

Preface

Regional Statistics Victoria presents a wide range of key economic, social and demographic statistics for Victoria's 78 local government areas and serves as a basic regional data source illustrating the differences in the population dynamics, ethnicity, labour force, occupation and industry structures and general economic activity of local government areas. Information is presented in the form of tables of data, graphs and maps highlighting local government area boundaries and regional centres. The publication covers a wide range of information compiled from the 1996 Census and other ABS and non-ABS sources.

Section 1 presents data for the ten Statistical Divisions and their component local government areas that make up regional Victoria. Section 2 focuses on the 31 local government areas in metropolitan Melbourne and Section 3 contains Health Statistics by Victorian Government Health Region.

Statistics at the local government area level are designed to satisfy the demand for statistics on a smaller geographical basis than that of the State as a whole or its statistical divisions. The publication therefore aims to increase awareness among local communities, regional development organisations and local government authorities about what is happening in their own and in neighbouring local government area economy and assists in comparing and measuring the contribution that each Local Government Area makes to the overall economy of Victoria.

The data contained in this publication represent only a sample of the full range of statistics available from the ABS. For further information about ABS statistics and services, refer to the last page of this publication.



SECTION 1



VICTORIA AND ITS COMPONENT STATISTICAL DIVISIONS



Victoria is located in south-eastern Australia and covers an area of 227,600 sq kM and has 1,800 km of coastline.

Although Victoria is Australia's second smallest State in area (2.6%), it has the second largest population with an estimated resident population at 30 June 1997 of 4.6 million (p). In the twelve months to 30 June 1997 Victoria's population grew by 1.0%. The state lost 6, 300 persons through interstate migration, 51% fewer than in 1995-96. There was a 12.6% increase in the population aged 65 or more.

Victoria has a strong manufacturing and agricultural economy in dairying, crops and wool. The major topographical influence on the climate is the Great Dividing Range, running east-west across the State, and rising to heights of nearly 2,000 metres. The mountains act as a barrier to the moist south-east and south-west winds and, together with their proximity to the coast, cause the south of the State to receive more rain than the north.

For the purpose of presenting this series of summary economic and social statistics for the State, Victoria is divided into a number of geographical areas. These areas consist of aggregations of local government areas.

The primary division of the State is into eleven Statistical Divisions with Melbourne Statistical Division divided further into five groups of combined metropolitan Statistical Subsdivisions. These divisions are intended to represent 'regions' of the State which are characterised by discernible social and/or economic links between the population and local government areas within them. The boundaries of the divisions have accordingly been delineated on the basic criterion that the degree of economic and/or social contact and interaction within each division should be maximised.

BARWON STATISTICAL DIVISION



Barwon Statistical Division is situated on the western side of Port Phillip Bay and south west along the Bass Strait coast. It comprises the local government areas of Golden Plains, Colac-Otway, Surf Coast, Queenscliffe and Greater Geelong.

Greater Geelong, the most populous municipality in Victoria, lies on Corio Bay and is a major manufacturing, processing and wool-selling centre and has a large petroleum refinery.

The Great Southern Road begins near Geelong and runs along the coastal portion of this Division. Most of the towns along this road are resorts or tourist centres.


Colac, in the west of the Division is situated on the eastern edge of a volcanic plain which covers much of the Western District of Victoria. It is the centre of a prosperous agricultural area surrounded by rich pastoral hinterland. Near Colac is Lake Corangamite, Victoria's largest salt water lake.

Most of this Division is devoted to agriculture, sheep, dairying and tourism. The majority of industrial activity in this Division is situated in and around Geelong.

POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996





TOTAL UNEMPLOYED BY SEX, 1996 CENSUS



WESTERN DISTRICT STATISTICAL DIVISION





Western District Statistical Division is in the south-western corner of the state and covers an area of approximately 24,065 sq km.

The Division has numerous volcanic craters and cones and the coastline is rugged, with unique rock formations such as 'The Twelve Apostles', a series of large limestone pillars jutting out of the ocean.

This Division is known for its sheep and dairy country, vegetable farms, cereal crops and belts of commercial timber.

The Southern Grampians region is dominated by the rural sector with large scale sheep grazing and wool production.


The only deep water port between Melbourne and Adelaide is Portland in the south-west, an industrial and commercial centre for the area. To the east of Portland is the Moyne region with Port Fairy, a former whaling port, the home for a large fishing fleet.

