

## DWELLING UNIT COMMENCEMENTS REPORTED BY APPROVING AUTHORITIES, SOUTH AUSTRALIA, APRIL 1994

### MAIN FEATURES

- South Australian approving authorities reported the commencement of 914 dwellings for April 1994. The private sector was responsible for 816 of these while the public sector accounted for 98.
- The statistical local area with the highest number of dwelling unit commencements for April 1994 was Tea Tree Gully with 113 closely followed by Salisbury with 105. Noarlunga was next, reporting 69 followed by Campbelltown with 57.
- Within the Adelaide Statistical Division (ASD) Tea Tree Gully led the way in terms of house commencements, reporting 113. Salisbury and Noarlunga followed, reporting 83 and 67 respectively.
- Campbelltown with 41 was the statistical local area to report the highest number of other residential dwellings.
- Outside the ASD Mt Barker with 55 reported the most dwelling commencements. Victor Harbor was next with 18 followed by Port Elliot and Goolwa and Mt Gambier (C) both with 15.

*Note: The figures shown for Salisbury in this month's publication are inclusive of 29 houses and 8 flats and units commenced prior to April but not reported to the ABS. Similarly 36 houses in Tea Tree Gully and 33 in Mt Barker were commenced prior to April and not reported to the ABS.*

### EXPLANATORY NOTES

#### Introduction

This publication contains monthly details of the number of new dwelling units reported by approving authorities as having commenced. Data for selected statistical local areas are included. From January 1991 the data were compiled using an 'as reported' method. Previously, data were revised for up to four months as councils notified the ABS of commencements occurring before the reference month.

#### Scope and coverage

2. The statistics were compiled from monthly reports, provided by local and other government authorities, of commencements of new houses and new other residential buildings for which:

- (a) building permits were issued by local government or other government authorities in areas subject to building control by those authorities; and
- (b) contracts were let or day labour work was authorised by Commonwealth, State, semi-government and local government authorities.

Major dwelling unit commencements in areas not subject to the normal administrative approval processes (e.g. buildings on remote mine sites) are also included.

3. The number of dwelling units created by alterations and additions to existing buildings and through the construction of new non-residential buildings is not included.

#### Definitions

4. A *dwelling unit* is defined as a self-contained suite of rooms, including cooking and bathing facilities and intended for long term residential use. Units (whether self-contained or not) within buildings offering institutional care, such as hospitals, or temporary accommodation e.g. motels, hostels and holiday apartments, are not defined as dwelling units.

5. A *residential building* is defined as a building predominantly consisting of one or more dwelling units. Residential buildings can be either *houses* or *other residential buildings* as follows:

- (a) A *house* is defined as a detached building predominantly used for long term residential purposes and consisting of only one dwelling unit. Thus, detached 'granny flats' and detached dwelling units (such as caretakers' residences) associated with non-residential buildings are defined as houses for the purpose of these statistics.
- (b) An *other residential building* is defined as a building which is predominantly used for long term residential purposes and which contains (or has attached to it) more than one dwelling unit (e.g. includes townhouses, duplexes, apartment buildings etc.).

6. *Commencements.* For the purposes of this statistical series, a dwelling unit is regarded as being commenced on the date when:

- (a) the residential building is first inspected by a building inspector or surveyor, whether the work is passed or not. In general, the first inspection is undertaken at the foundations or footings stage of construction, or

- (b) the residential building is determined as commenced by a building inspector or surveyor.

7. *Ownership of a building* is classified as either Public Sector or Private Sector according to the sector of the intended owner of the completed building as evident at the time of approval. Residential buildings being constructed by private sector builders under government housing authority schemes whereby the authority has contracted, or intends to contract, to purchase the buildings on or before completion, are classified as public sector.

#### **Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC)**

8. Area statistics are now being classified to the *Australian Standard Geographical Classification, Edition 2.1* (1216.0) and ASGC terminology has been adopted in the presentation of building statistics.

#### **Comparability of statistics**

9. Because of the difference in data sources, collection methodologies and timing of notification of commencements, care should be exercised in comparing quarterly data derived from monthly dwelling unit commencement statistics with the quarterly dwelling unit commencement statistics from the Building Activity Survey.

#### **Unpublished data**

10. The ABS can also make available certain dwelling unit commencement data which are not published. Where it is not practicable to provide the required information by telephone, data can be provided in the following forms: microfiche, photocopy, computer printout and clerically extracted tabulation. A charge may be made for providing unpublished information in these forms.
