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PREFACE

The 1966 Census publication programme is made up of five individual Volumes, four consisting of a number of separate Parts, together with a series of supplementary statements in mimeographed form. The actual titles of the 1966 Census Volumes and Parts are listed in the back of this publication; the content of each is briefly as follows:

- Volume 1. Single characteristics of the population for Australia, Parts 1-11.—Age, marital status, birthplace, nationality, period of residence, education, religion, occupational status, industry, occupation and race.
- Volume 2. Related characteristics of the population for Australia, Parts 1-5.—Growth and distribution of the population, demographic data, overseas-born population, the work force, and families and households.
- Volume 3. Housing.
- Volume 4. Single characteristics of the population and dwellings in Local Government Areas, Parts 1-7.—New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, Tasmania, and Northern Territory and Australian Capital Territory.
- Volume 5. Population and dwellings in localities, Parts 1-7.—States and Territories as for Volume 4, and Part 8.—Australia.

This publication is Part 5 of Volume 2 and contains details of families and households as enumerated at 30 June 1966.

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EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

At the 1966 Census, answers to the question on relationship to the head of the household were used for the first time to produce data on the composition of families and households. At the 1961 and previous censuses data had been produced on the size of households but for the 1966 Census a family and household classification was developed which not only enabled data to be produced on the size of households but also classified separate families within households according to their structural composition.

Households and Family Units

A 'household group' is defined in the census as 'a person or group of persons living as a domestic unit with common eating arrangements'. An 'occupied dwelling' is 'any habitation occupied by a "household group" and may comprise the whole or only a part of a building'. Households are used as a basic unit of collection in the census and a separate schedule is completed in respect of each household. Within a household, however, there can be more than one distinct family unit and these were identified by using two basic characteristics of blood and marriage relationship as indicated by the answers to relationship to head, and other information such as name, age, sex, marital status, etc.

Following the separation of households into distinct family units, these units were classified into two types:

Primary Family Units (PFU's) were those family units where the head of the family was also the head of the household. Such families can consist of only one person.

Secondary Family Units (SFU's) were all other family units within the household which comprised at least two persons of immediate family relationship (*see Note below*).

Within these two broad family types a detailed classification showing 16 family classes was devised based on the following relationships:

- (i) The head of a family
- (ii) The spouse of the head
- (iii) Issue child of the head
- (iv) Other child of the head
- (v) Ancestors of the head or spouse
- (vi) Other family members
- (vii) Other relatives of the Primary Family of younger generation
- (viii) Other relatives of the Primary Family of the older or same generation
- (ix) Boarders
- (x) Other unrelated persons

NOTE. More detailed notes on these categories are given in Appendix A, page 36)

Primary Families consist of any combination of persons classified to categories (i) to (vi) but because of the difficulty of identifying relationships within Secondary Families only combinations of persons classified to categories (i) to (iv) were included in SFU's.

The Family Classification

1. Single person, aged less than 30 years
2. Single person, aged 30-44 years
3. Single person, aged 45 years or over
4. Head and spouse, head aged less than 30 years
5. Head and spouse, head aged 30-44 years
6. Head and spouse, head aged 45 years or over
7. Head and 1 or 2 children
8. Head and 3 or more children
9. Head, spouse and 1 or 2 children
10. Head, spouse and 3 or more children
11. Head and other adults
12. Head, spouse and other adults
13. Head, 1 child and other adults
14. Head, 2 or more children and other adults
15. Head, spouse, 1 child and other adults
16. Head, spouse, 2 or more children and other adults

Family types 4 to 16 can be with Primary and Secondary Families but since types 1, 2 and 3 contain only one person they can only be Primary Families (*see Table 3*).

For ease of presentation of family data only Table 3 in this publication shows the full family classification. For Tables 4 to 11 only eight classes are shown, with no distinction between Primary and Secondary Family Units. Data on the full classification is, however, available on request.

Classification of Households

The household classification is derived wholly from the family classification as follows:

<i>Household Classification</i>	<i>Composition of Household</i>
1 . . .	Single family household of one person
2 . . .	Single family household of more than one person
3 . . .	A Primary Family Unit and a <i>related</i> Secondary Family Unit(s) and/or other relatives of the PFU
4 . . .	A PFU of one person <i>and</i> a <i>non-related</i> SFU(s) and/or non-related persons
5 . . .	A PFU of more than one person <i>and</i> a <i>non-related</i> SFU(s) and/or non-related persons
6 . . .	A PFU and related SFU(s) and/or other relatives of the PFU <i>and</i> non-related SFU(s) and/or non-related persons

Scope of the Family and Household Analysis

Non-private dwellings

Because of the incomplete state of most families enumerated in non-private dwellings (hotels, motels, barracks, etc.) the tables in this publication relate only to persons enumerated in private dwellings.