Warrnambool is located approximately 265 km south-west of Melbourne and is the principal service centre for south-western Victoria. Hamilton, in the centre of the Division was settled in 1834 and is the service town for the surrounding beef cattle and sheep properties.

POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996





TOTAL UNEMPLOYED BY SEX, 1996 CENSUS





POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996






TOTAL UNEMPLOYED BY SEX, 1996 CENSUS

WIMMERA STATISTICAL DIVISION



Wimmera Statistical Division is in the west of the State and covers and area of approximately 30,437 sq km.

The Division takes its name from the Aboriginal word for a spear thrower. This Division is the State's granary, with Yarriambiack shire known as the heart of the State's wheat belt.

Horsham is a major regional centre that services a large rural hinterland producing mainly wheat and sheep. It is also the centre for wheat research and supports many secondary industries.

The economy around the Hindmarsh region is based primarily on wheat and sheep also and has, in recent times, diversified into the production of oilseeds and legumes.


In the south-west of the Division are the Grampians. The peaks rise to over 1,000 metres and they form the western extremity of the Great Dividing Range. Northern Grampians shire is home to the Great Western vineyards and they are also the centre of the region's domestic tourism industry.

Agricultural production, particularly in wheat, sheep and vegetables, is an important part of the economy of West Wimmera shire.

POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996







MALLEE STATISTICAL DIVISION



Mallee Statistical Division is in the north-west of the State and covers an area of approximately 41,035 sq km.

'Mallee' is taken from an Aboriginal word given to the many-stemmed eucalyptus scrub which once covered most of this north-west corner of the State. Mildura is the largest local government area (in size) in Victoria and includes 40% of Victoria's National Parks within its boundaries.

The irrigated area around Mildura is one of the richest agricultural areas in Australia, producing wine, dried fruits, olives, citrus and vegetables.


For nearly eighty years from 1853, Swan Hill was the only Murray River crossing for 100km, hence its importance as a shipping point and agricultural base ranging from the large wheat-sheep belt to irrigated viticulture and horticulture along the Murray River.

South of Mildura is Ouyen, a service town for the vast wheat belt in the Mallee. The Big Desert in the north of the Division is $6,000 \, \text{sq} \, \text{km}$ of scrub covered sand plains and dunes and stretches over the South Australian border.

POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996





LODDON STATISTICAL DIVISION



Loddon Statistical Division lies to the north of Melbourne Statistical Division in the central north-western area of Victoria, stretching from the Macedon Ranges outside Melbourne to just south of the River Murray and covers an area of approximately 19,200 sq km.

The division extends west as far as the townships of Boort, Wedderburn and Maryborough, with the River Campaspe comprising much of the eastern border.

Echuca, a city at the junction of the Murray and Campaspe Rivers, was, by the turn of the century, Australia's largest inland port. Cohuna, 8km from the Murray River, is the centre of a rich dairy area. The pastures carry Australia's highest number of milking cows per hectare.


Greater Bendigo is the second most populous municipality in regional Victoria and a major regional centre servicing a diverse rural hinterland.

Historically this divison was a major gold mining region but now Loddon is dominated by the rural sector, mainly grain and livestock production. Despite the impact of gold mining in the Division, it is still mainly an agricultural area. Near the River Murray the land supports irrigation areas, vineyards and wineries. Further south the land supports wheat, fruit, dairy products and market gardens. Bendigo also has a large sheep market.

POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996







GOULBURN STATISTICAL DIVISION



Goulburn Statistical Division covers an area of approximately 23,385 sq km and lies in the north of the State.

The north of the Division runs along the Murray River and is part of the largest irrigated area in Australia. This part of the Division produces the bulk of the State's quantities of fruit, vegetables and dairy products as well as cereal crops, grapes and wine, beef, wool and lambs.


Situated in the heart of the fertile Goulburn Valley is Greater Shepparton, a rapidly developing region and the state's leading centre for intensive agriculture and food processing industries with canneries capable of processing more than 70 000 tonnes of fruit each year. Further south, in the Strathbogie region, the agricultural activities continue with wool, dairying and mixed crops. There are also vineyards and orchards some of which depend on irrigation.

