-week period, whereas formerly the period was four weeks. This change of timing may affect the level of the figures for any month, but particularly for months during which the employment status of the population may be changing rapidly.
- 38. The survey periods for February in the years 1971, 1972, 1974 and 1976 were later than in other years, and as a consequence the estimates of the proportion of the population 15 years and over who attended school was correspondingly higher. In addition, in February 1974 the survey period in Queensland was delayed by a further week in order to avoid as far as possible the effects of the flood in the south-east area of the State.
- 39. Because of the effects of cyclone Tracy the population survey was not conducted in Darwin in February 1975. The estimates for this period therefore exclude Darwin.

40. The survey estimates for November 1973, August 1974 and August 1976 were affected by industrial disputes.

Reliability of the estimates

41. Since the survey estimates are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings they are subject to sampling variability; that is, they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey. An indication of the likely differences is given in the Technical Note, page 81.

Differences between population census and population survey estimates

- 42. Population census results show that the census labour force figures differ from the estimates derived from population surveys conducted close to census dates, e.g. in May and August of census years.
- 43. The labour force definitions used in the population census are similar to those used in the survey. (See paragraphs 6 to 18.) However, evidence from census post-enumeration surveys indicates that the personal interview approach, as used in the population survey, tends to identify a larger number of persons as being in the labour force than does the filling in of the questions on the census schedule by the householder. In addition, post-enumeration surveys following recent censuses have shown an underenumeration of the population, but the published census labour force figures have not been adjusted for any such underenumeration.

Seasonally adjusted estimates

- 44. The move to the higher level of unemployment since 1974 appears to have been accompanied by shifts in the pattern of seasonal variation. For this reason the publication of seasonally adjusted figures of unemployment was suspended as from November 1977.
- 45. Seasonally adjusted estimates of employed persons, the labour force and labour force participation rates are available for each February, May, August and November and are shown in Table 8. The methods used to seasonally adjust these figures are explained in Seasonally Adjusted Indicators, 1979 (1308.0).



LABOUR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATES



TECHNICAL NOTE

The sample design

The sample used for the labour force survey is based on the population survey master sample, which is designed to permit the selection of samples for any purpose for which a sample of dwellings or persons is appropriate. Since the introduction of labour force surveys three different sample designs have been used, as outlined below.

- 2. The sample design for surveys carried out between August 1966 and August 1972 was based on a one per cent sample of households throughout Australia. About 40,000 private dwellings (houses, flats, etc.), as well as a sample of non-private dwellings (hotels, hospitals, etc.), were included.
- 3. Data obtained from the 1971 Census of Population and Housing were used to reselect the sample and a more efficient sample design was introduced during 1972. Different proportions of the population were included in the different States and Territories but, in aggregate, about two-thirds of one per cent of the population of Australia was included. The sample consisted of about 30,000 private dwellings as well as a sample of non-private dwellings. The new sample was phased in over three surveys, May to November 1972. The February 1972 estimates are based entirely on the old sample and the November 1972 estimates entirely on the new sample.
- 4. Following the 1976 Census of Population and Housing a further redesign was undertaken. The proportion of the population included for each State and Territory was unchanged, except for the Australian Capital Territory, where the proportion was increased from one-half to one per cent. This new sample was introduced in November 1977 when two surveys were conducted, one using the old sample and the other the new. Since February 1978 the new sample has been used for all surveys.
- Because of the difficulty of obtaining and keeping up to date a complete list of dwellings from which to select a sample, the population survey master sample is for the most part a sample of areas, the exception being the sample of non-private dwellings (i.e. certain types of dwellings for which lists are maintained and which have different characteristics in respect of size, geographical location and inhabitants). Since dwellings can readily be associated with the areas in which they are located, the area sample is equivalent to a sample of dwellings. To obtain a sample of persons, rules are adopted which associate each person with one and only one dwelling, either private or non-private. Briefly, these rules are designed so that a person is considered to be at his usual place of residence if it is occupied by one or more of its usual residents at any time during the week in which the survey is conducted and, at the time of the survey, the person is not expected to be absent from it for a specific continuous period (four weeks for surveys up to November 1977, and more than six weeks for February 1978 and later surveys). In other cases a person is considered to be at the dwelling at which he