Non-family members excluded from family tabulation

In a de-facto census many individuals are absent from their usual place of residence on census night and are either enumerated in non-private dwellings, and therefore excluded from this analysis, or are enumerated in other private dwellings but unaccompanied by their families. As a result, persons classified as other relatives of the PFU, boarders, and other unrelated persons are excluded from the family tables but are included in the tables showing classification of households.

Aborigines

Aborigines of more than half-descent are excluded from the general census publications but are included in the tables which follow if they were enumerated in dwellings in which non-Aboriginal persons or half-descent Aboriginal persons were also counted. As a result, some of the totals shown in the tables may exceed the corresponding totals shown in other census publications.

Characteristics of the Head

Age

Persons were asked to state age in accordance with the following instructions.

State age in years and completed months. If aged under one year, state age in completed months (for example, a child of eleven months should be shown as '0' years '11' months). If aged under one month, write '0' years '0' months.

This question is more specific than that asked at the 1961 Census, which sought 'age last birthday' (in years). The change should overcome some mis-statement of age due to rounding. Similarly, it is expected that confusion in the reporting of ages of young children (which are conventionally thought of in 'months' up to the age of about two years) should be now largely obviated.

Prior to the 1954 Census, ages 'not stated' were tabulated as such for urban and rural sections of each State and later distributed to specific ages in accordance with the frequency of stated ages. In the 1954 and later Censuses, 'not stated' ages were individually estimated prior to tabulation by firstly establishing the minimum range of ages within which the 'not stated' age most probably lay (as indicated by other information supplied in the Householder's Schedule) and by then selecting an age from within that range from a table of random ages according to sex. This table had been compiled previously using the latest estimates of the age distribution of the population which were available at the time.

The proportion of persons who failed to state an age is very small.

Marital status

Persons were asked to state marital status in accordance with the following instructions.

If never married, write 'N.M.'; at present married, write 'M'; married but permanently separated (legally or otherwise), write 'P.S.'; divorced and not remarried, write 'D'; widowed and not remarried, write 'W'.

A very small proportion of persons omitted to state any marital status. In such cases, marital status was assessed as follows:

Males under 20 years of age and females under 18 years of age were classified 'never married' unless there was definite evidence of marriage given in the Schedule, in which case they were classified 'married'. All other persons were classified 'married' if there was any evidence of marriage given in the Schedule. Otherwise a marital status was allocated from a random list according to the age and sex of the person concerned. The random list of the allocation of 'not stated' marital status had been compiled previously using the latest available statistics of the distribution of the population by marital status.

Duration of existing marriage

Persons were asked to state the duration of the existing marriage in accordance with the following instructions.

For each person at present married state the number of completed years the existing marriage has been in force. Exclude previous marriages. If married less than one year, write '0'.

Birthplace

Persons were asked to state birthplace in accordance with the following instructions.

For persons born in Australia write name of the State or Territory where born. For persons born outside Australia write the name of the country where born (not town or locality).

For the small number of cases where no reply was given, the allocation of a birthplace was made in accordance with other information on the Schedule (usually nationality).

Period of residence in Australia

Persons were asked to state period of residence in Australia in accordance with the following instructions.

For persons born outside Australia write the number of completed years of continuous residence in Australia ignoring absences of less than twelve months. If resident less than twelve months, write '0'.

Work force

At the 1961 and previous Censuses the work force was determined as:

- 'Those who are engaged in an industry, business, profession, trade or service at the time of the Census (including those on long service leave, etc.).....'; and
'.....those out of a job at time of the Census but who are usually engaged in an industry, business, profession, trade or service.....'

At the 1966 Census an additional set of four questions was asked in order to obtain information on the basis of which the work force could be determined more precisely. The *questions* were as follows.

Did the person have a job or business of any kind last week (even though he may have been temporarily absent from it) ? ANSWER 'YES' or 'NO'.

Did the person do any work at all last week for payment or profit? ANSWER 'YES' or 'NO'. Persons working without pay as a helper in a 'family business' or farm and members of the clergy and of religious orders (other than purely contemplative orders) should answer 'YES' to this question. **Persons doing only unpaid housework should answer 'NO'.**

Was the person temporarily laid off by his employer without pay for the whole of last week? ANSWER 'YES' or 'NO'.

Did the person look for work last week? ANSWER 'YES' or 'NO'. (**Note:** 'Looking for work' means (i) being registered with Commonwealth Employment Service, or (ii) approaching prospective employers, or (iii) placing or answering advertisements, or (iv) writing letters of application, or (v) awaiting the result of recent applications.)

The work force includes all persons for whom the answer 'yes' was given to any one of these four questions. Except that persons helping but not receiving wages or a salary who usually worked less than 15 hours a week were excluded from the work force.