The affluence of the gold rush era has left its mark in the form of grand architecture, evident in towns like Alexandra. Extensive logging was carried out until the 1970s, evidence of which can be seen in the remains of mills and sawpits located in the Mount Samaria State Park.

POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996







OVENS-MURRAY STATISTICAL DIVISION



Ovens-Murray Statistical Division lies in the north-east of the State and covers an area of approximately 18,160 sq km.

This Division is dominated by the Alps, with the State's highest mountain, Mount Bogong, rising to 1,986 metres. The region is also home to the famous Falls Creek, Mount Hotham and Mount Buffalo ski resorts.



POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996







East Gippsland Statistical Division is in the south-east of the State and covers and area of approximately $27,790 \, \mathrm{sq}$ km.

The region has extensive agricultural and forestry activities and is noted for its timber, fishing, oil and gas processing plants and national parks.

Sale is the centre for the oil and gas processing from the Bass Strait wells and together with Bairnsdale, is a major administrative and service centre in the region.

Orbost is in the agricultural region close to the Snowy River, and a sawmilling and logging town.



POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996






TOTAL UNEMPLOYED BY SEX, 1996 CENSUS

GIPPSLAND STATISTICAL DIVISION



Gippsland Statistical Division is situated on the eastern side of the Melbourne Statistical Division and its coastline runs along Bass Strait. It covers an area of approximately 13,575 sq km.


The Latrobe Valley, in the east of the Division, generates most of the State's electricity. The power stations are fuelled from nearby open-cut coal mines which hold the world's largest known brown coal deposits. Reserves are estimated at 35,000 million tonnes and the seam is more than 60 km long.

The region also has some major service facilities including several large retail centres. Baw Baw Shire is a rich horticultural and dairying area, supplying much of Melbourne's milk. There is a diversity of farming activities in the area, and a timber industry in the foothills of the Great Dividing Range. The South Gippsland region has a strong agricultural sector, dominated by beef and dairy cattle production.

POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996




POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996

DWELLING UNITS APPROVED, RESIDENTIAL BUILDING, 1996-97







TOTAL UNEMPLOYED BY SEX, 1996 CENSUS






POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996













TOTAL UNEMPLOYED BY SEX, 1996 CENSUS







POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996



DWELLING UNITS APPROVED, RESIDENTIAL BUILDING, 1996-97







TOTAL UNEMPLOYED BY SEX, 1996 CENSUS







POPULATION: AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE, 1991 TO 1996





Cat. no. 1103.2 Statistical Geography, Victoria

(Irregular)

Shows the statistical geography of Victoria, based on the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC), which was used for the collection, compilation and publication of ABS statistics (including the 1996 Census of Population and Housing) from 1 July 1996 to 30 June 1997. The publication also depicts, through the use of maps, the changes that have occurred to Local Government Areas and other ASGC spatial units in Victoria since the 1991 Census of Population and Housing. The publication is a very useful reference for users in interpreting output for Victoria from statistical collections based on the ASGC and indicates areas where the ABS can further assist users with their statistical geography needs.

Cat. no. 1305,2 Victoria at a Glance (Annual)

Condensed information which covers demography, education, welfare services, overseas trade, State and local government finance, housing finance, private finance, labour force, earnings and income, prices, primary industry, manufacturing, mineral production, retail trade, tourist accommodation, building and transport. Victorian data are compared with Australian data.

Cat. no. 2015.2 Census of Population and Housing: Selected Social and Housing Characteristics for Statistical Local Areas, Victoria (Five-Yearly)

Contains selected person and dwelling information for Statistical Local Areas (SLAs), Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs) and Statistical Divisions (SDs). 1991 Census data is provided for SSDs and SDs. This publication includes tables showing SLAs ranked by selected characteristics (for example, total persons, median personal income); a Basic Community Profile containing first release data for Vic.; and reference maps. Commentary is also provided, including a State summary, regional comparisons for selected topics and time series comparisons.

Cat. no. 3311.2 Demography, Victoria (Annual).

Detailed statistics on births, deaths, infant deaths, marriages and divorces (including information on births and deaths of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander persons). Detailed population statistics (including overseas arrivals and departures and other components of population change) and population projections. Some data for Statistical Local Areas.

Cat. no. 5501.2 Local Government Finance, Victoria (Annual).

Details for each local government of population; area; total revenue, including rates and government grants; total outlays by broad purpose; long-term debt and financial investments.