- spends most of the survey week. Modifications to these rules are necessary for dwellings such as hotels and hospitals, which contain a high proportion of transient residents; nevertheless, the rules ensure that each person is given his correct chance of inclusion in the sample.
- 6. All dwellings in Australia are allocated to a number of mutually exclusive groups called strata, each of which is sampled separately. Private dwellings are separated from non-private dwellings and are divided into metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas, the latter being further divided into urban and rural areas. Dwellings within each of these divisions are grouped into strata according to location and socio-economic considerations. Non-private dwellings are divided between metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas and strata.
- The sample from the private dwelling strata in metropolitan and other densely populated areas is a self-weighting area sample, the dwellings being selected in three stages. The first stage is the selection of Census Collectors' Districts (CDs), a CD being the area covered by one population census collector; the second, the selection of blocks (areas which can be physically defined by streets or other recognisable features) from within selected CDs; and the third the selection of dwellings within selected blocks. Although the CDs and blocks have different probabilities of inclusion (probabilities approximately proportional to the number of dwellings they contain), the sample is self-weighting, that is, for surveys conducted between August 1964 and August 1972, each dwelling (and person) selected in Australia had the same probability of inclusion, and for surveys conducted since November 1972, each dwelling (and person) selected in a State or Territory has had the same probability of inclusion, the probabilities being as follows - New South Wales and Victoria, 1 in 200; Queensland, 1 in 140; South Australia, Northern Territory and the Australian Capital Territory 1 in 100; Western Australia, 1 in 90; and Tasmania, 1 in 60. However, although, for example the probability of including any dwelling (or person) in South Australia, is one in a hundred, this does not imply that exactly one-hundredth of all dwellings or persons are included. The number of dwellings or persons actually included may, by chance, be somewhat more or less than one-hundredth of the total number; certain steps taken to limit the size of this difference and to allow for its possible effect on survey estimates are described in paragraph 10.
- 8. Outside the densely populated areas, a self-weighting four-stage area sample is generally used, with areas such as towns or rural Local Government Areas being the primary sample units at the first stage of selection and CDs, blocks and dwellings, the units at the subsequent stages. In some small towns the first stage of selection is omitted, the town itself being treated as though it were a single CD. Other modifications to the selection procedure are also made for certain other types or areas, but these affect only a small proportion of sample dwellings.

- 9. The sample of non-private dwellings in metropolitan and other densely populated areas is a self-weighting two-stage cluster sample, the sample units at each stage being (i) dwellings and (ii) either persons or accommodation units (e.g. rooms of hotels) within each dwelling. Outside the densely populated areas, a self-weighting three-stage cluster sample is used, sample units being (i) Local Government Areas or towns in the private dwelling sample (ii) dwellings and (iii) either persons or accommodation units within each dwelling. Where accommodation units are selected, rules are adopted to ensure that each person associated with the dwelling is associated with only one accommodation unit.
- 10. The effect of new dwellings, conversions, demolitions, etc. is taken into account in the sample selection procedure. For the private dwelling sample a check is made during each survey on all dwellings within each selected block. New dwellings detected are given the same chance of selection as other dwellings in the same block, so that, taking the sample as a whole, new dwellings also have the correct chance of being selected. Similar procedures exist for buildings converted for use as dwellings. Dwellings demolished or converted to non-dwelling use are removed from the sample. In areas where there has been an unusually rapid rate of growth of private dwellings since the sample was first selected. either very many or very few of the new dwellings will be in sample blocks or in sample CDs. Even though there will be no general tendency for the sample to include too many or too few new dwellings, the effect in particular areas of chance departures from a sample of exactly the correct distribution will be that a disproportionately high or low number of new dwellings will be included in these areas, and as a consequence characteristics of the persons associated with new dwellings will be over-estimated or under-estimated accordingly. To limit such effects, special procedures are adopted to ensure that the sample representative, a reselection of CDs being made from the appropriate stratum, if necessary. The lists of non-private dwellings used in the selection of the non-private dwelling sample are brought up to date before each survey by using information available from sources external to the sample. The combined effect of these measures is that during any survey the sample of dwellings represents dwellings currently in existence in Australia.
- 11. When the population survey was conducted quarterly (i.e. until November 1977) the interviews at sample dwellings were carried out during a four-week period in metropolitan areas and a two-week period in non-metropolitan areas. Thus, data were obtained each quarter from four interpenetrating samples in metropolitan areas and two interpenetrating samples in non-metropolitan areas. For the monthly population survey the interview period is two weeks in metropolitan areas, using two interpenetrating samples, and one week in non-metropolitan areas.
- 12. A selected private dwelling generally remains in the sample for eight surveys; hence for the quarterly surveys conducted up to November 1977, the period in the sample was generally two years, and for the monthly