This approach conforms closely to the recommendations of the Eighth International Conference of Labour Statisticians held in Geneva in 1954 and the information so obtained has been used in determining the work force for the purposes of the 1966 Census.

The net effect of the new definition is to include approximately 108,000 additional persons in the Australian work force, i.e. a proportionate increase in the Australian work force of 2.3 per cent. The major factor in this change was females working part-time (sometimes for only a few hours a week) some of whom, in 1961, did not consider themselves as '.....engaged in an industry, business, profession, trade or service'.

Occupation

Persons in the work force were asked to state occupation in accordance with the following instructions.

State in precise (or award) terms the person's main occupation last week, using where possible two or more words. For example, '**Builder's Labourer**', '**Dairy Farm Hand**', '**Clothing Machinist**', '**Wood Machinist**', '**Motor Mechanic**', '**Electrical Fitter**', '**Coal Wheeler**', '**Dairy Farmer**', etc. Employees of Government Departments or Authorities should be described by their official designation, such as '**District Employment Officer**', '**Shire Clerk**', etc., and not by such terms as '**Public Servant**', etc.

The precise classification of persons in the work force according to occupation and industry is extremely difficult but is subject to continuing efforts to improve the quality of the data from census to census. Consequently the comparison of data compiled at the 1966 Census with that obtained at previous censuses is not only influenced by changes in the definition and content of the work force but also by the different responses which may have been evoked by efforts to improve the questions on the census schedule, and by some changes in coding rules designed to rectify known deficiencies in the data. Classification according to occupation and industry is difficult mainly because of the problem of conveying through a printed form the exact nature of the information required (e.g. the conceptual difference between 'occupation' and 'industry') and the consequential inadequacy of many replies.

Classification according to occupation is particularly difficult because: (a) the range of occupations is so extensive; (b) there is a lack of uniformity in occupational terms, which vary between industries, locations and States; and (c) respondents fail to give precise descriptions, especially of other members of the family, either through carelessness or ignorance of occupational designations. Similarly, classification according to industry is complicated by the development of new fields of industrial enterprise and the splitting and overlapping of previously identifiable fields.

While it is not intended to revise any of the statistics relating to occupation and industry contained in this publication, it is proposed to undertake a detailed analysis of the information obtained at the 1966 Census to evaluate the precision of the data and as an aid to the framing of classifications and the wording of instructions for the next census.

Dwellings definitions

The following definitions were used as a basis for the Census of Dwellings.

- (a) An 'occupied dwelling' is any habitation occupied by a 'household group' and may comprise the whole or only a part of a building.
- (b) A 'household group' is a person or group of persons living as a domestic unit with common eating arrangements.

The number of 'occupied dwellings' and the number of 'households' are therefore identical by definition.

The lack of a structural definition of a dwelling is not considered a significant disadvantage in Australia as the majority of households do in fact each occupy one distinct dwelling structure (i.e. a house or a self-contained flat).

Class of dwelling

Details of the numbers of each class of dwelling have been obtained from householders' statements made in accordance with the following instructions.

State below whether the dwelling is a—

- Private house (including semi-detached and terrace house).
 - Share of a private house.
 - † Self-contained flat (including home unit).
 - Share of a flat.
 - Room(s), apartment or flat (not self-contained).
 - Shed, hut, caravan, tent, boat, etc.
 - Licensed hotel, motel, hostel, boarding house, institution, barracks, staff quarters, etc.
- Where a private house or flat is shared without structural subdivision by two or more household groups each householder should fill in a separate Householder's Schedule.
† 'Self-contained' means able to be completely closed off and with own cooking and bathing facilities.

Dwellings are classified as follows:

Private dwellings—private house

- share of private house
- self-contained flat
- share of self-contained flat
- shed, hut, tent, caravan, etc.
- other private dwellings

Non-private dwellings—licensed hotel

- motel
- boarding house
- educational institution
- religious institution
- charitable institution
- hospital
- staff barracks, etc.

Where the class of dwelling was 'not stated' a class was allocated prior to tabulation on the basis of other information in the census schedule or answers given for neighbouring dwellings.

Persons not enumerated in dwellings

Persons, who on census night were camping out, travelling on board ships in Australian waters, or ships which had left an Australian port prior to census night with a next port of call in Australia, or were enumerated on long-distance trains, motor coaches or aircraft, are not regarded as living in a dwelling for census purposes and therefore are excluded from the Family and Household analysis. Persons classified as 'camping out' include those living temporarily (e.g. on holidays) in tents, caravans or houseboats, or who were 'camped out' on census night. If a tent, caravan or houseboat constituted a semi-permanent dwelling it was classified as a dwelling and the occupants included in the Family and Household analysis.