Cat. no. 6202.2 Labour Force, Victoria

Labour force status of the civilian population aged 15 and over for Victoria and each Labour Force Dissemination Region of Victoria. Employed persons are classified by age, sex, industry, occupation, status in employment and average weekly hours worked. Unemployed persons are classified by sex, age and duration of unemployment.

Cat. no. 7113.2 Agriculture, Victoria (Annual)

Area and land utilisation of agricultural establishments; number of cattle and sheep classified by age, sex and purpose; lambing and wool production; number of pigs; poultry and other livestock. Production and yield per hectare for crops; area and production for vegetables; number of trees; area and production of fruit; stocks of major grains and hay; production and stocks of silage; fertiliser and herbicide use and irrigation.

Cat. no. 8731.2 Building Approvals, Victoria (Monthly)

Number of dwelling units and value of residential buildings approved (new houses and new other residential) for private and public sectors, value of alterations and additions to residential buildings and value of non-residential building by class of building (e.g. hotels, offices, etc.) approved and non-residential building jobs approved by class and value size. Value of building approved at average 1989-90 prices and seasonally adjusted and trend estimates of number of dwelling units approved. Includes summary information for Statistical Divisions, Subdivisions and Statistical Local Areas and number and value of houses approved by material of outer walls.

Cat. no. 8752.2 Building Activity, Victoria (Quarterly)

Number of dwelling units and value of residential buildings (new houses and new other residential), value of alterations and additions to residential buildings and value of non-residential building by class of building (e.g. hotels, offices, etc.), for private and public sectors, stage of construction (commenced, under construction, completed), value of work done during period and value of work yet to be done. Seasonally adjusted series show number of dwelling units commenced and completed and value of work done. Value of work commenced and work done at average 1989-90 prices.

Glossary

Average annual rate of

change

The average annual rate of change in population during the intercensal period 1991 to 1996 has been calculated for the estimated resident population on the basis of boundaries as defined at 30 June 1996; in some instances this has involved a measure of estimation where boundary changes have occurred.

Bed spaces

Refers to the maximum number of beds available (excluding cots) to accommodate paying guests as at 30 June 1997. Three-quarter beds are classified as single beds, and double beds are counted as two bed spaces.

Births

Births relate to all registrations of such an event which occurred within Victoria. Births are allocated to a statistical local area of the State according to the usual residence of the mother.

Building Statistics

Statistics of building work approved are compiled from:

- permits issued by local authorities in areas subject to building control by those authorities; and
- contracts let or day labour work authorised by Commonwealth, State, semigovernment and local government authorities
- major building activity which takes place in areas not subject to the normal administrative approval processes (e.g. buildings on remote mine sites).
- permits issued by licensed private building surveyors. The last category reflects implementation of the 1993 Building Act by the Victorian government from 1 July 1994.

The statistics relate to building activity which includes construction of new buildings, and alterations and additions to existing buildings. Construction activity not defined as building (e.g. construction of roads, bridges, railways, earthworks etc) is excluded from these figures. In relation to work carried out on existing buildings, the statistics include details of non-structural renovation and refurbishment work and the installation of integral building fixtures for which building approval was obtained.

Business Locations

A location usually equates to the physical site at which manufacturing or retail activity is carried out.

This information has been extracted from a September 1997 snapshot of businesses on the ABS Business Register. The prime purpose of the Register is to provide a comprehensive source of business names and addresses from which selections can be made for inclusion in ABS economic censuses and surveys. The businesses on the Register are classified according to their industry and employment size. The term business is used in a wide sense to include companies, sole proprietorships, professional services, community services, government agencies and departments, religious bodies, etc. However, the ABS Business Register only includes those businesses which employ wage and salary earners and so businesses operated entirely by sole proprietors, partners and unpaid family members are excluded from this data. The information most readily available from the Business Register is counts of business units (either management units or locations) classified by industry, geographic area and employment size, although counts can be classified by other data items as well.

Census

This publication contains final data from the 1996 Census of Population and Housing which aimed at counting every person who spent census night, 6 August, in Australia. This included people in private dwellings, non-private dwellings, camping out, on vessels in or between Australian ports, and on overnight transport. All people, including visitors and tourists, were counted where they actually spent Census night, which may not have been where they actually lived.