surveys conducted since February 1978 it has generally been eight months. In order to minimise respondent fatigue and to maintain continuity within the sample, one-eighth of the private dwellings in the sample are replaced after each survey. Adoption of this 'rotation' procedure, whereby seven-eighths of the sample remains unchanged from one survey to the next, enables more reliable measurements of survey-to-survey changes in the population and labour force characteristics to be made than would be possible if a new sample were introduced in each survey. Until November 1977, selected non-private dwellings (except the large ones) were retained in the sample for no longer than a year, with one quarter being replaced after each survey. However, since the introduction of monthly surveys in February 1978, selected non-private dwellings have been retained in the sample for eight surveys, with one-eighth of them being rotated out of the sample after each survey.

Estimation procedure

- 13. Labour force and other estimates derived from population survey data are obtained by using a complex ratio estimation procedure, in the application of which the following components are used:
 - (i) population estimates ('benchmarks') classified by State, area, age and sex;
 - (ii) the number of persons with the characteristics being measured in the sample in each 'cell' formed by the benchmarks; and
 - (iii) the total number of persons in the sample in each cell.

The ratio of (ii) to (iii) is multiplied by the population benchmark for the appropriate cell to give an estimate of the total number of persons with the given characteristics in that population cell. This procedure ensures that survey estimates conform to the known distribution of the population by age and sex, even though (as can be expected in a sample) the sample itself may not exactly represent that distribution, and at the same time it automatically compensates for any inherent under-enumeration or over-enumeration in the sample.

14. It will be appreciated that the theoretical soundness of the sample design could be greatly affected in practice by any substantial degree of failure to obtain information in respect of all persons selected, whether from failure on the part of the interviewer to make contact or from lack of co-operation by repondents. For this reason a high level of response is sought and, in fact, generally about 96 per cent of households fully respond to the survey.

Reliability of the estimates

15. Since the estimates in this publication are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, the estimates and the movements derived from them are subject to sampling variability; that is, they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if all dwelling had been included in the surveys. One measure of the likely difference is given by the standard error, which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample of dwellings was included. There are about two chances in three that a sample estimate will differ by less

than one standard error from the figure that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included, and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two standard errors.

- Space does not allow for the separate indication of the standard errors of all estimates in this publication. Estimates for the period August 1966 to December 1978 are based on one of three different sample designs (see paragraphs 2 to 4, page 81). Standard errors of estimates for November 1977 to December 1978 are shown in Table A. To obtain the standard errors of estimates for August 1966 to August 1977 the standard error obtained from Table A should be multiplied by the appropriate factor from Table B. Because of the reduction in the sample size for November 1975 and November 1977 the standard errors for all estimates from these surveys, except unemployed persons looking for full-time work in November 1977, should be increased by a factor of 1.15. The figures in Table A will not give a precise measure of the standard error of a particular estimate since they are averages based on calculations for a limited number of surveys over a wide range of labour force characteristics. However, they will provide an indication of the magnitude of the standard error of any particular estimate for any particular survey. An example of the use of Tables A and B is as follows. If the estimate obtained for New South Wales from a survey carried out in 1974 is 20,000 the standard error obtained from Table A is about 2,000, and the factor from Table B is 0.8, and therefore the standard error is about 1,600 (2,000 x 0.8). That is, there are two chances in three that the value that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey will be within the range 18,400 to 21,600 (20,000 ± 1,600) and about nineteen chances in twenty that the value will fall within the range 16,800 to 23,200 ($20,000 \pm 3,200$).
- 17. The size of the standard error increases with the level of the estimate, so that the larger the estimate the larger the standard error. However, it should be noted that the larger the sample estimate the smaller will be the standard error as a percentage of the estimate. Thus, larger sample estimates will be relatively more reliable than smaller estimates.
- 18. Very small estimates are subject to such high standard errors (relative to the size of the estimate) as to detract seriously from their value for most reasonable uses. In the tables in this publication, estimates for Australia below 4,500 and estimates for States and Territories below the cut-off points shown in Tables A and B (and percentages derived from such estimates) have not been included. Although figures for these small components can in some cases be derived by subtraction, they should not be regarded as reliable.
- 19. The movement in the level of an estimate is also subject to sampling variability. The standard error of the movement depends on the levels of the estimates from which the movement is obtained rather than the size of the movement. An indication of the magnitude of standard errors of monthly, quarterly and annual movements can be obtained from Tables A to E as set out below.

