

#### SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

# June quarter 1995 compared with March quarter 1995 —

#### Excess of merchandise exports or imports

In the June quarter 1995 merchandise imports exceeded merchandise exports by \$1,666 million. The decrease of \$491 million in the deficit on merchandise trade occurred mainty as a result of an increase in exports which was partly offset by a smaller increase in imports.


Australia's trade with its major trading partners produced deficits with:

- USA, up \$437 million (16%) to \$3,199 million;
- UK, up \$9 million (2%) to \$516 million; and
- China, down \$117 million (72%) to \$46 million.

#### Surpluses were recorded with:

- Japan, up \$540 million (85%) to \$1,117 million;
- Republic of Korea, up \$146 million (17%) to \$984 million:
- New Zealand, up \$52 million (19%) to \$328 million;
- Singapore, down \$200 million (41%) to \$291 million; and
- Taiwan, up \$106 million (73%) to \$251 million.



#### Merchandise exports

Merchandise exports for June quarter 1995 were \$17,570 million, up \$1,300 million or 8 per cent on the previous quarter.

#### **GRAPH 2: MERCHANDISE EXPORTS**



All exports commodity groups recorded increases on the previous quarter. The most significant were:

- crude materials, up \$423 million (12%) to \$3,853 million (due mainly to increased exports of metalliferous ores and textile fibres);
- machinery and transport equipment, up \$277 million (15%) to \$2,182 million (due mainly to increased exports of office machines and computers and electrical machinery); and
- food and live animals, up \$136 million (5%) to \$2,947 (due mainly to increased exports of meat, fish, and vegetables and fruit).


#### Australia's major export destinations were:

- Japan, up \$378 million (10%) to \$4,211 million;
- Republic of Korea, up \$145 million (11%) to \$1,501 million;
- New Zealand, up \$96 million (9%) to \$1,225 million:
- USA, up \$19 million (2%) to \$1,147 million;
- Taiwan, up \$144 million (20%) to \$882 million;
- Singapore, down \$158 million (15%) to \$878 million:
- Hong Kong, up \$164 million (28%) to \$753 million; and
- China, down \$15 million (2%) to \$742 million.

#### Merchandise imports

Merchandise imports for June quarter 1995 were \$19,235 million, up \$808 million, or 4 per cent on the previous quarter.

The imports commodity groups recording significant increases on the previous quarter were:

- machinery and transport equipment, up \$750 million (9%) to \$9,280 million (due mainly to increased imports of office machines and computers, road vehicles and electrical machinery);
- chemical and related products, up \$137 million (7%) to \$2,188 million (due mainly to increased imports of inorganic chemicals, and medicinal and pharmaceutical products);
- mineral fuels, up \$96 million (10%) to \$1,026 million (due to increased imports of petroleum and petroleum products); and
- manufactured goods classified chiefly by material. up \$63 million (2%) to \$2,761 million (due to increased imports of iron and steel, paper and textiles).

Decreases were recorded for food and live animals, down \$113 million (15%) to \$663 million (due mainly to decreased imports of miscellaneous edible products, live animals and fish); and for miscellaneous manufactured articles, down \$79 million (3%) to \$2,498 million (due to decreased imports of apparel and clothing).

Australia's major import sources were:

- USA, up \$457 million (12%) to \$4,346 million;
- Japan, down \$161 million (5%) to \$3,034 million;
- Germany, up \$107 million (9%) to \$1,357 million;
- UK, up \$98 million (9%) to \$1,138 million;
- New Zealand, up \$43 million (5%) to \$896 million;
- China, down \$132 million (14%) to \$788 million;

- Taiwan, up \$38 million (6%) to \$631 million; and
- Singapore, up \$42 million (8%) to \$587 million.

# Year ended June 1995 compared with year ended June 1994 ---

#### Excess of merchandise exports or imports


For the year ended June 1995 merchandise imports exceeded merchandise exports by \$7,602 million, a turnaround of \$7,710 million from the surplus of \$108 million recorded for the previous year.

Australia's trade with its major trading partners produced deficits with:

- USA, up \$2,473 million (28%) to \$11,415 million;
- UK, up \$1,375 million (173%) to \$2,172 million; and
- China, up \$164 million (31%) to \$693 million.