Dwelling units approved

A dwelling unit is defined as a self-contained suite of rooms, including cooking and bathing facilities and intended for long-term residential use. Units (whether self-contained or not) within buildings offering institutional care, such as hospitals or temporary accommodation such as motels, hostels and holiday apartments are not defined as dwelling units. The statistics shown represent council approvals of such units.

Employed persons

People aged 15 years and over who, during the week prior to census night, worked for payment or profit or as unpaid workers in a family business, or who had a job from which they were on leave or otherwise temporarily absent.

Establishments with agricultural activity

An establishment with agricultural activity is a single physical location which is used for the production of crops (including fruit and vegetables) and/or for the raising of livestock and the production of livestock products, regardless of the predominant activity of the unit. Where two or more locations are within the same statistical local area/local government area and are worked as one, they are regarded (for statistical purposes) as forming a single establishment. Establishments which make only a small contribution to overall agricultural production are excluded from the scope of the Agricultural Census. In 1995-96, Agricultural Census establishments with an estimated value of agricultural operations (EVAO) less than \$5,000 were excluded.

Estimated resident population

The estimated resident population (ERP) is the official ABS estimate of the population within Australia. The ERP is based on results of the latest population census, and updated for subsequent births, deaths, and overseas and internal migration. Population estimates are based on the final 1996 Census results.

Hotels and motels with facilities Establishments licensed to operate a public bar and motels and private hotels all of which provide a bath (or shower) and toilet in most guest rooms and have breakfast available for guests.

Household Income (average weekly)

Household income is the sum of the personal incomes of each resident present in the household.

Industry of employment

The main tasks that a person performed in the main job held during the week prior to census night.

Licensed venues/EGMs

The total number of licensed electronic gaming machines or venues in each local government area for the December 1997 quarter. The licensed figure on the last day of the quarter represents the figure over the whole quarter.

Occupation

Based on the main job held during the week prior to census night.

Operating EGM

A licensed electronic gaming machine operating over the quarter. Not all licensed venues were open or had 100% operational electronic gaming machines by the final day of the quarter (i.e. 31st December 1997).

Non-residential building

Classified according to its intended major function. Examples of types of individual building jobs include educational, entertainment and recreational, factories, health, hotels, offices, religious, shops, other business premises.

Not in the labour force

Persons not in the labour force are those persons who, during the reference week, were not in the categories employed or unemployed. They include persons who were keeping house (unpaid), retired, voluntarily inactive, permanently unable to work, persons in institutions (hospitals, gaols etc.), trainee teachers, members of contemplative religious orders, and persons whose only activity during the reference week was jury service or unpaid voluntary work for a charitable organisation.

Occupied Private Dwellings

premises occupied by the household on census night. Private dwellings include all houses, flats, units, apartments, caravans and other improvised types of dwellings. Occupied caravans in parks are counted as occupied private dwellings. Non-private dwellings include motels, prisons, welfare institutions, hospitals, retirement villages, boarding schools etc.

Residential building

Defined as a detached building predominantly used for long-term residential purposes and consisting of one or more dwelling units.

Room Occupancy Rate

Refers to the proportion of room nights occupied to the number of guest rooms available during the year ended 30 June 1997, expressed as a percentage.

Takings From Accommo-

dation

Refers to the revenue received from the provision of accommodation. Takings from meals are excluded.

Total outlays

Non-capitalised expenditure including all costs (including overheads and oncosts) incurred in employing staff to undertake the operations of the council and maintenance costs of all assets and rehabilitation of roads. It excludes depreciation.

Total revenue

The non-repayable receipts available to finance the outlays of public authorities.

Tourist Accommodation Establishments Defined as establishments which provide predominantly short-term accommodation (i.e. for periods of less than two months) available to the general public. The tourist accommodation establishments for which statistics are included in this publication are licensed hotels, motels and guest houses which provide a bath or shower and toilet in most guest rooms and have breakfast available for guests.

Unemployed persons

For 1996 Census purposes, unemployed people are defined as those people aged 15 years and over who, in the week prior to census night, did not have a job but were actively looking for and available to start work.

Value of agricultural commodities produced The gross value of commodities produced for an area is the total of all commodity values which have been apportioned to that area.

Value of building

Derived by the aggregation of the estimated value (when completed) of building work (excluding the value of land and landscaping but including site preparation) as reported on approval documents.