Number of inmates

The number of inmates of a dwelling relates to the number of persons actually enumerated in that dwelling (i.e. the number of persons who spent the night of 30 June 1966 in the dwelling) and does not include persons who normally reside at that dwelling but spent census night elsewhere.

Number of rooms

Each householder was asked to state the number of rooms in the dwelling in accordance with the following instructions.

State below the number of rooms in this dwelling. Count all rooms (including permanently enclosed sleep-out) except bathroom, toilet, pantry, laundry or storeroom.

Note: Rooms in non-attached buildings should be included only if used for living or sleeping purposes by members of this household. A combined living-dining room or combined kitchen-living or kitchen-dining room should be counted as one room.

A shared kitchen or shared living room in a shared house should be included only by the owner or principal tenant.

The specific instructions relating to non-attached buildings were included at the 1961 Census but those relating to combined-usage rooms were introduced at the 1966 Census.

Where the number of rooms in a dwelling was not stated, a number was allocated prior to tabulation on the basis of the answer given for the geographically nearest dwelling of the same class, except in the case of sheds, huts, tents, garages, caravans and houseboats where allocation was made by the use of a series of random numbers. The random numbers, which ranged from 1 to 8 rooms, were based upon the distribution of the number of rooms recorded in these types of dwellings at the 1961 Census.

The number of cases for which number of rooms was not stated is relatively small.

APPENDIX A

Categories of Relationship Within Families

- (i) **Head.** The head of the household (and of the PFU) is in general the person claiming to be the head. Where present, this is usually the husband unless the wife claims to be head and is engaged in an industry *and* the husband is a pensioner or is engaged as a helper in his wife's business. With the same exceptions, for SFU's comprising a husband and wife, the husband is head of the family. For SFU's comprising only one parent and child (or children), the parent is classed as the head.
- (ii) **Spouse.** As implied in (i) above, the spouse is generally the wife of the head. Where the husband is absent at the time of the census, the wife is classed as head of the family and the family is then recorded as being without a spouse.
- (iii) **Issue children.** These are children, of any age, with one or both currently *married* (i.e. excluding separated, widowed or divorced) parents present. Children, who are themselves married, are not included in this category. Adopted children are treated in the same manner as issue children.
- (iv) **Other children.** Are: (a) children, of any age, with a *separated, divorced or widowed parent* present providing they are unmarried and not accompanied by children of their own, and (b) all children under 16 years of age without a parent present.

NOTE. In the family classification shown on page 7, 'Issue children' and 'other children' are classed as 'children' only if they are under 16 years of age. 'Issue children' and 'other children' aged 16 years or over are included as 'other adults'.

- (v) **Ancestors.** These comprise direct ancestors of the head or spouse of the PFU, e.g. father, grandmother, etc. but not aunts, uncles, etc. Ancestors are included in the PFU whether or not they are married or accompanied by children of their own and are included as 'other adults' in the family classification. Because of the difficulty of identifying ancestors of the head or spouse of SFU's, a separate category was not designed for such persons. They have either been treated as separate SFU's or, if they do not constitute a separate family, are excluded from the family analysis.
- (vi) **Other family members.** These comprise brothers and sisters of the head or spouse of the PFU. However, brothers and sisters are not included in this category if they are married or accompanied by children of their own or are under 16 years of age. Other family members are included as 'other adults' in the family classification. Because of the difficulty of identifying brothers and sisters of the head or spouse of SFU's, a separate category was not designed for such persons. They have either been treated as separate SFU's or, if they do not constitute a separate family, are excluded from the family analysis.
- (vii) **Other relatives of the PFU of younger generation.** These comprise:
 - (a) Sons, daughters, sons/daughters-in-law, grandsons and grand-daughters who are currently married but unaccompanied by their spouse or children.
 - (b) Grandsons and grand-daughters, not currently married, aged 16 years and over, and who are unaccompanied by their children or parents.
 - (c) Nephews and nieces, of any marital status, aged 16 years or over and unaccompanied by their spouse, children or parents.

These persons are excluded from the family analysis but are included in the household analysis.

- (viii) **Other relatives of the PFU of older or same generation.** These comprise:
 - (a) Brothers, sisters, brothers/sisters-in-law, who are married but are unaccompanied by their spouse or children.
 - (b) Uncles or aunts of any marital status and who are unaccompanied by their spouse or children.
 - (c) Cousins of any marital status, aged 16 years or over and unaccompanied by their spouse, children or parents.
- (ix) **Boarders.** These comprise persons who stated themselves to be boarders and who were unaccompanied by their spouse or children. These persons are excluded from the family analysis but are included in the household analysis.
- (x) **Other unrelated persons.** Comprises persons who stated themselves to be visitors, guests, friends, etc. and who were unaccompanied by their spouse or children.

These persons are excluded from the family analysis but are included in the household analysis.