Surpluses were recorded with Japan, down \$723 million (17%) to \$3,507 million; Republic of Korea, up \$406 million (14%) to \$3,242 million; Singapore, down \$13 million (1%) to \$1,402 million; New Zealand, up \$406 (50%) to \$1,214 million; and Taiwan, up \$133 million (34%) to \$528 million.

#### Merchandise exports

Merchandise exports for the year ended June 1995 were \$67,036 million, up \$2,458 million or 4 per cent on the previous year.


The exports commodity groups recording significant increases on the previous year were:

- crude materials, up \$1,142 million (9%) to \$14,059 million (due mainly to increased exports of textiles fibres and metalliferous ores);
- manufactured goods classified chiefly by material, up \$1,084 million (14%) to \$8,995 million (due to increased exports in all categories with the largest being in non-ferrous metals, leather, and iron and steel); and

machinery and transport equipment, up \$538 million (7%) to \$8,040 million (due mainly to increased exports of electrical machinery, and office machines and computers).

Decreases were recorded for *commodities* and transactions not classified elsewhere, down \$602 million (9%) to \$6,389 million (due to decreased exports of gold), and food and live animals, down \$430 million (3%) to \$12,537 million (due to decreased exports of cereals and meat).


## GRAPH 5: COMMODITY COMPOSITION (SITC SECTION) OF EXPORTS



Australia's major export destinations were:

- Japan, up \$356 million (2%) to \$16,286 million;
- Republic of Korea, up \$552 million (2%) to \$5,270 million;
- New Zealand, up \$759 million (19%) to \$4,768 million:
- USA, down \$442 million (9%) to \$4,633 million;
- Singapore, up \$442 million (14%) to \$3,649 million;
- Taiwan, up \$341 million (12%) to \$3,098 million;
- China, up \$368 million (14%) to \$2,958 million;
   and
- Hong Kong, down \$172 million (6%) to \$2,626 million.

#### Merchandise imports


Merchandise imports for the year ended June 1995 were \$74,638 million, up \$10,168 million or 16 per cent on the previous year.

The imports commodity groups recording significant increases on the previous year were:

- machinery and transport equipment, up \$6,255
  million (22%) to \$35,166 million (due to increased
  imports in all categories, with the largest being in
  road vehicles, office machines and computers,
  electrical machinery and telecommunications
  equipment);
- manufactured goods classified chiefly by material, up \$1,468 million (16%) to \$10,913 million (due to increased imports in all categories, with the largest being in paper and paperboard, iron and steel, and textile yarn);
- miscellaneous manufactured articles, up \$913 million (9%) to \$10,711 million (due to increased imports in all categories, with the largest being in miscellaneous manufactured articles, apparel and clothing, photographic equipment, and professional, scientific and controlling instruments); and
- chemical and related products nes, up \$967 million (14%) to \$8,012 million (due mainly to increased imports of plastics, organic and inorganic chemicals).

The only group to record a decrease was commodities and transactions not classified elsewhere, down \$289 million (27%) to \$797 million (due to decreased imports of gold).

## GRAPH 7: COMMODITY COMPOSITION (SITC SECTION) OF IMPORTS




Australia's major import sources were:

- USA, up \$2,031 million (14%) to \$16,048 million:
- Japan, up \$1,079 million (9%) to \$12,779 million;
- Germany, up \$1,106 million (29%) to \$4,865 million;

UK, ut

- China, up \$531 million (17%) to \$3,651 million;
- New Zealand, up \$353 million (11%) to \$3,554 million;
- Taiwan, up \$208 million (9%) to \$2,570 million; and
- Singapore, up \$455 million (25%) to \$2,247 million.

#### REVISIONS

Revisions since the last issue of this publication have:

- increased total exports for the March quarter 1995 by \$2 million, and decreased total exports for the twelve months ended March 1995 by \$97 million;
- decreased total imports for the March quarter 1995 by \$8 million, and for the twelve months ended March 1995 by \$8 million; and
- decreased the merchandise trade deficit for the March quarter 1995 by \$10 million, and increased the merchandise trade deficit for the twelve months ended March 1995 by \$90 million.

The amendments to merchandise exports for the twelve months ended March 1995 were due largely to certain interstate shipments of crude oil being incorrectly recorded as exports in information received from the Australian Customs Service.

The remaining revisions resulted from generally small changes to a large number of commodities and countries, with no significant contributor.

#### CHANGES IN NEXT ISSUE

Commencing with the next issue of this publication, country group tables will reflect the admission, on 28 July 1995, of Vietnam to the Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN).