- 20. An indication of the magnitude of the standard error of quarter-to-quarter change for the period November 1972 to February 1978 is given in Table C. To obtain the standard error of quarter-to-quarter change for the period August 1966 to November 1972 the standard errors in Table C should be multiplied by the appropriate factors shown in Table D.
- 21. An indication of the magnitude of the standard error of monthly movements for the period from February 1978 is given in Table E. A guide to the standard errors of quarterly movements for periods from February 1978 can be obtained by multiplying the figures shown in Table E by 1.4.
- 22. A guide to standard errors of annual movements can be obtained for the period August 1966 to November 1972 by multiplying the figures derived from Tables C and D by 1.5; and for the period November 1972 to February 1978 by multiplying the figures in Table C by 1.3. For annual movements between estimates which come from two different sample designs (see paragraphs 1 to 4) the standard error of movement may be obtained by multiplying the standard error of the larger estimate (obtained from Table A or B) by 1.4.
- 23. The estimates of standard errors of quarterly and monthly movements apply only to estimates of movements between two successive quarters or months. Movements between corresponding quarters and months of successive years (i.e. annual movements) are discussed above. Movement between two other non-consecutive quarters or months will generally be subject to somewhat greater sampling variability than is indicated in Tables C to E, but usually no greater than the standard error of the corresponding annual movements.
- 24. Examples of the use of Tables C and E are given below.
 - (a) If a survey estimate for Australia increased from 192,000 in one month in 1978 to 200,000 in the next month the standard error of the monthly increase of 8,000 can be obtained directly from Table E. The standard errors in that table relate to the size of the larger of the two estimates from which the movement is derived. In this case the larger estimate is 200,000 and it will be seen that the standard error of this monthly movement is 4,300. Therefore there are about two chances in three that if all dwellings had been included in the surveys the movement would have been within the range +3,700 to +12,300 (8,000 + 4,300) and about nineteen chances in twenty that it would have been within the range -600 to +16,600 (8,000 ± 8,600).
 - (b) Assume a survey estimate for Australia increased from 6,500 in August 1974 to 10,000 in August 1975. From Table C the standard error of the larger of the two estimates for a quarterly movement is 1,600. Referring to paragraph 22 the standard error of the annual movement (3,500) can be obtained by multiplying this standard error by 1.3, i.e. it is

about 2,100. There are two chances in three that if all dwellings had been included in the surveys the movement would have been within the range $\pm 1,400$ to $\pm 5,600$ (3,500 $\pm 2,100$) and nineteen chances in twenty that the estimate would have been within the range $\pm 7,700$ (3,500 $\pm 4,200$).

- 25. The standard errors of estimates relating to agricultural employment are generally somewhat higher than the standard errors of other estimates of the same magnitude. Estimates for females also tend to have higher standard errors than estimates of equivalent size for males in similar categories. Standard errors for capital cities are approximately the same as those for relevant States.
- 26. The reliability of an estimated percentage, computed by using sample data for both numerator and

- denominator, depends upon both the size of the numerator and the size of the denominator. However, the per cent standard error of the estimated percentage will generally be lower than the per cent error of the estimate of the numerator. The per cent standard errors of the numerators can be obtained from Tables A and B.
- 27. The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the standard error, should not be confused with inaccuracies that may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as the non-sampling error, and they may occur in any statistical collection whether it be a full count or only a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.