# INFORMATION PAPER INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE STATISTICS 1996 REVISION OF COMMODITY CLASSIFICATIONS

On 1 July 1996, a large number of changes will be made to detailed commodity codes used in the clearance of goods into and out of Australia. The reasons for these changes are summarised below, and described in greater detail in an Information Paper International Merchandise Trade Statistics: 1996 Revision of Commodity Classifications (Cat. No. 5488.0), published by the ABS on 15 August 1995.

- 2. The 1996 changes will affect individuals and organisations involved in the shipment of goods, i.e. importers, exporters, their agents and customs brokers, as well as users of detailed statistics on international merchandise trade. However, users of aggregate statistics presented in this publication should notice little or no effect as a result of these changes. In particular, data on trade classified at the Division level of the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC), or by Broad Economic Category (BEC) or Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification, are expected to be largely unaffected.
- 3. There are two basic commodity classifications used in Australia for recording international merchandise trade: the Combined Australian Customs Tariff and Statistical Nomenclature (also referred to as the Customs Tariff); and the Australian Harmonized Exports Commodity Classification (also referred to as the AHECC). The Tariff is used for classification of imports and maintained by the Australian Customs Service (ACS). The AHECC is used for classification of exports and maintained by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS).
- 4. Both Australian classifications are based on the World Customs Organisation's (WCO) system of classification for declaration of goods shipped between countries. This system is known as the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HCDCS), also referred to as the 'Harmonized System' (HS).
- 5. Members of the WCO have agreed in principle to implement extensive changes to the Harmonized System with effect from 1 January 1996. Australia, however, will defer implementing these changes until 1 July 1996 in order to co-ordinate WCO's changes with changes to the domestic Tariff.

- 6. The WCO's changes which are described in more detail in the Information Paper relate to about 10% of commodities in the Harmonized System. As far as is practicable, the ABS will ensure that the impact of these changes on users of international merchandise trade statistics is minimised.
- 7. The purpose of the Information Paper is:
  - to explain the structure of the current commodity classifications used in Australia for recording international merchandise trade;
  - to explain how and why these classifications will be changed;
  - to provide a summary of the areas of the classification which will be affected;
  - to indicate which of these areas have sufficient trade to make investigation of further dissections visible.
  - to provide, upon request, more detailed information on specific areas of change; and
  - to invite readers to provide comments on any issues they would like to raise concerning the proposed changes.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTES

#### Introduction

This publication contains quarterly statistics of Australia's merchandise trade with its major trading partners and selected country groups.

2. The merchandise export and import statistics in this publication are compiled in broad agreement with the United Nations' recommendations for the compilation of international trade statistics. The sections below briefly describe the concepts and methods used in their compilation.

# Source of data

3. These statistics are compiled by the Australian Bureau of Statistics from information submitted by exporters and importers or their agents to the Australian Customs Service (ACS).

#### Scope

4. Merchandise trade covers all movable goods which add to (imports) or subtract from (exports) Australia's stock of material resources.

#### Excluded are:

- direct transit trade, i.e. goods being trans-shipped or moved through Australia for purposes of transport only;
- (b) ships and aircraft moving through Australia while engaged in the transport of passengers or goods between Australia and other countries; and
- (c) non-merchandise goods, consisting primarily of goods moving on a temporary basis (eg mobile equipment; goods under repair; goods for exhibition; and passengers' effects).

#### Coverage

- 5. The United Nations' recommendations for the compilation of merchandise trade statistics recognise that the basic source used by most compiling countries the customs record will not be able to capture certain transactions. In Australia the following types of goods which fall within the scope of merchandise trade, are excluded because customs entries are not required:
- (a) certain materials under inter-governmental agreements for defence and similar projects;
- (b) migrants and passengers' effects exported or imported and parcel post exports and imports of small value, for which Customs entries are not required;
- (c) the sale or delivery of certain ships intended for use on overseas routes; and

# For exports only:

(d) sales of aircraft (and parts or components) which were imported into Australia prior to 1 July 1987 for use on overseas routes; sales of aircraft (and parts or components) which were imported into

- Australia on or after 1 July 1987 for use on overseas routes are included in recorded export statistics:
- (e) fish and other sea products landed abroad directly from the high seas by Australian ships; and
- (f) from 1 July 1986 individual transaction lines (within an export consignment) where the value of the goods is less than \$500. Prior to that date, the value level was \$250.

# For imports only:

- (g) bunkers, aviation fuel and stores supplied abroad to Australian ships and aircraft;
- (h) prior to 1 July 1987 the delivery of certain aircraft (and parts and components) intended for use on overseas routes; and
- (i) entries lodged on informal clearance documents (ICDs) for values not exceeding \$250. From 21 October 1985 onwards, ICDs for postal articles valued between \$250 and \$1000 are excluded.

In addition, although merchandise trade statistics should include illegal transactions, such as smuggled goods, these transactions are omitted as there is no practical way to collect this information.

#### Basis of compilation

- 6. The merchandise trade statistics in this publication are recorded on a general trade basis, i.e. exports include both Australian produce and re-exports, and imports comprise goods entered directly for home consumption together with goods imported into bonded warehouses.
- 7. Australian produce is defined as goods, materials or articles which have been produced or manufactured in Australia. Processing and assembly operations that leave imported components and products essentially unchanged are not considered as production or manufacture.
- 8. Re-exports are defined as goods, materials or articles originally imported into Australia which are exported in the same condition or after undergoing minor operations (e.g. blending, packaging, bottling, cleaning, husking and shelling) which leave them essentially unchanged. Information on re-exports is shown in Table 13.

# **Statistical Period**

- 9. From January 1988, exports are recorded in the calendar month in which the goods departed from Australia. Prior to January 1988, exports are recorded in the month in which the entries were processed by the ACS. For further details on the impact of the changed compilation basis on the merchandise export series refer to the article 'Changed timing basis for compilation of merchandise exports statistics' in the June 1992 issue of this publication.
- 10. Imports are generally recorded statistically in the calendar month in which the import entries are finalised by the ACS. Import entries may be lodged early and final-

ised prior to arrival, or their finalisation may be delayed because of the various validation checks carried out by ACS. Currently, approximately 85 per cent of total import trade by value shown for a particular month reflects shipments which arrived in that month, while approximately 10 per cent reflects shipments which arrived during the previous month with the remaining 5 per cent by value arriving in earlier or later months. For individual commodities these percentages may vary considerably.

11. Occasionally significant delays occur in the lodgement, rather than processing, of import entries. When the affected entries are for significant values, they are recorded statistically in the month that they should have been lodged and finalised.

#### Valuation

- 12. The value of exports is the free on board (f.o.b.) transactions value of the goods expressed in Australian dollars. Goods shipped on consignment are initially valued at the f.o.b. Australian port of shipment equivalent of the current price offering for similar goods of Australian origin in the principal markets of the country to which the goods are despatched for sale. Exporters who do not know the value of the goods at shipment and enter an approximate value must subsequently submit an entry either confirming or revising the estimated return.
- 13. The value of imports is the Australian Customs value. Goods are valued at the point of containerisation (in most cases) or the port of shipment, or at the customs frontier of the exporting country, whichever comes first.
- 14. Changes in Customs valuation introduced from 1 July 1989 with the Customs and Excise Legislation Amendment Act 1989 are likely to have marginally raised Customs valuations. Data for periods from 1 July 1989 are therefore not fully comparable with data for previous periods. However, investigations of imports valuations, for years before and after the change have shown no measurable effect on the valuation of imports that can be attributed to the change in legislation. For details of the changes in legislation see the note 'Change in the Valuation of Imports' at the beginning of the Explanatory Notes of the 1989-90 issue of Foreign Trade, Australia: Comparative and Summary Tables (5410.0).

#### Country

- 15. For the purposes of international merchandise trade statistics, a country is defined as a geographical entity which trades, or has the potential to trade, with Australia in accordance with ACS provisions. External territories under Australian administration are treated as separate countries while self-governing territories and dependent territories under the administration of other countries may be treated as individual countries in Australian international merchandise trade statistics.
- 16. For exports, country refers to the country to which the goods were consigned at the time of export. Where the country of consignment is not known at the time of export, and where it is impossible to determine the destination, goods are recorded as 'Destination Unknown'. Tables which show exports by country also include the item "Ships' stores". "Ships' stores" comprise fuel, food and other goods loaded onto foreign owned vessels and aircraft to be consumed during international journeys.

- 17. For imports, country refers to the country of origin of the goods, which is defined as the country of production for Customs purposes. Where the country of origin is not known at the time of imports and where it is impossible to determine the origin, goods are recorded as 'Origin Unknown'. Goods reported with country of origin 'Australia' (i.e. goods of Australian origin exported and subsequently re-imported) are shown as country 'Australia (Re-imports)' and are included in the Asia Pacific Economic Co-operation country group.
- 18. Wherever possible, statistics for countries and country groups for all time periods included in this publication reflect the composition of those countries and country groups on the last day of the reference period of this publication. Thus, after the German Democratic Republic and the German Federal Republic were reunited, statistics for all periods both before and after re-unification refer to the combined entity (called Germany in country classified statistics).
- 19. However, in the case of a country that breaks into a number of component entities, it is not possible to provide data for earlier periods for the new entities. For example, from October 1991, Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania are each separately identified in the statistics, but for earlier periods trade data for these three republics are included indistinguishably in data for the USSR.
- 20. The country groups shown in this publication are selected economic groups with which Australia trades, namely:
  - Asia Pacific Economic Co-operation (APEC);
  - Association of South-East Asian Nations (ASEAN);
  - Developing Countries (DCs);
  - European Union (EU);
  - European Free Trade Association (EFTA); and
  - Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC).
- 21. A list of the countries included in each of the above groups is shown in the Appendix. Country groups may not be mutually exclusive e.g. Indonesia is included in APEC, OPEC, ASEAN and as a Developing Country. The countries that belong to more than one group are identified with a footnote in the Appendix.
- 22. More details on the composition of countries identified in these statistics are available from the *Classification Manager* on Canberra (06) 252 5409.

### Commodity classification

23. Commodity export and import statistics in Tables 3, 4, 6, 7 and 8 of this publication are presented according to the codes and descriptions of the third revision of the United Nations' Standard International Trade Classification (SITC Rev3) with the addition of dummy codes to take account of Australia's treatment of gold coin,

whether or not legal tender, and other legal tender coin and confidential items.

24. Tables 15 and 16 of this publication are presented according to the second revision of SITC for 1982-83 to December 1987 and according to SITC Rev3 from January 1988. See Appendix B of the 1988-89 issue of Foreign Trade Australia: Comparative and Summary Tables (5410.0) for details of Divisions significantly affected by this change.

#### **Broad Economic Categories**

25. Merchandise trade in Tables 11 and 12 are classified according to the categories of the United Nations' classification. Broad Economic Categories (BEC). The BEC classifies international merchandise trade statistics for the purposes of general economic analysis according to the main end use of the commodities traded. The statistics are compiled by allocating the statistical items of the Australian Harmonized Export Commodity Classification (AHECC) and the Harmonized Customs Tariff to the appropriate BEC.

## Industry of origin

26. Exports and imports statistics classified by subdivisions of the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC) are shown in Tables 9 and 10. The statistics are compiled by allocating statistical items of the AHECC and the Harmonized Customs Tariff to the ANZSIC industry of origin based upon the main economic activities of those industries with which the commodities are primarily associated. A full description of ANZSIC classes is contained in the publication Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification, 1993 Edition (1292.0).

#### State

- 27. State information for exports presented in Table 13 refers to the State in which the final stage of production or manufacture occurs.
- 28. State information for imports presented in Table 14 refers to the State where imported goods were released from Customs control, also called the State of final destination. The State of final destination is not necessarily the State in which the port of discharge of the goods is located. Goods can be forwarded interstate after discharge either under ACS control or not, but are recorded as being imported into the State where they are released by the ACS.

#### Confidentiality

29. Restrictions are placed on the release of statistics for certain commodities for reasons of confidentiality. These restrictions do not affect total export and import figures, but they can affect statistics at all levels in country and commodity tables. More details on the confidentiality process can be obtained from the *Confidentiality Manager* on Canberra (06) 252 5409.

# Reliability

30. Statistics in this publication for recent periods should be considered preliminary. Revisions to previously published data frequently occur due to continuing data quality checks.

# Relationship to balance of payments statistics

31. The basic source of balance of payments data on merchandise exports and imports is 'international merchandise trade statistics'. However, because of conceptual differences, various coverage, timing and (imports only) valuation adjustments are necessary before foreign trade statistics can be put on a balance of payments basis. For more information on the relationship between international merchandise trade statistics and balance of payments statistics on merchandise trade see Chapter 9 of Balance of Payments, Australia: Concepts, Sources and Methods (5331.0).
